### Marriage

Any engaged couple who wish to be married at St. Patrick should be a registered member at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. The couple will meet with the priest prior to marriage and will attend an approved marriage preparation program.

A couple who has been married in a non-Catholic ceremony and wish to have their marriage formally recognized by the Catholic Church can undergo a Convalidation process and have a church ceremony celebrating the sacrament of marriage.

## Thank You to Chris and Congratulations!

When I arrived at St. Isaac Jogues, I met two wonderful women, Marietta and Kathi. They were the funeral team. When a call came in, they would work with me to find a date with the family, they would meet with the family to plan, and they would make sure everything was set up so that things proceeded smoothly on the day of the funeral Mass. All of this I was not used to coming from St. Joseph. I met with every family, but everything about St. Joseph was much smaller.

Chris has accepted the position of Director of Liturgy and Sacramental Practice for the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. When he told me, I thought of Marietta and Kathi. Before the whirlwind that is Holy Week, the Finance Council was discussing an operating deficit for the fiscal year (which begins July 1) of over \$100,000. I jotted down some numbers from that meeting. In 2023, our offertory was \$908,325. In 2024, it was \$961,880. That is good, but in 2018, it was \$929,816! I do not find expenses to be roughly the same as they were in 2018.

I announced last weekend that I will be creating teams to do some of the liturgical work that Chris has done. At St. Joseph and St. Isaac Jogues, I had a deacon. That will be the tricky part. We don't have a deacon, and I haven't been able to get one. Marietta and Kathi also ran the liturgical side of weddings, and Deacon Jim and I handled the catechesis. Sr. Mary Jacinta took it upon herself to train servers because I didn't have the bandwidth, and one of the mothers made the schedule. The celebration of the sacraments is core to what we do at church, and in most parishes there is a small army of people that makes it work.

I then turn to you. My priority is to get a handful of people to be the funeral team and the wedding team first. I think St. Patrick has 40 funerals each year. That would be a funeral Mass each week, but of course they are not scheduled in that way. I have found that this can be very healing and rewarding for someone who has recently buried a loved one in his or her own family. A couple of people here will be helpful because people are out of town and we get sick. Funeral Masses of course don't stop. Of course I will train you, and it is surprisingly easy once you walk the first family through. Wedding ministry is similar, and I and mentor couples will handle the formation of people preparing for marriage.

I need someone to schedule servers and lectors and train servers.

I'm also looking for someone to oversee the first Friday adoration. It is a blessing to be able to adore Our Lord. I have found at every parish that I have been at that this only occurs when someone sacrifices a fair amount of time to make it happen. Don't let this discourage you. You are saying that you love Jesus very much, and he will reward you.

Emergencies. I cannot always answer the emergency line. I need a second person. When this person gets the call, I am tied up, and you must find Fr. Paul, Fr. Tomy, Fr. Placido, or Fr. Wayne.

Phew. Please consider these needs of St. Patrick. If you are interested in helping in any of these areas, please see me or call me in the parish office.

Let me end by saying I have been trying to catch up on some things after coming back. One of those is thanking people for Easter cards; however, someone gave me card with a gift and didn't sign! Thank you to whomever that was!

