I think that we all soon realize when we are seated at a restaurant whether there is good management or not, and whether the person waiting on the table really cares about efficient and friendly service for the waiting customer.

In today's Gospel passage, we were told about a basic training program that Jesus provided. It was designed for His disciples before they started out on their mission to announce the coming of the Kingdom of God. Jesus was an effective manager and leader because He was the kind of leader who "knows the way – goes the way – and shows the way". Jesus, "the Way, the Truth and the Life", not only taught His followers to bring God's Word to others, but, as any good manager or teacher should do – taught them through personal involvement and positive good example! You know, material things, stuff, gimmicks, smoke and mirrors, are never needed for us, or any of Jesus' disciples, in order to announce or proclaim the Word of God or to remind ourselves and others that God's Kingdom must be our first priority... "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God and His righteous, then all things necessary will be added on to you – Alleluia", as we express in one of our modern hymns found in our Gather hymnal!

As modern-day followers of

Jesus, what is required of us is complete trust in God, simplicity, generosity, honesty, and a focus on the mission! Or as the prophet Micah, from the Hebrew Scriptures reminds us: "This is what the Lord asks of you, only this – to act justly – to love tenderly – and to walk humbly with your God"! That's the attitude and commitment that Jesus asks of us if we truly wish to continue to freely choose to follow out our baptismal commitment through the Church!

As Jesus Himself did, He also wanted His followers to have friends in life and companionship on their faith-journey through life – persons with whom they could be at ease and feel at home! You may have noticed in the Gospel today that Jesus didn't send His missionaries out as "lone-rangers". He sent them out two-by-two as supportive pairs! And so, in God's masterplan, Jesus set into motion the development of a large family made up of individuals and smaller families. This became our living Church! A community of believers in the Lord Jesus – the living Body of Christ – expressed in terms of service, concern and love!

Sometimes, we express our faith by celebrating Jesus' presence with us in the Word and Eucharist, as you and I do as we gather to celebrate our Mass. Sometimes, in our daily life, we do this through a ministry of compassion and care for others, or as we or other people do who serve the needs of others – those who can use our assistance. What a great and priceless treasure God has given to


lection is not keeping pace with our weekly parish needs. You may have been away for a well-deserved vacation, but the parish needs still continue.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Maybe the work is best left to the professionals. That's how many people view the preaching of the Gospel. That's the stuff priests, religious, deacons, lay ministers, and other professional Church people do. It has little to do with me. Well, that's not really true. The fact of the matter is that preaching the Gospel has everything to do with you, with all of us who are baptized members of the Body of Christ. Nobody gets off the hook from that job. The question is, however, how do we do it? Well, there's a safe way, which many choose, to preach the Gospel — and the risky way. The safe way pretty much keeps the Gospel in church and around like-minded people. I say my prayers, go to Mass, contribute to the food pantry, tithe, and attend Bible Study. That pretty much covers the bases, right? Wrong.

The risky way is the more challenging way and for many, the “road less traveled.” Imagine those first disciples going out and into people's homes. They must have had some amazing conversations with folks about God's kingdom, changing their hearts, forgiving sins, and looking at the world differently. They must have met people who were hurting, exiled from their communities, neglected, lost, or living self-insulated lives in a society that served the rich and neglected the poor. While there were many who welcomed what they had to say and the conversations they had, there were others who no doubt rejected them and literally tossed them out on their ears! The Gospel, while being a message of joy and hope, is not always received well by those who are very comfortable keeping things as they are.

The risky way involves example and conversation. We have to take the Gospel from church and carry it with us wherever we go. What kinds of conversations do we have with others? We interact with those closest to us, in our work, social circles, institutions, corporations, in politics, and beyond. Our conversations with others reveal a great deal about how we see things and what we consider important. If we are really interested in seeing God's vision for the world succeed, then we will talk about it. It will become a part of our everyday conversation and find its way into our interactions with others. How will we preserve the dignity of human life and encourage others to have a relationship with God? We must be the example, live value centered, virtuous lives, stand against injustice, combating racism, and learn ways to resolve conflicts without violence. If we are going to succeed going forward, we have to find a way to bring our prayer centered lives into the marketplace. Our conversations have to change. Not everyone wants to hear what the Gospel has to say. That's a risk God asks us to take.

What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time The Mission of the Twelve Mk 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, “Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.” So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them .


Increase in us a desire for you. Help us to be more open and docile to the movement of your Spirit and mindful of those you’ve sent to help us and guide us. Amen

Bible Study in the Fall



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION BACK IN PERSON THIS FALL!!!



We are very excited to resume in-person Religious Education this fall, the 2021-22 school year! We will, however, have slightly different programs than what has been offered in the past. Please see offerings below for grades Pre-School - 5th Grade:

Program #1: Sunday (Monthly in-person) Family-Style Religious Education Program

(Pre-School - 5th Grade)
Our Sunday program is focused around the family! This program will meet in-person once a month and conduct weekly sessions at-home, with the parents/guardians guiding the student lessons. We will supplement the at-home sessions with weekly video lessons and gather monthly for Family Catechesis. Our monthly family sessions will take place on the following Sundays - meeting from 3-5pm and concluding with Mass at 5:00 pm. Cost is \$150 per family. Sunday Sessions 2021-2022 Tentative Schedule:

- September 19 * October 17 *
- November 21 * December 19 *
- January 16 * February 20 *
- March 20 * April 10

Program #2: Monday "Traditional" Religious Education Program

Kindergarten-5th Grade
Our Monday program will be our "traditional" classroom setting for Religious Education. This program is slightly different than previous years. We will meet BI-WEEKLY in-person and on the off-weeks where we do not meet in-person, children will receive a video lesson. Monday Program Cost: \$100 for One Child, \$200 for Two Children, \$250 for Three or more children. Our Monday Sessions will be IN-PERSON - tentative schedule:

- September 20 ** October 4, 18 **
- November 1, 15, 29 ** December 13
- ** January 3, 24 ** February 14, 28
- ** March 14, 28 ** April 11

First Eucharist & Reconciliation Preparation:

If your child will be preparing for their First Eucharist & Reconciliation (typically 2nd grade, but sometimes we get children in 3rd grade) they will need to sign up for our preparation course. In addition to your child's enrollment in either Religious Education or St. Patrick School, they will also need to participate in the First Eucharist & Reconciliation program. Program Cost is \$50 per child. Our First Eucharist & Reconciliation Program Dates are as follows:
October 9 ** November 6 **
December 4 ** January 8 **
February 5 ** March 5
(Reconciliation) ** First Communion Celebration: May 7th

PARISH NURSE MINISTRY Watch Out! Part 1

These are the signs one needs to know when exercising, playing or going outdoors during the hot summer months.

Symptoms of heat exhaustion:

- Headaches
- Cool, moist skin
- Dizziness and light-headedness
- Weakness
- Nausea and vomiting
- Dark urine






