

The Meaning of the Advent Candles

I thought that you might find this information helpful as you light the candles around your Advent wreath at home. First Candle: represents **HOPE**, it is

sometimes referred to as “the Prophet’s Candle”. .. the Second Candle: represents **PEACE**, sometimes known as the “Angel’s Candle” The Third Candle: represents **JOY**, often called the “Shepherd’s Candle” ... the Fourth Candle: represents **LOVE**, often referred to as the “Bethlehem Candle”.

Feast of Mary’s Immaculate Conception—Holy Day—Tuesday, December 8th

This Tuesday, December 8th, we will be celebrating the Feast of Mary’s Immaculate Conception at the 9:00am and 7:00pm Mass. (The 11:00am Mass that morning will be videotaped for the 3rd Sunday in Advent. It is not a Mass for the Holyday.) This is our recognition that Mary, from her conception in the womb of her mother, St Anne, was free from all sin and therefore called “immaculate”. After Pope Pius IX solemnly defined this doctrine on December 8, 1954, the date for its celebration was fixed in place as December 8th each year, even though a Feast of the Conception of Mary was celebrated in both the Eastern and Western churches for many centuries before. I hope that you and your families will join with us at Mass or at least in your homes through livestream to

Sacrament of Confirmation Is Postponed Until Next Spring!

We are sorry that we were not able to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with our teenage parishioners this past weekend as we had planned. I received a phone call from one of the Bishops last Saturday morning requesting that because of the continuing spread of the Covid 19 pandemic, that we not celebrate this Sacrament at this time.

I know that many of you were disappointed. I hope that you will understand why we had to change our plans. However, I ask that you offer a prayer for our “to-be Confirmed teens” as they continue their preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation next Spring.

This Year, Reservations For Christmas Mass Will Be Required!

In the near future, you should be

receiving a letter from me informing you as to what our plans for celebrating Christmas will be for this year. As you know, the spread of the Covid 19 virus has wreaked havoc in our many previous personal and communal “comfort zones” for the past year which has affected all of our relationships and our faith celebrations in our parish. It will be a Christmas like we’ve never experienced before and will require that we make serious sacrifices because we will not be able to do what we were used to doing as we gathered to celebrate the birth of Our Lord and Savior in many Christmas celebrations in the past years.

What will that mean for us here at St. Patrick and this year’s celebration of Christmas? First of all, and foremost, the guidelines of our Archdiocese will be followed so that we can remain safe and not be responsible for spreading this serious life and death virus. Archbishop Vigneron wants us to know that the previous dispensations from the obligation to attend Mass - even Christmas Mass - has been extended to Ash Wednesday, February 17th, 2021. We will have an extended Christmas with four days of Christmas Masses from December 24th, Christmas Eve, until the weekend of December 26/27. With four days to celebrate Mass at Christmas, you will have your choice of a Christmas Mass, although we are encouraging you and your family, especially if you are an adult with an underlying medical condition, or are over the age of 65, that you participate with us at our Christmas Mass on the St. Patrick You-Tube or Facebook media.

If you choose to personally be with us for Mass, this is the procedure that will be required. I never would have dreamed that I would ever have to tell you... “This Christmas, there may be no room for you at our inn”! This is true!! This will be the process... Reservations will be required for all Christmas Masses at St. Patrick December 24th—December 27th. Please go to our parish website - check on the Mass you would like to attend (choose only one Mass, either in the gym or in the church) - complete the form and check “submit”. You will receive a confirmation through your email. Please keep that confirmation

to serve as proof of your reservation and bring it with you to Mass. Once an area is filled to the Covid related capacity, that area will no longer be an option and you will be directed to another choice. If you need special assistance in doing this, or must cancel your reservation, please call our secretary at the parish office at 248-698-3100. We will have to limit attendance! We will be following all of the health regulations we have been accustomed to this past year - including personal masks, social distancing, sanitization, and the other necessary protocol that will help to keep us all safe.

