A Spiritual Reflection:

Recently, in some of my spiritual reading, I came across the following reflection that I thought might be helpful for you in your quiet time this week.

“Humanity has a great hunger for the truth hardwired into our souls. God made our hearts for eternity, and the whole of salvation history is directed to that end. From revealing himself and making covenants, to sending Jesus and establishing the Church in the present day, God never ceases to give himself to his people. He never ceases to provide for, care for, and lead his people. The Lord is indeed our shepherd, and there is nothing we shall want. The Lord *is* a good shepherd.

In both the first reading and the Gospel, we see the effects of poor shepherding. Jeremiah pronounces woe on the false shepherds. God’s people are scattered as a result of their misleading and negligent care. Jeremiah scolds them, and prophesies of the Lord himself gathering the remnant of his flock and bringing them back to their meadow, where they shall be safe and shall increase and multiply. In the Gospel, Jesus sees the vast crowd and is full of compassion for them—*his heart was moved with pity*—because *they were like sheep without a shepherd*.

We're not the nomadic or agrarian societies of the ancient Middle East, so sometimes the image of a good shepherd gets lost in its lack of novelty, and that we don't have the same visceral understanding of the role value and importance of a person. But all of us can understand the need for something so valuable for one's livelihood and flourishing (in this case, sheep) that they must be cared for and protected—as well as fed, led, and given a bed.

So much more important, then, to protect and care for one another. That is, to be nourished in body and spirit; to be directed along the safe path; and to be given rest in order to remain healthy and well. Framed that way, we realize that we all have a responsibility, in some form or another, to shepherd each other. If nothing else, we are obliged by our baptismal vocation to holiness to not lead others astray.

In today's readings, we have insight into how the Lord helps us carry out our responsibilities. The Apostles in the Gospel reading are so overwhelmed by the crowd's longing for Jesus that they did not have time to eat. Human strength is not enough! All ministry needs grace. We have a duty to the truth, but may face confrontation and conflict as a result. So Jesus steps in and calls for some refreshment: go away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while. St. Paul points us to the peace of Christ. It is *through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father*.

The Lord is our shepherd and we find refreshment in the communion of the Holy Trinity. The love of the Father, the reconciling peace of the Son, and the igniting fire of the Holy Spirit should be the strength of us all. Those rooted in the Holy Trinity truly are shepherds after the heart of the Lord." May we all be blessed to be good shepherds wherever we may be this week!

The Steward's Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.


But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?

GOSPEL MEDITATIONS

July 18, 2021

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There's an ordinary pine grove located on a tree farm not too far from town where life's stresses and demands seem to melt away. It is here that all that seemed so important out there no longer is and one can get lost in the rows of trees and majestic beauty. God is here and all is good. We need to connect with the Divine Source of all that is in order to understand what it is we are doing and why we are doing it. Otherwise, things stop making sense and bitterness can overcome one's spirit. It's okay to play once in a while and to discover that place of profound life and peace. People always have needs and there is constantly something to do. And while all of that is necessary and we are needed, there is also that inner solitude within that needs to be celebrated and released.

We all need a pine grove. It's that little place we can go and leave all that consumes us behind. It's a place where technology can be set aside and wonder, and awe given some time. We don't have to text, calculate, or orchestrate anything in the pine grove. It is a somewhat deserted place where all of that can be set aside and we can just be. The anger, frustration, exhaustion, discouragement, helplessness, and occasional apathy, all can fall to the ground like all of those pine needles that once held their place on the branch of a Frasier Fir. The needles can let go. We can let go. We are beings connected with Being and we all need to remember what really matters, who really matters and what life is truly all about. We need to find that place where we can rest and let go of all of the barnacles we accumulate. Rest, breathe, seek, and love.

The world will need us again when we leave the pine grove. It will all be waiting for us, beckoning for our attention. But we will have prayed and will have marveled at the silence and the beauty of goodness. We can go back, ready, and eager to listen, to help, to heal, to cry, to embrace, and attend to all that is asked of us. But, having let go of the distractions in that deserted place we will have a renewed sense of purpose. We will know better Who it is we serve and what we are meant to do. It will all be clearer now that we have been Divinely touched and refreshed.

St. Mary Magdalene



St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

Mary Magdalene has long been regarded as a prostitute or sexually immoral in western Christianity, but this is not supported in the scriptures. It is believed she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did.

The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her. After this, she told several women she associated with and these women also became followers.

There is also debate over if Mary Magdalene is the same unnamed woman, a sinner, who weeps and washes Jesus' feet with her hair in the Gospel of John. Scholars are skeptical this is the same person.

Despite the scholarly dispute over her background, what she did in her subsequent life, after meeting Jesus, is much more significant. She was certainly a sinner whom Jesus saved, giving us an example of how no person is beyond the saving grace of God.

Saints Joachim and Anne's Story

Feast Day: July 26



In the Scriptures, Matthew and Luke furnish a legal family history of Jesus, tracing ancestry to show that Jesus is the culmination of great promises. Not only is his mother's family neglected, we also know nothing factual about them except that they existed. Even the names "Joachim" and "Anne" come from a legendary source written more than a century after Jesus died. The heroism and holiness of these people however, is inferred from the whole family atmosphere around Mary in the Scriptures.

Whether we rely on the legends about Mary's childhood or make guesses from the information in the Bible, we see in her a fulfillment of many generations of prayerful persons, herself steeped in the religious traditions of her people.

The strong character of Mary in making decisions, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, her steadiness at moments of crisis, and her devotion to her relatives—all indicate a close-knit, loving family that looked forward to the next generation even while retaining the best of the past.

Joachim and Anne—whether these are their real names or not—represent that entire quiet series of generations who faithfully perform their duties, practice their faith, and establish an atmosphere for the coming of the Messiah, but remain obscure.





We are very excited to resume in-person Religious Education this fall, the 2021-22 school year! We will, however, have slightly different programs than what has been offered in the past. Please see offerings below for grades Pre-School - 5th Grade:

Program #1: Sunday (Monthly in-person) Family-Style Religious Education Program

(Pre-School - 5th Grade)

Our Sunday program is focused around the family! This program will meet in-person once a month and conduct weekly sessions at-home, with the parents/guardians guiding the student lessons. We will supplement the at-home sessions with weekly video lessons and gather monthly for Family Catechesis. Our monthly family sessions will take place on the following Sundays - meeting from 3-5pm and concluding with Mass at 5:00 pm. Cost is \$150 per family. Sunday Sessions 2021-2022 Tentative Schedule:

January 16 * February 20 *
March 20 * April 10

Program #2: Monday "Traditional" Religious Education Program

Kindergarten-5th Grade

Our Monday program will be our "traditional" classroom setting for Religious Education. This program is slightly different than previous years. We will meet BI-WEEKLY in-person and on the off-weeks where we do not meet in-person, children will receive a video lesson. Monday Program Cost: \$100 for One Child, \$200 for Two Children, \$250 for Three or more children. Our Monday Sessions will be IN-PERSON - tentative schedule:

** January 3, 24 ** February 14, 28
** March 14, 28 ** April 11

First Eucharist & Reconciliation Preparation:

If your child will be preparing for their First Eucharist & Reconciliation (typically 2nd grade, but sometimes we get children in 3rd grade) they will need to sign up for our preparation course. In addition to your child's enrollment in either Religious Education or St. Patrick School, they will also need to participate in the First Eucharist & Reconciliation program. Program Cost is \$50 per child. Our First Eucharist & Reconciliation Program Dates are as follows:

February 5 ** March 5
(Reconciliation) ** First Communion Celebration: May 7th






