LaCuesta's Quest

I'm sure you enjoy candy like I do! Chocolate is probably tops on the lists of many people. But as a child I've always preferred candy that comes in many flavors. Those of us of a certain age can remember when many of these types of products only came in a handful of flavors. Whether it was popsicles, hard candy, jelly beans, *Life Savers* or whatever--certain flavors predominated. It was hard to find other flavors, other options. They might have existed somewhere but most candy on the shelf stuck to a few common flavors.

Then Ronald Reagan was elected President. (No, I'm not having some kind of medical emergency.) The election of Ronald Reagan actually brought attention to a little-known candy that had been around for a long time but which was not known by most of the country: *Jelly Belly!* Their popularity exploded once it became known that they were the 40th President's favorite. *Jelly Bellys* really became "a thing". It's my understanding that there are currently over 50 flavors, and who knows how many there have been in the history of the company.

What about faith? What about faithfulness? What about holiness? Do they only come in a few flavors? "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. (cf. 1 Corinthians 12:4-11)" Do we believe that? The reason I ask is because, on the surface, it seems not so much. I'm talking about how Catholics view other Catholics, how we view those sitting on our left and on our right (as in those pews in church) but even in an ideological sense--in the way we might view certain issues. Do we think that all faithfulness looks exactly the same? Do we believe that Catholics are all expected (dare I say, commanded?) to be carbon-copies of each other? Do we believe there is only one way to be holy, that it only comes in one flavor?

My friends, it takes deep faith to embrace what St. Paul is getting at, that God's work is accomplished through our differences (not our similarities), through countless gifts (not just a few), through complex individuals coming together for a greater purpose. But it can't happen if we over-romanticize the old days, the days when Catholicism only seemed to come in one flavor, when Catholics seemed to never

Contestants participate in their respective age groups. Proof of age required, as well as parental/guardian consent.



have a reason to disagree, or wrestle with how best to follow Jesus. For good or bad, those days are largely gone and are probably not coming back. You see, if we are truly going to be leaven in the world, if we are going to help transform the world into something of great beauty, meaning and love it's going to take all of us, all of us using our unique gifts, abilities, insights, perspectives and ideas to help bring it about.

But it can't happen if each one of us thinks we have cornered the market on holiness, if we think that our individual way is the best way or the only way. For example, it can't happen if we think that all that matters is what we believe, **not** what we do. And it can't happen if we think that all that matters is what we do, **not** what we believe. Each of us has something beautiful to offer (something given to us by God) and part of being Church is being able to recognize the gifts of one another and embrace them.

I guess you could say that the best to be disciples of Jesus Christ is to let him transform each of us into something wonderful. 
