### **P**astoral Notes

This weekend, as we celebrate the Liturgy for the Second Sunday of Lent, our Gospel reading from the writing of St. Mark invites us to prayerfully reflect upon the revelation that was offered by the Father to three of Jesus' special friends at the time of His Transfiguration—a brief glimpse of who He truly was—the very Son of God! In this account we heard the voice of God informing Peter, James and John that Jesus was His beloved Son and that they “should listen to

Him”.

Especially during “these forty days”, we too are invited to listen to the Word of God in our community worship as well as in our personal prayer, in fasting and in serving the needs of others. Perhaps, this week, we could all “listen” a little more carefully.

Yes, let us all “listen to Him”! In this way, we can all be “changed for the good”—to be persons who are willing to “let our light shine out”—not to bring attention or glory to ourselves—but rather to give glory to God who has given us all that we have.

Through our Baptism, we have all been called and gifted by the Holy Spirit to be “evangelizers”—to announce and to live the Good News of God's Love in our own daily life in our relationship with others. By the grace of God, let us pray that we, too, will one day know the fulfilled promise of our own Resurrection—true “Transfiguration”—Eternal Life and Eternal Easter! As we, as “intentional” disciples of the Lord in our own time, travel on our Lenten Faith Journey together, I suggest that this could be a good time for us to pause and reflect prayerfully

upon what this reality means for us this week.

Perhaps we could all deepen our faith as we express that belief in action this Lent.

May we all one day know the blessings of eternal life and peace in the fulfillment of the promised Resurrection in God's Kingdom of Heaven. Each of us might ask ourselves this week “Where does God want me to be this Lent”? And then, let us truly listen to His answer—trusting in Him and asking His help that we might continue our Lenten Faith Journey—leading us toward the Easter that, we pray, will be ours forever!

## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

### When Sacrifice Becomes Mundane

It seems to happen every year, like clockwork: we drag a bit, as we enter into the second week of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we feel a bit like soldiers banging our shields, rushing into battle. “We’re ready, God!” our hearts cry out. “Transform us through sacrifice! Your will be done!”

But by now, these Lenten resolutions are no longer novelties — they’ve joined the ranks of everyday inconveniences, which somehow are the hardest to bear. Because transformation, in real life, happens in inches, just as a battle is won slowly in the crash of one sword against another. It’s not always a dramatic thing, to the naked eye. It’s the perseverance in prayer despite weariness, or the continual denial of some pleasure even though there’s that nagging voice in our minds saying: *go ahead, God doesn’t really mind.*

It’s a week when we all need a shock to the system — and wouldn’t you know it, this Sunday God gives us a double-whammy of dramatic sacrificial scenes. We picture Abraham, who also cried “Ready!” when God called, never imagining what He would ask: the surrender of his long-awaited son. We see Christ himself transfigured, as God shows us what He is ready to give up for love of us.

We must remain committed, persevering daily in acknowledging that everything belongs to God. What we sacrifice, we simply give back to Him.

If God is for us, who can be against us? Can we still reply, “Ready!” when we hear the call of God?

### Parish Office Update: Covid Protocol

In an effort to keep both parishioners/visitors and our parish staff healthy and safe, the Parish Office is instituting new protocol for visiting the parish. When visiting the office, please follow the guidelines below:



Please ring the buzzer (to the right of the main doors) upon arrival - to best serve you, you will be asked the reason for your visit and will then get the direction of entering, etc.



If you are dropping off an item or picking up an item, we have two tables inside the entrance area, one for pick-up and one for drop-off. Your item should be on that table.



Please wear a mask when entering the building.

**Lenten Observances**

Lent is the season which runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of total fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. In keeping with the spirit and meaning of the Lenten fast, Catholics are encouraged to observe the Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday and until the celebration of the Easter vigil.

The law of fasting binds persons from the completion of their 18th year to the beginning of their 60th year, i.e., from the day after their 18th birthday to the day after their 59th birthday.

The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing as far as quantity and quality are concerned, approved local custom. The order of meals is optional; i.e., the full meal may be taken in the evening instead of at midday. Also: 1) The quantity of food taken at the two lighter meals should not exceed the quantity taken at the full meal; 2) The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast.

The law of abstinence binds persons from the completion of their 14th year, i.e., from the day after their 14th birthday throughout life. The law of abstinence forbids the use of meat. It does not forbid the use of eggs, the products of milk or condiments made of animal fat. Also permissible are soups flavored with meat, meat gravy and sauces.



**St. Isidore of Seville  
April 4**

Saint Isidore of Seville was a prolific writer, and capable administrator of his diocese. Following his brother as bishop of Seville, he founded schools and seminaries, and he was known for his encyclopedic knowledge. Perhaps Isidore's greatest accomplishment is that he was a holy man.

**February 28, 2021: 2nd Sunday of Lent**

**The Transfiguration of Jesus  
Mark 9:2-10**

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.



### MEET OUR EXTENDED FAMILY

**St. Josaphat**

**Feast Day: Nov. 12 - c. 1580-Nov 12, 1623**

St. Josaphat was born John Kuncevic in about 1580 in a village of the Province of Volhynia (then a part of the Polish Kingdom, now modern-day Ukraine). His parents belonged to the Eastern Rite Church of Kyiv (Ukraine) which was then separated from Rome.




When John was just a child, his mother explained the icons in church. Years later he told a friend that he felt a spark of fire leave the wounded side of Christ (pictured in the icon) and enter his own heart, which was filled with joy.

This event influenced the rest of his life. Within him grew the desire to suffer for his Savior. John's father sent him to Wilno, where the topic of reunification of the Eastern Rite Church with the Roman Catholic Church was a hotly debated topic. In 1595, the local bishops held a synod and voted to unite with Rome. In the meantime, John made his profession of faith, then entered the Basilian Monastery of the Holy Trinity in Wilno and took the name of Josaphat.

He was ordained a priest in 1609, and eventually became the Bishop of Plock. He at once called a Synod to revitalize his diocese where he pursued the reunion of all with Rome. This was met with hostility and Josaphat suffered much slander. Josaphat was eventually removed from Plock and cruelly killed on November 12, 1623. He was forty-five years old. Josaphat's death brought a movement toward Catholicism and unity.

### Family Challenge:

**In today's Gospel, God the Father tells us to listen to his Son. This week spend 3 minutes each day in silence listening to God. Begin by quieting yourself and simply asking God to be with you and speak to you. Share your experience with your family at the end of the week.**



### Children's Oral Health Part 2

This includes encouraging good oral care by limiting bacteria in their mouths. You can help your child learn how to brush and floss, decrease sticky and sweet foods in their diets, keep their mouths moist, and avoiding acidic food. Next week we will discuss the proper way to brush and floss. Keep your child hydrated with water because fluids will increase saliva which swishes away the bacteria in the mouth, a dry mouth allows the bacteria to eat away at the enamel on their teeth. Avoid acidic foods that can eat away at enamel also. Sweets and sticky foods just add to the food that bacteria love to munch on causing tooth breakdown too. Just a few minutes a day will avoid long treatments needed later on in life.

**GOSPEL MEDITATION - February 28, 2021 - 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent**

A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, “You are absolutely beaming!” The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn’t mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald’s and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new “digs,” received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you’re really “into it” this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it’s only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God’s call. Then, there is God’s request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.
