

GOSPEL MEDITATION

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

Baptism: St. Anne & St. Charles Please contact the parish office, Parents must attend a baptismal preparation class which is held the first Tuesday of every month at 7:15pm. Baptisms at St. Charles will be held after the Noon Mass on the second and fourth Sundays of every month. Baptisms at St. Anne by appointment.

Marriage: In accordance with AOD guidelines, couples must contact the parish priest six months in advance of the wedding. Arrangements must be made in person.

Anointing of the Sick: By appointment; call the Parish Office. If after office hours, please call the emergency line.





ST. HILARY OF POITIERS JANUARY 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 - c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.

To all our benefactors and friends of St. Anne Food Closet, your thoughtful gifts of money and goods during this past 2021 has again not gone unnoticed. The kindness shown with such generous Giving Trees during Advent from St. Anne and St. Charles churches is so heartwarming. We have been able to provide more assistance to each family, thanks to your generous contributions of money and food staples.

With God's protection and help, we have again not missed <u>any</u> distribution dates, while still maintaining a controlled check-in as much as possible during this pandemic.

Even with all the government stipends sent to many during this past year we have maintained a steady flow of people biweekly. We seemed to be moving more from individuals to larger families coming more regularly.

This past year on a biweekly basis we were able to provide food and dry goods to 643 families, totaling 1,921 individuals, and we distributed an impressive 26,191 units of food and dry goods. The families have all expressed appreciation for the care given them and their spirits seem lifted. We are gratified knowing that these many families have had much less chance of being hungry, which is our mission.

We could not continue to accomplish so much without all the help from our caring and outstanding volunteers, including some youth who regularly help. In summer we had help from SMCC, and now we are happy to have help from Jefferson students. We wish all our volunteers to know how invaluable their services are to this program.

It takes a community of caring people to support those in need in our area, and we most certainly have such a community around us. You are all appreciated, and again you have our sincere gratitude. If you know someone in our area needing help, please send them our way.