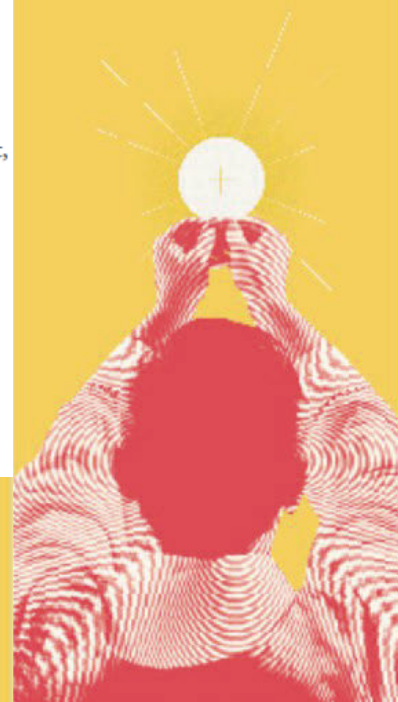

**STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS****Fourth Sunday of Easter**

A “shepherding” theme links today’s Scripture passages. In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas speak to the Jewish converts to Christ. A week later, they are persecuted for preaching again in Antioch — they turn to shepherd the Gentiles instead. In the Book of Revelation, the evangelist St. John wonderfully describes those who have persevered through great tribulation for the faith: *For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water.* In St. John’s Gospel, Jesus proclaims: *My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.* Sheep do indeed learn their shepherd’s voice and follow him. As the Good Shepherd, Jesus continues to knock on the door of our hearts, inviting us to a deeper relationship with Him. Are we prepared to follow Christ, to accept His challenge of discipleship, whatever the cost, as we strive for eternal life? Consider encountering our Lord through Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction.

Often the email display name will appear as "Fr. David Cybulski" but when you expand the email address, it is not from our church's account. Please always check the real email address, not just what the name appears to be. When you see this, please don't respond, just simply delete it, and block the number if it is a text. If you are in doubt, please give us a call at the office.

**“Do you love me? Feed my sheep.”**

This Weekend marks the beginning of this year’s Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). **Our parish target is \$145,421.** If every registered household gave \$375, we would meet that goal. As Msgr. Tony Tocco used to say: *“We’re not looking for equal gifts, but equal sacrifice.”* Because of your generosity, we exceeded our 2024 CSA obligation by over \$22,000. That surplus came directly back to the parish and allowed us to reinvest in our facilities. This year, if we exceed our goal, the first \$30,000 will go to needed maintenance of our parish facilities. Any surplus beyond that will help us acquire a new set of Stations of the Cross, along with a few other updates.

Any money collected through the CSA is exempt from the 7% Archdiocesan tax that applies to all other donations. One more point to remember, any gift to the CSA does not go into next year’s target calculation, so it is even better for the parish than giving at Christmas.

CSA supports a lot more than people realize: 80 Catholic schools, 220 people in formation at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, campus ministries, pro-life parish outreach, mission partners, and more.

You’ll soon receive the 2025 CSA mailing from St. Patrick, asking for your support. Please take a moment to read the enclosed CSA brochure. ## The Doctor is In!

### My Time at St. Patrick, pt 1

Last week at all the Masses, I announced my departure from St. Patrick and the news of accepting a new assignment in Pensacola, Florida, as the Director of Liturgy and Sacramental Practice at the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. I expressed the mixed set of emotions I am feeling since it is sad for me to depart St. Patrick and at the same time exciting to take on this next assignment. There is a little bit of trepidation when I think about the task of uprooting the 24 years of my life in the Metro Detroit area and moving to another part of the country. In the next few bulletin articles, I want to share with you what the Lord has been accomplishing within me and why St. Patrick holds a special place in my heart.

I came to St. Patrick at the end of February of last year, having left my previous parish in January. Because it was the Fifth Week of Lent, I had to hit the ground rolling continuing the preparations for Holy Week and Easter. I had the task of onboarding (Marilyn and Dave Weber did a great job in this regard), adjusting to a new parish, and learning Fr. David's vision for worship, in addition to several funerals, baptisms, and weddings on my plate. I also needed to go through my office, the sacristies, and several storage rooms to get a full view of the situation here. One note that I wish to include here is the fact that I came after experiencing some deep woundedness from my previous parish, and I knew that I was going to have to do some spiritual work to overcome that hurdle, yet duties called.

Two things made the transition easier. First, I already knew Fr. David from our time in seminary and that he goes by the book when it comes to worship. It made it easier to anticipate what he expected from me in the position. There was a mantra in the seminary that many of the young priests have continued to embrace: "Do the red, say the black." There was no need to guess at what I needed to do or how to accomplish a task, and so I did not have to worry about doing things incorrectly, which can be a major strain when taking on a new position. Also, even though I never was in a worship position officially, I have had tons of experience ever since I became an altar server at age 10. Flexibility was required as I have worked with several bishops and priests with all sorts of personalities and styles.

