Pastoral Notes

“Two Different Worlds!”

As I began to write about this subject, I somehow recalled a sad human expression from the Book of Psalms in the ancient Hebrew Scriptures. In Latin it read: “Quo usque, Domine!” In English - “How much longer, Lord - how much longer”!!! I believe that echoes a feeling and a sad refrain that could well express how we feel after a year or more of living under the shadow of the Covid 19 pandemic virus that continues to affect us all. Could any one of us have ever believed that since March of 2020, we would still be living under the conditions that are becoming a part of our new normal...difficult as this is. However, with our faith in the Lord, we all need to keep our eyes focused on Him and not on the “storms” that continue to threaten us and may well be with us for some time to come.

It is important that we keep our hope

in the Lord and in His will for each one of us as we try to “Let go—Let God”, and then, and this is very important, “get out of the way”!

Incidentally, have you noticed how we all continue to “live in two different worlds” ? One is God’s beautiful creation and the familiar Spring changes taking place as we have always known. The other one weaves its way, often quietly, and erupts like an underground turf fire in Ireland that seems to be finished, but then suddenly appears above ground again and continues with the fire.

For us, it is found in the spreading contagion of this life and death reality of the Covid-19 pandemic as a daily companion in our everyday life. You may recall a well-known popular song that expressed this idea of the two different worlds. The lyrics: “Two different worlds—we live in two different worlds—they say we’re so far apart...but we will show them, as we walk together in the sun, that our two different worlds are one”!

Yes, we are all in this together...united we stand—divided we fall. It is so important that we maintain our physical distancing but keep our spiritual and social connections in whatever way we can. Our faith connections can be strengthened during this unprecedented and sad time in different

ways here in our parish.

While we all struggle with the directives given to us by our civil and religious authorities involving personal “stay at home...shelter in place...be safe requirements” still in effect, we realize that our personal, emotional, and psychological health is necessary for our physical well-being. Even though we cannot stop outside forces around us, we can still choose our personal attitude of life provided for us by our faith, prayer, family, and friends.

I want you to know that Fr. Susai and I certainly miss all of you and are praying for you at our daily personal Masses as we ask for your continuing prayers for us as well and for our common intention—praying for all who are afflicted with this Corona 19 virus and for all those assisting in the medical and first responders’ profession.

It is only through our faith, hope, and through our love for one another, as Jesus taught us, that truth, justice, peace and love will prevail. Let us remember, Jesus is only a prayer away. We are all invited to be Easter people and to live our faith in action. We all are looking forward to that time when we can safely gather together to celebrate and receive Jesus’ Presence in the Eucharist. May Jesus, our Risen Lord, be our strength and continue His presence among us.

As we ask this of God, in the words of one of our inspirational hymns, we pray, “Be with us, Lord, when we are in trouble; Be with us, Lord, we pray.” May we all be open to the Lord’s invitation to us

this week, in the words of the beautiful prayer, “*Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.*”

GOSPEL MEDITATION

April 18, 2021

3rd Sunday of Easter

We often act out of ignorance. Armed with the best of intentions, we think we are seeing clearly and correctly, but we are not. We don't always understand the full meaning of things and only perceive part of the truth. Hence, our judgments and actions can be impaired by myopic, incomplete or erroneous perceptions. The meaning of life, understanding of human experience, and negotiating life's challenges can all become skewed without proper understanding and vision. The resurrection of Christ is the corrective to our incomplete and limited view of life. Looking at things with the eyes of faith brings a depth of clarity and understanding to how we see God, ourselves, others, and the world.

Even the disciples struggled with their limited understanding and ignorant perceptions. It was only when Jesus opened their minds to understand the Scriptures that their eyes were opened. It was their "aha" moment when everything clicked. We all want the substance of our lives to come together, make sense, and have meaning. This is easier to achieve when things are going positively, and life is good. It is when suffering, disappointment, death, hardship, and injustice enter the picture that things can become unsettled and disoriented. Our faith in the goodness and love of God is tested. We tend to shift our focus on these difficult and challenging moments and do not see them within the greater picture of how God intends life to unfold. We can gain, from the passion and resurrection of Christ, the clear vision we need in order to move away from ignorance to enlightenment.

We need our "aha" moment when everything comes together and clicks. It can come in a fleeting instant when we feel totally connected with God, where we find ourselves, others and all of creation. It is a moment when all is right and good, regardless of how difficult our journey. Our "aha" moment assures us that God is here, right with us, in us and around us bringing us a gift and blessing we can receive nowhere else: peace. In those brief sacramental encounters when we are lifted up out of ourselves and centered, we can hear God say, "peace be with you," and we feel secure. It's all okay. The resurrected Christ has the power to bring this gift to us. Some people, as they are facing their deaths, remark about this peace. When looking into the window of eternity, they experience a depth of joy and are amazed at God's goodness and closeness. We are called to be witnesses to this Good News.

**Appearance to the Disciples in Jerusalem
Luke 24: 35-48**

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet.

While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Program #1: Sunday Family-Style Religious Education Program (Pre-School - 5th Grade)

Our Sunday program is focused around the family! This program will meet in-person once a month and conduct weekly sessions at-home, with the parents/guardians guiding the student lessons. We will supplement the at-home sessions with weekly video lessons and gather monthly for Family Catechesis. Our monthly family sessions will take place on the following Sundays - meeting from 3-5pm and concluding with Mass at 5:00 pm. Cost is \$150 per family. 
Program #2: Monday "Traditional" Religious Education Program (Kindergarten-5th Grade)

Our Monday program will be our "traditional" classroom setting for Religious Education. This program is slightly different than previous years. We will meet BI-WEEKLY in-person and on the off-weeks where we do not meet in-person, children will receive a video lesson. Monday Program Cost: \$100 for One Child, \$200 for Two Children, \$250 for Three or more children. **Our Monday Sessions will be IN-PERSON on the following dates:**

February 15, 28 ** March 14, 28 ** April 11**


First Eucharist & Reconciliation Preparation: If your child will be preparing for their First Eucharist & Reconciliation (typically 2nd grade, but sometimes we get children in 3rd grade) they will need to sign up for our preparation course. In addition to your child's enrollment in either Religious Education or St. Patrick School, they will also need to participate in the First Eucharist & Reconciliation program. Program Cost is \$50 per child. 





The Basics

Speak up and ask questions. When you play an active role in your health care, you can improve the quality of the care you and your family receive. Most people depend on different doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and life insurance programs for their health care. It's a team effort and you are the most important member of the team.

- **To take charge of your health care:** -Keep track of important health information. -See a doctor regularly for checkups. -Be prepared for medical appointments. -Ask your doctor or nurse questions.

Keep Track of important health information

Keep all our health information in one place to make it easier to manage your health care. Take the information with you to every medical appointment. To start you own personal health record, write down:

- ◆ Your name, birth date, and blood type (ask your health care professional if you don't know).
- ◆ The name and phone number of a friend or relative to call if there's an emergency.
- ◆ Telephone numbers and addresses of places you go to for health care, dental care and your pharmacy.
- ◆ Dates and results of checkups and screening results
- ◆ List of immunizations and the dates you received them.
- ◆ Medicine list, include strength, dosage and time of day you take them. Also include over the counter medicines.
- ◆ Any health condition you have, including allergies.

If I can help you or even go to the doctor's with you or your loved one let me know. Call me at the Christian Service office number 248.698.3100 ext. 215 and I will call you back. Always leave your doctor's office with all your questions answered and a copy of the treatment you received from him/her that day. If at any time you have a question or two, please call me.


