

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is, who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, “the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist.” What is true for those who are

younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God’s sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God’s love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well. “There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us.” Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God’s unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. Nourished, united, and strengthened by the Eucharist, let us individually and collectively, bring this wonderful gift to all we meet, especially the poor with whom we have a special connection.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION BACK IN PERSON THIS FALL!!!



We are very excited to resume in-person Religious Education this fall, the 2021-22 school year! We will, however, have slightly different programs than what has been offered in the past. Please see offerings below for grades Pre-School - 5th Grade:

Program #1: Sunday (Monthly in-person) Family-Style Religious Education Program

(Pre-School - 5th Grade)

Our Sunday program is focused around the family! This program will meet in-person once a month and conduct weekly sessions at-home, with the parents/guardians guiding the student lessons. We will supplement the at-home sessions with weekly video lessons and gather monthly for Family Catechesis. Our monthly family sessions will take place on the following Sundays - meeting from 3-5pm and concluding with Mass at 5:00 pm. Cost is \$150 per family. Sunday Sessions 2021-2022 Tentative Schedule:

September 19 * October 17 *
November 21 * December 19 *
January 16 * February 20 *
March 20 * April 10

Program #2: Monday "Traditional" Religious Education Program

Kindergarten-5th Grade

Our Monday program will be our "traditional" classroom setting for Religious Education. This program is slightly different than previous years. We will meet BI-WEEKLY in-person and on the off-weeks where we do not meet in-person, children will receive a video lesson. Monday Program Cost: \$100 for One Child, \$200 for Two Children, \$250 for Three or more children. Our Monday Sessions will be IN-PERSON - tentative schedule:

September 20 ** October 4, 18 **
November 1, 15, 29 ** December 13
** January 3, 24 ** February 14, 28
** March 14, 28 ** April 11

First Eucharist & Reconciliation Preparation:

If your child will be preparing for their First Eucharist & Reconciliation (typically 2nd grade, but sometimes we get children in 3rd grade) they will need to sign up for our preparation course. In addition to your child's enrollment in either Religious Education or St. Patrick School, they will also need to participate in the First Eucharist & Reconciliation program. Program Cost is \$50 per child. Our First Eucharist & Reconciliation Program Dates are as follows:
October 9 ** November 6 **
December 4 ** January 8 **
February 5 ** March 5
(Reconciliation) ** First Communion Celebration: May 7th



PARISH NURSE MINISTRY - Stay Safe in the Sun Part 3

Easy-to-Follow Tips for Sun Safety

Wear Protective Clothing and Accessories

- A hat with a 2–3-inch brim all around—or a shade cap that also protects your neck—will help protect your head and face.
- To protect your eyes and the skin around them, wear UV-blocking sunglasses that are labelled “UV absorption p to 400 nm” or Meets AN-SI UV absorption up to 400 nm” or “Meets ANSI UV Requirements.” This means the glasses block at least 99% of UV rays.
- Cover as much of your skin as possible by wearing long-sleeved shirts and long skirts or pants.
- Tightly woven fabrics in dark colors block more UV rays more than other types of clothing. They offer more protection when dry.
- Clothing manufactures have developed light-weight clothing with UV protection factor (UPF) values that offer protection even when wet. The UPF scale is 15 to 50+ with the higher the number, the higher the protection from UV rays. Follow all washing instructions carefully.

Check for Skin Changes

A simple tool to evaluate a new skin lesion is to remember the ABCDEs of melanoma. If you notice any of the changes listed below, speak with your primary care provider (PCP). These indicate a higher concern for cancer:

- Asymmetry—lesion does not look the same on both sides.
- Borders—irregular borders that are not smooth and round.
- Color—darker or multiple shades

Diameter—size greater than the eraser on a pencil

Evolution—lesion is changing in some way.

Schedule an Annual Visit with a Primary Care Provider (PCP)

One reason it is so important to visit your PCP annually is to have your provider examine any skin changes you have noticed to determine if you require any follow-up care. When in doubt, don't wait. Make an appointment with a medical professional. When it comes to skin cancer, the sooner the diagnosis, the better the prognosis.




