School Opens Monday!

This Monday, August 30th, our parish school will open our doors for the new 2021-2022 school year with an enrollment of 505 students.

This will begin with in-person classroom education following all of the prescribed health and safety regulations with a back-up plan for total virtual education if that should become necessary due to a serious rise in the spread of the Covid-19 Delta Coronavirus epidemic. We are praying that our in-person classes will remain open as long as we are safely able to do this.

We are following all of the recommended guidelines from Oakland County, the State, and the Archdiocesan Schools Office following the necessary protocols, including, daily temperature readings, masks, sanitizers, and social distancing where that is required.

We want to officially welcome our school principal, Mr. Jeremy Clark, our new Assistant Principal, Mr. Charles Hoying, the office staff, faculty, returning students, our new students and their families, and are praying that you will all have a safe, healthy, and great year here in our fine St. Patrick School! May God bless you all!

Scriptural Reflections!

I want to offer to you this reflection that I found in my Scriptural Reading last week from Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8, James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27, and Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23.

"The readings today discuss two very different kinds of service to God. On the one hand, there are believers who offer God "Word Service". These are the ones Jesus criticizes so harshly, quoting Isaiah: *This people honors me with their words, but their hearts are far from me.* On the other are those who offer what we might call "Heart Service". People who are doers of the Word and not hearers only. As James writes, *Religion that is pure and undefiled before God*

and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction.

The Pharisees and scribes, in today's Scripture, demonstrate "Word Service" to God. They, and those people today who imitate them, immerse themselves in religious customs, but because their hearts are far from God, they are filled with malice. They direct their worship to God, but to fellow believers, direct their arrogance and judgment. No good deeds result from this—no building up of the kingdom of God occurs with this. No life-changing-for-the-good experiences happen in this environment. No opportunities to witness to the goodness of God arise from this. Pope Francis said 5 words... "Who am I to judge"! Just consider what that means in your own life. ... "Who am I to judge?"

What is within our hearts? Do we offer "word service"—or "heart service"—to God? Any small act of kindness or a small gesture from a pure heart can change another's life, and build the Kingdom in ways we could never envision."


Congratulations to Deacon Mike & Others!

AWARD WINNER!**

Deacon Mike Chesley has a heart for ministering to those in prison. The chaplain of the Wayne County Jail and director of Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan's prison and jail ministry cherishes the time he spends meeting with incarcerated individuals, accompanying them in the Scriptures, offering Communion and being a listening ear.

So Deacon Chesley's heart was broken when pandemic restrictions prohibited him from being able to visit and accompany those behind bars for the better part of the past year and a half. Still, [he found other ways to serve](#) — helping parolees and those recently released find housing, employment and other services to help them adjust to life on the outside.

"I have so much love for them because especially when they come out of the jails and prisons, the world treats them as lepers," Deacon Chesley told *Detroit Catholic*. "In Luke's Gospel, the lepers are outside the village, and society doesn't want anything to do with them. They have to fend for their own food, basically ostracized from their whole community. There's very little opportunity for them to succeed."

Deacon Chesley and his team of five volunteers devote themselves day and in and day out to following Christ's example — unafraid to approach those whom society views as unapproachable. For his dedication to the corporal works of mercy, Deacon Chesley will be honored with the Leonard R. Jagels Leadership Award on Sept. 11 during [Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan's Annual Celebration](#).

The honor is one of three awards to be given during the gala — held in person this year at the Basilica of Ste. Anne in Detroit as well as virtually — which serves as the largest fundraiser of the year for the charitable service arm of the Archdiocese of Detroit. The event helps fund more than 14 offices and ministries across Metro Detroit that serve an estimated 20,000 individuals each year.

"I'm very humbled because there's so many deserving people and ministries, but I was absolutely thrilled because it reflects the all the work that our volunteers are doing," Deacon Chesley said of the award, which is named after the late Catholic Services director Leonard R. Jagels.

"Everyone at Catholic Charities has been super supportive," said Deacon Chesley, who maintains an office at the newly opened Center for the Works of Mercy in Midtown Detroit. "We couldn't do it without them, and we couldn't do it without our great volunteers."

What About A “Religious Exemption?”

August 21, 2021



Dear Brothers,

The Clergy Office has received questions from pastors about whether they can provide letters to parishioners seeking a religious exemption for the COVID vaccine. I offer the following guidance for your pastoral response to those who approach you in this regard.