Secondly, the community at St. Patrick, to my surprise, has an amazing legion of volunteers ready at the go. In some of my previous assignments, the staff was required to do all the work and volunteerism was matter of prestige. One person in particular that helped me out at the beginning was Gwendolyn Newton who brought me up to speed quickly to learn the ins and outs of St. Patrick. We worked together on a few projects, including the installation of the new sanctuary furnishings. Eventually, I got to know St. Patrick and got to know many of the volunteers, mainly those who volunteer in liturgical ministry.

When I had applied for this position, I was applying for other positions and soon learned if I wanted to employ my doctorate, I would have to look beyond the Detroit area to do so. Most of the other positions were executive level positions and required several rounds of interviews. I was invited to interview in person for a handful positions, but I did not seem to be able to get anywhere with them. I began to question things and God's desires and designs for my life. Needless to say, I became very frustrated with myself and very restless. I would be some time before I began receiving answers, and some of them I never would have anticipated. More on this next time...

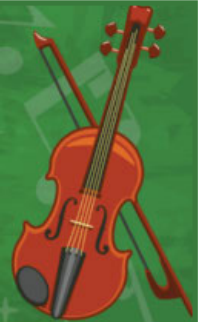

## Celebrate the Jubilee Year on Pilgrimage!

In a rescript issued on December 20, 2024, Archbishop Vigneron designated 12 pilgrimage sites within the Archdiocese of Detroit at which the faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence. A list of the sites is available at [aod.org/jubilee](http://aod.org/jubilee). To receive an indulgence, either for oneself or for a soul of the Faithful departed, one must visit an aforementioned pilgrimage site with the intention of obtaining an indulgence and, at the site, engage in Eucharistic adoration or meditation for a suitable time, recite the Our Father, a Profession of Faith (such as the Apostles' Creed or Nicene Creed), and invoke the intercession of Mary, Mother of God.

The Jubilee Pilgrimage Site Passports are now available! This tool is for families or individuals to mark their visits to the different Jubilee sites this year. Entries include the name of the pilgrimage site, the address, a spot to add any reflections and a coloring image for that site. There are also blank pages at the end to add additional churches they may visit during the year. **Pick up your copy in the brochure rack in the church vestibule.**

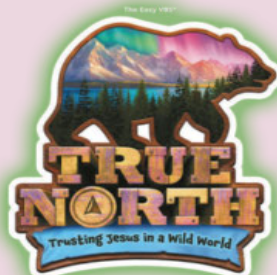

### Seeing Christ in the Immigrant

**Imagine having to flee to another country to protect your family and trying to establish a new life...**

While migrants attest to the better conditions they find in the U.S., the challenges they face do not end upon arrival. Dignitas Infinita notes that in their new home, migrants' lives are "put at risk because they no longer have the means to start a family, to work, or to feed themselves."

Undocumented individuals are among the most vulnerable of society, often forced to live in the shadows because of the fear of deportation and having to return to the dangers or hardships they were trying to escape.

"We do have a lot of people coming here for safety reasons, so they'd rather live in a country with nothing, and no documents, and no way to get legal employment ... than staying in their country where they could potentially come across harm or death," said Samantha Lindberg, program director of the Immigration Assistance Program for Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Kalamazoo.

This is not something most Americans can fathom, though imagine having to flee to another country to protect your family and trying to establish a new life — finding housing, a job to afford food and necessities, schooling and healthcare for children — without knowing the language or the laws. This is where the Church, through the members of the Body of Christ, has proved crucial in the lives of immigrants who needed the help of others to find their footing here.

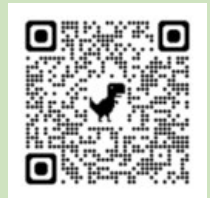
### May is Mental Health Month



St. Dymphna, also known as the Lily of Ireland, is the patron saint of mental illness, nervous disorders, therapists and loss of parents. She lived in the 7th century, the daughter of the pagan king of Oriel. At age 14, she fled persecution by her father to Geel, Belgium. In Geel, she established a hospice for the poor and sick, serving in particular those with mental health problems. Geel remains to this day a place where people with mental illness are cared for in home environments.

St. Dymphna was martyred in 680 - her feast day is May 15.
