Annual Parish Family Picnic to be held on our parish grounds this Sunday afternoon, August 15th, beginning at 1:30pm. A special note of thanks to the members of our Knights of Columbus Council for providing this for us. The Knights of St. Patrick Council #13319 are extending an open invitation to all of our parish families to come together for food, fellowship, fun and games. I hope that you and your family, neighbors and friends will plan to be with us.

Our School Will Open in Two Weeks!

We are pleased to announce that we plan to open our doors for the new school year at the end of this month—Monday, August 30th. We estimate that we will have at least 505 students enrolled this year from pre-school through the eighth grade. Largest enrollment ever!!

Our plan is that we will begin "in-person education" with a back-up plan for virtual distance learning if this becomes required and necessary when the safety of our teachers and children is threatened due to the possible spread of the Covid-19 virus in our community. We pray that this will not be necessary as we will provide for all of the recommended guidelines from the State and the Archdiocese of Detroit Schools Office, and follow the necessary protocol with personal protection requirements including

masks, sanitizers, and social separation when necessary.

Some of our classes have already reached or will soon reach their maximum capacity. However, there may still be a few seats available in some grades as the CDC requirements will still limit the number of students.

Scriptural Reflection

In some of my spiritual reading last week, I found this reflection on today's scriptural passages from Revelation 11:19ff, I Corinthians 15:20-27 and the Gospel of Luke 1:39-56.

"Today we celebrate the fact that Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven. Christians in both the East and the West have a long tradition of celebrating the dormition ("falling asleep") of Mary. In large part because of these long-standing liturgical traditions, Pope Pius XII defined the doctrine of the Assumption of Mary on November 1, 1950. In his encyclical *Munificentissimus Deus*, he also cited Mary's intimate connection with her Son—the new Adam—and his victory over sin and death.

To understand the end of Mary's life, one would have to fully appreciate the beginning of it. From the moment of her conception by Saint Anne and Saint Joa

May we all, one day, know and live the fullness of life, eternal peace, joy and love, where by the grace of God, we too can be forever with Mary, Jesus, and all the Saints who have gone before us into the fullness of our Father's Kingdom.

chim, Mary was free from sin. (We celebrate this on December 8). The Holy Spirit was preparing her by his grace so that she would be capable of welcoming the Son of God (ccc 722). Years later, when the Angel Gabriel approached this young maiden from Nazareth, her obedient “yes” was made possible by her deep faith.

Convinced that *nothing will be impossible for God*, (Lk 1:37), Mary sets off to visit her cousin, Elizabeth. In today’s Gospel, Elizabeth names Mary as *blessed among women* and identifies her as *the mother of my Lord*. Indeed, the baby in her womb who leaped for joy was destined to become the greatest prophet to recognize the Messiah (ccc 523) - John the Baptist.

And how does Mary respond to her cousin’s greeting? She responds in prayer. *My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed; the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name.* She gives all the glory to God! She goes on to name all that God has done to raise up the lowly. This must have been typical of Mary. If prayer is communion with God, she must have developed a lifelong habit of prayer; and when she is in ultimate communion with the God she was carrying in her womb, how much easier it was to sing God’s praise. This “Magnificat”, or “Canticle of Mary”, is one of the most ancient Christian hymns. It is modeled after similar songs of praise in the Old Testament. We still use it in our Liturgies, particularly at Evening Prayer.

Our life of faith, too, must be sustained in prayer—both personal and communal prayer. Our participation in the liturgy both expresses and nourishes our faith (ccc 1123). Making time in our day for personal prayer, too, enables us to appreciate God’s abiding presence and places us in deeper communion with him. If we follow Mary’s example—a routine of prayer, a habit of praise, and a total submission to God’s will - we will join in her heavenly reward.”



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

WWMD?

WWJD bracelets were all the rage about 25 years ago in Christian circles. I've always wondered if a WWMD bracelet might not make just as much sense, and maybe more. What Would Mary Do?

I would argue that Mary was the most exemplary steward who ever lived. Her answer was always "Yes." Yes, Lord, I am Your handmaiden. Yes, I will visit Elizabeth, and help her in the last difficult months of pregnancy. Yes, I will bring my son up in the Mosaic law and present him at the Temple of Jerusalem. Yes, I will give him to the crowds and to public ministry. Yes, I will offer him on this Cross, if it is Your will.