When considering these requests and discussing them with the faithful, pastors should:

- Affirm the moral permissibility of COVID-19 vaccines, as detailed in the following authoritative documents/statements:
- [Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith](#): “When ethically irreproachable Covid-19 vaccines are not available...*it is morally acceptable to receive Covid-19 vaccines that have used cell lines from aborted fetuses in their research and production process.*”
- [United States Conference of Catholic Bishops](#): “Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.”
- [The bishops of Michigan](#): “It is morally permissible to be vaccinated if there are no alternatives and there are serious health risks. Such serious health risks are present due to the current pandemic.”
- [Pope Francis](#): “Being vaccinated with vaccines authorized by the competent authorities is an act of love. And contributing to ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love – love for oneself, love for one’s family and friends, love for all people.”
- Affirm the CDF’s judgment (linked above) that “practical reason makes evident that vaccination is not, as a rule, a moral obligation and that, therefore, it must be voluntary.” Individuals who refuse vaccines “must do their utmost to avoid, by other prophylactic means and appropriate behavior, becoming vehicles for the transmission of the infectious agent. In particular, they must avoid any risk to the health of those who cannot be vaccinated for medical or other reasons, and who are the most vulnerable.” In this way, we affirm the individual right of conscience while also affirming our shared responsibility to protect our own health and the health of others in the community in which we live.

In addition to the above pastoral response, a pastor may sign a letter verifying an individual’s parish membership. This has always been the case. If asked, a pastor also may author a letter (addressed to his parishioner) sharing all of the above affirmations.

Please know of my prayers for you, that you may guide the faithful entrusted to you by the Lord more deeply into His Sacred Heart.



This is one of those blunt stories of what living faithfully is all about.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

August 29, 2021

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Albert Einstein said that the “true measure of intelligence is not knowledge but imagination.” Being a disciple of Jesus Christ requires a great deal of imagination. It is not enough to simply attend to facts, rules and rituals and consider the job done. Quite contrarily, the Gospels demands creativity, of trying to discern how to put flesh on the Beatitudes and properly serve God’s children. Jesus never doled out a top down agenda. Not once did he ever demand conformity over conversion or sacrifice over mercy. The Gospel is always about putting people in touch with their compassionate, forgiving, and unconditionally loving God and meeting them where they are.

For Jesus, it often meant breaking a few rules. Well respected and time-honored traditions had to be set aside in order to attend to what really mattered. God’s compassion, mercy and true conversion were always the trump cards. The story of the Good Samaritan, healing on the Sabbath, and bypassing of purification rituals all display this theme. Human beings can get too hung up on protocol and tradition. This is so much so that often preserving all of these things is of greater concern than the beggar knocking on our door or the sinner looking for mercy. It is no wonder, then, that we can easily become hypocritical. Many can see us on our knees in prayer while our true heart and actions, rooted in judgment and self-preservation, are hidden from others. It is a trap into which we can easily fall. Who cares how we live our lives as long as our hands are properly washed!

Here enters the need for imagination and the distinction of truly being a wise and intelligent person. It takes a good measure of creativity and a lot of guts to really be a doer of God’s word and not merely a hearer. Being a person who doesn’t just tell people about God but shows people God requires courage and ingenuity. That’s why people like St. Francis of Assisi and St. Teresa of Calcutta are timeless. Their genuineness speaks volumes generation to generation. It’s risky business taking the step to allow God into our hearts. Permitting God to release us from the grip of our evil thoughts, infidelity, greed, malice, sexual improprieties, licentiousness, envy, arrogance, folly, and the like takes courage. That’s why we prefer to spend our energy re-arranging the future rather than take measures to secure a foundation that is most certainly crumbling.



Registration is open until September 10th

Do you have a child / children who need to sign up for Religious Education? We are currently registering for PS - 5th Grade. Below are the options for the Fall:

Program #1: Sunday “Family-Style” Religious Education Program (Pre-School - 5th Grade)

Our Sunday program is focused around the family! This program will meet in-person once a month and conduct weekly sessions at-home, with the parents/guardians guiding the student lessons. We will supplement the at-home sessions with weekly video lessons and gather monthly for Family Catechesis. Our monthly family sessions will take place on the following Sundays - Cost is \$150 per family.

Sunday Sessions 2021-2022 Schedule: September 19 * October 17 * November 21 * December 12 * January 16 * February 20 * March 20 * April 10

In-Person Sunday Sessions run from 3-5pm, concluding with Mass at 5:00 pm.

Program #2: Monday “Traditional” Religious Education Program (Kindergarten-5th Grade)

Our Monday program will be our “traditional” classroom setting for Religious Education. This program is slightly different than previous years. We will meet BI-WEEKLY in-person and on the off-weeks where we do not meet in-person, children will receive a video lesson. Monday Program Cost: \$100 for One Child, \$200 for Two Children, \$250 for Three or more children. Our Monday Sessions will be IN-PERSON schedule:

Monday Sessions 2021-22 Schedule: September 20 ** October 4, 18 ** November 1, 15, 29 ** December 13 ** January 3, 24 ** February 14, 28 ** March 14, 28 ** April 11

In-person Sessions Run from 5:45 pm - 7:00 pm

Do you have a child / children who will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation & First Communion this year?

If your child will be preparing for their First Eucharist & Reconciliation (typically 2nd grade, but sometimes we get children in 3rd grade) they will need to sign up for our preparation course. In addition to your child’s enrollment in either Religious Education or St. Patrick School, they will also need to participate in the First Eucharist & Reconciliation program. Program Cost is \$50 per child.