Please let others know that this year we will not be able to accommodate crowds, nor can we “bend the rules” to allow for personal choice or personal tradition. Please plan ahead!! It is truly sad that we had to make these difficult decisions, but I want you to know that they were made for your safety and the safety of all your fellow parishioners.

May the Lord bless you and your families during this Holy Season of Advent as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, truly Emmanuel, God-With-Us!

December 6th: The Second Sunday of Advent Prepare the way of the Lord! MK 1:1-8

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet:
Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way.

A voice of one crying out in the desert:
"Prepare the way of the Lord,
make straight his paths."

John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Our Lady of Guadalupe

This coming Saturday is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In order to prepare for this awesome day, read this account of her apparition to St. Juan Diego. After reading the story, pray one decade of the rosary together as a family.

THE STORY OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

On December 9, 1531, in Mexico, Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego, a poor humble Aztec Indian who had recently converted to the Catholic faith. She asked him to go to the Bishop and tell him to build a church where she said "I will show and offer all of my love, my compassion, my help and my protection to my people." Juan Diego did as she asked, but the Bishop asked for a sign that this message was really from Our Lady.

Mary granted his request. On December 12, she showed Juan where the most beautiful Castilian roses were and told him to gather them. It was a miracle that the roses were there and in bloom because there was frost on the ground, and the ground was an infertile place where only cactus and thistles grew. After he gathered them, she helped arrange them in his tilma, or poncho, and told him to show them to the Bishop. When he brought them to the Bishop, the Bishop was amazed at the roses, but was even more amazed at what began to happen to Juan Diego's tilma. Right before their very eyes, the image of Our Lady began to form on the cloth. The picture of Mary was beautiful and the Bishop fell to his knees. He had the church built at her request.

The tilma is still intact after 470 years. The colors have not faded and the cloth has not deteriorated. It has been on display in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe for all this time.

The manner in which Our Lady appeared on the tilma was very significant to the Aztec Indians. God had her dressed in a way that they would understand who she was. She was dressed in royal clothes that showed that she was very important, perhaps a queen. She also had the symbol of the cross at her neck which was the same symbol the Spaniards had on their ships and in the churches they built. She had a sash tied around her waist which meant that she was with child, for this was the way the Aztec women dressed when they were pregnant. And on her beautiful dress were all sorts of designs and flowers. But there was one flower on her dress that was very significant. It had only four petals. To the Aztecs, the four petal flower was the symbol for the true God, the God above all gods. This flower was located on her abdomen, right over the place where Jesus was growing inside of her. The Aztecs immediately understood that this was the mother of the true God!

This appearance of Our Lady of Guadalupe was very important to the history of our continent. You see, the Aztec Indians and the Spaniards were on the brink of war. The Aztec Indians' culture and religion were very different from the Spaniards. They worshipped gods, to whom they would offer human sacrifices, often killing 50,000 people a year. The Spaniards, who were Catholic, were naturally disgusted by this. But they were cruel to the Aztecs too, treating them like animals and sometimes killing them for no reason. If a war had occurred, it would have been very brutal and the Spaniards and Christianity would have been totally wiped out. Mary's appearance changed everything, however. It helped the Indians to embrace Christianity and it helped the Spaniards to treat the Indians with respect and as human beings. In the course of seven years, 6,000,000 Indians converted to the Catholic faith. This was the biggest conversion in the history of the Church! This is why Our Lady of Guadalupe is the Patroness of the Americas. Juan Diego, the humble man to whom she appeared, was canonized in the summer of 2002.





St. Nicholas (Feast Day Dec. 6)
MARCH 15, 270 - DEC. 6, 343

Nicholas was the fourth-century bishop of Myra, a city in Lycia, a province of Asia Minor. The best-known story about Nicholas concerns his charity toward a poor man who was unable to provide dowries for his three daughters of marriageable age. To help the family, Nicholas secretly tossed a bag of gold through the poor man's window on three separate occasions, thus enabling the daughters to be married. Over the centuries, this particular legend evolved into the custom of gift-giving on the saint's feast. In English-speaking countries, St. Nicholas became Santa Claus—further expanding the example of generosity portrayed by this holy bishop.