Yes, yes, yes.

Well, I can't be like Mary, we think to ourselves. There's an intimidation factor with the Blessed Mother and Catholics sometimes — one that almost exceeds that of Christ. Perhaps it's because we are in awe of the fact that she was not divine in any way — she was a mere creation, like us — but somehow, she always had the courage to say yes. How could she do it, when we find it so hard?

Well, God certainly lavished on Mary extraordinary graces. Her lack of original sin liberated her to conform her will to God's.

But God is impatient to give us, too, all the graces we need to be a steward in the example of Mary. He's waiting for us simply to ask. Just as in Adam we died, so in Christ — through Mary — we live.

What can we say yes to today, in Mary's example?

Assumption of Mary Prayer

The Assumption of Mary into Heaven: A Special Feast Day

The Assumption of Mary is also known as the Falling Asleep of the Blessed Virgin Mary or the Dormition of Mary. It is a Holy Day of Obligation and is celebrated annually on August 15.

Every year, Christians celebrate when Our Blessed Mother was taken up into Heaven body and soul at the end of her life. On November 1, 1950 Pope Pius XII infallibly declared the doctrine of the Assumption a dogma:

“By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.”

Sleeping or Dying?

It has not been dogmatically defined whether Mary actually died or not – Pope Pius XII left this question open when he said “having completed the course of her earthly life.” Many people, however, believe that she did not die. However, there is a tradition that Mary died in the presence of all of the apostles. Saint Thomas, however, was absent. When he arrived, the other apostles opened the tomb for him and found it empty. The apostles then concluded that she had been taken up into Heaven. A later tradition says that Mary then dropped her sash down from Heaven for Thomas as proof that she really had been assumed into Heaven.

What is the difference between the Ascension and the Assumption? Jesus ascended. Mary was assumed. Because Jesus is God, He went up into Heaven by His own power. Mary, however, is a creature. She is not God. Thus, she could not ascend to Heaven by her own power. Thus, she was assumed – taken up into Heaven.

In Heaven but With Us

Even though Mary was assumed into Heaven, she is always with us. Heaven is our home and Mary wants us to be with her and her Son for all eternity. On the Solemnity of the Assumption, let us remember our Mother who is in Heaven and who loves us very much. The Assumption is the fourth Glorious Mystery in the Rosary. So, every time we pray the Rosary we can remember that she is always with us and that she loves us more than anyone else on earth could!





RELIGIOUS EDUCATION BACK IN PERSON THIS FALL!!!



We are very excited to resume in-person Religious Education this fall, the 2021-22 school year! We will, however, have slightly different programs than what has been offered in the past. Please see offerings below for grades Pre-School - 5th Grade:

Program #1: Sunday (Monthly in-person) Family-Style Religious Education Program

(Pre-School - 5th Grade)

Our Sunday program is focused around the family! This program will meet in-person once a month and conduct weekly sessions at-home, with the parents/guardians guiding the student lessons. We will supplement the at-home sessions with weekly video lessons and gather monthly for Family Catechesis. Our monthly family sessions will take place on the following Sundays - meeting from 3-5pm and concluding with Mass at 5:00 pm. Cost is \$150 per family. Sunday Sessions 2021-2022 Tentative Schedule: Sessions begin at 3pm

Program #2: Monday "Traditional" Religious Education Program

Kindergarten-5th Grade

Our Monday program will be our "traditional" classroom setting for Religious Education. This program is slightly different than previous years. We will meet BI-WEEKLY in-person and on the off-weeks where we do not meet in-person, children will receive a video lesson. Monday Program Cost: \$100 for One Child, \$200 for Two Children, \$250 for Three or more children. Our Monday Sessions will be IN-PERSON - in-person sessions will run from 5:45-7pm Tentative Schedule:

First Eucharist & Reconciliation Preparation:

In addition to your child's enrollment in either Religious Education or St. Patrick School, they will also need to participate in the First Eucharist & Reconciliation program. 
