I want to publicly express a note of deep gratitude, in advance, to Bishop Cepeda for offering to be with us for this National Catholic Schools Eucharistic Celebration!

Our Catholic "Festival of Lights"!

This Wednesday, February 2nd, we are celebrating the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. It is also known as *Candlemas Day*.

As this occurs each year, forty days after Christmas, the feast, originating in Jerusalem in the 4th century, marks the mid-point of winter— halfway between

(Pastoral Notes cont'd) the winter solstice (the shortest day of the year) and the spring equinox. Jesus came into our world as the "light"—shining in a darkened world—a sign of true hope as our Emmanuel, God with us; and so we light candles on this day to remind us of this God-given reality among us.

I came across an old weather proverb that said if we have a bright and sunny Candlemas Day there will be more winter to come. However, if we have a cloudy and stormy Candlemas Day, perhaps the worst of winter has passed. We could only hope! I also found a proverb that goes like this ... "If Candlemas Day be fair and bright, winter will have another fight. If Candlemas Day brings clouds and rain, winter will not come again". Maybe, this is how the hedgehog or groundhog tradition began.

May you all be blessed by the Lord with a peaceful and happy Candlemas Day this Wednesday. May the Light of Christ shine forth for you.

Thank You For Your Christian Stewardship!

First of all, this week I want to offer a word of public recognition and gratitude to all of you who are offering your generous, faithful and consistent weekly financial church support for our St. Patrick Parish Faith Family. I am personally appreciative to you for your positive and responsible expressions of various Christian stewardship as you continue to offer your time and talent as well.

Each day of our God-given life, as Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, continues to remind us, we are invited through our initial baptismal call and empowered by the Holy Spirit to live out our discipleship in our relationship with the Lord and with others. As members of the Church, we have all been called to follow Jesus; to take up our cross each day; to offer our gifts and talents for the building up of God's Kingdom; to care for each other; to offer a hand when we see a need; and in whatever ways we are able to do so-according to our personal God-given vocation in life—we have all been called and gifted by the Holy Spirit to announce the Good News of Jesus in our everyday life.

Perhaps this week, we could offer this simple prayer each day: "Speak Lord, your servant is listening...I will go wherever you need me...I will hold your people in my heart."

Feast of St. Blaise!

Next weekend, February 5th & 6th, we will offer the traditional blessing of the throat at all of our Masses in honor of St. Blaise. However, because of the necessary Covid protocols required at this time, we will not be able to offer individual blessings. Hopefully, next year, with the grace of God, this will once again be possible.

This is the prayer that will be offered at the conclusion of our Prayers of General Intercession with the blessed candles at all of the Masses: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, may the Lord protect you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. Amen."

Scriptural Reflections!

In my scriptural reading last week, I found this reflection that I thought might be helpful to you this week. (Jer 1:4-5, 17-19; 1 Cor 12:31; 13:13 or 13:4-13; Lk 4:21-30)

Anyone who has been to a Catholic wedding has likely heard today's Second Reading there. It is chosen, and appropriate, not just for its relevance to the couple about to embark on a sacramental life together, but for what it reveals about God—that God is love. Love is not just a sentiment, but an action. Therefore, when patience and kindness are extended; when one bears, hopes, believes, and endures all things; and when one is not pompous, or jealous, or rude...that is love. Anything else is not love. St. Paul is not just "defining the love" that comes from God, he is confirming that all things good derive from love, and that authentic love produces goodness. This enduring reality of love is revealed in who God is for us, for no matter what we have done to and against him throughout our human history, he has never failed to love us.

One of the messages that can be gleaned from our Gospel today is similar to Paul's. The setting of today's passage is Jesus helping people in the synagogue understand how some of the old prophesies refer to him. Yet they find it difficult to believe that this poor, obscure, son of a carpenter could possibility be the one who is fulfilling this prophecy from Isaiah. Their familiarity with Jesus makes it particularly challenging for them to see him as more than simply a charismatic teacher. They want Jesus to work

some miracles to prove he is who he claims to be.

Rather than working miracles, Jesus scandalizes them by suggesting that his saving ministry is not only for the Jewish people. Once Jesus insists that the love of God is large enough to save even the Gentiles, this draws anger and rejection from his hometown community. The fact that he would suggest that God would have love and mercy for unclean outsiders is too much for the people to accept. Their admiration of Jesus turns to indignation very quickly. How could this possibly be the Anointed One if he suggests such shocking things?

Jesus is revealing a better understanding of God's love. God is so loving and merciful that even those who began as his enemies could be brought into his friendship. Jesus' mission was to make the way to heaven so that anyone who repents and believes in him could find the path home. Jesus would save Samaritans, Romans, and many other people that the Jewish crowd would view as enemies. This notion of God's love was so generous that the people were scandalized by its depth and scope.

It is not hard to be challenged by the scope and depth of God's love, and what that demands from us in return. It is difficult for us to truly grasp how the love of God can be so vast. We may even, at times, doubt that the Lord can truly love and forgive us, since we know the depths of our own sinfulness. Jesus rejects any limits on God's love, and Paul gives us words of great hope: Love never fails. We can know this only partially, for we see indistinctly, as Paul But through Christ we get a glimpse of what we, one day, will know fully. For faith, hope, and love remain and the greatest is love.

"Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe.

Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?).

A sense of division — whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else — is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen — especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree — even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window.

As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us—even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read — and remember, love never fails.

St. Blaise Feast Day: February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.




