LaCuesta's Quest

It brings me great joy to celebrate and give thanks with you to the incredible God we have! I see the joy on your faces despite how tired many of you are. Even though this season is so hectic for many of us, I pray that the peace and joy of this day will remain with you long after the presents are opened, the parties are held, and the carols have been sung.

What a difference a year makes, right? Last Christmas seemed so strange, so different from any other. And not just Christmas—the whole year! Nothing went the way it usually does—school, work, leisure, church, dining, vacations, holidays. And we did our best, we tried to make a very abnormal time as "normal" as possible. It amazed me how creative people became as they tried to stay connected with family and friends. But as one month became 3 became 8, health officials around the country began getting concerned not just because of the physical effects of the virus, but because of something else...

...the isolation. That's right, the isolation. They knew that it was unhealthy for people to go day after day feeling so alone. That's a bad feeling, the feeling of being by oneself, separated from the people we love, separated from the routines, traditions and support systems that keep us grounded and safe. It might take quite a while to find out if there are any long term effects of what we went through (not just from a physical standpoint but from an emotional and spiritual one). That's why we need this Christmas more than ever.

And the reason is simple. While Christmas is many things to many people, it is at its core an emphatic explanation point assuring us that we are **not** alone. Its God telling us: I'm not distant. I'm closer to you than you can imagine. I have no desire to treat you harshly but rather want to show you my gentleness, tenderness and compassion. I'm not a God who doesn't understand what you are going through. I do, because I am willing to walk the same journey. True power isn't what you think it is. It comes from loving and nothing else. I will never abandon you or turn away from you! Rather I am willing to do whatever it takes to save you.

My friends, God is not a God who sits on the sidelines and watches from afar. Rather, he is deeply concerned about us, passionately committed to us, and madly in love with us. What a God we have! And so, Christmas reminds us that we are not making this journey alone. God is right alongside us and within us, helping us pay forward our blessings in times of plenty, and providing a shoulder to cry on and a loving embrace in times of sorrow. He's there to guide us and inspire us and pick us up when we have stumbled.

Most importantly, he came among us to show us how to love. So, I guess we don't just need THIS Christmas more than ever. We need EVERY Christmas more than ever, we need that yearly reminder that we never have to feel all alone. God is with us. God forgives us. God loves us. God saves us. I'm not sure there's a better present than that.
