


This weekend we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Advent. It's a little bit unusual this year in that we have another five days of

Advent before December 25th. I remember one year when Christmas was the day after the Fourth Sunday, and that seemed very rushed, so I appreciate what seems like a little more time this year to get ready. The important thing is to actually use that time to get ready! But I mean spiritually ready! Above all, retain a sense of JOY that comes from the awareness that we have been rescued by Jesus from our sins, from eternal death, and have been called into a relationship of life and love that begins now and goes on into eternity. While we aren't experiencing eternal life in its fullness yet, to the extent that we're open to it we anticipate the fullness of joy by living His way now.

As I mentioned in my homilies last weekend, to be full of anticipation (like the crowds that came to John the Baptizer) tends to fill us with joy. For example, a little child who just happened to be rummaging through his mother's closet and comes across his wrapped Christmas present can get excited about what's to come—even though he better not open it yet. He's filled with anticipative joy! Or a bride, one week before her wedding, is NOT gloomy! In fact, the many last minute details, which definitely still have to be done, are done with a sense of joy rather than gloom.

Here are some suggestions for spiritual

The "One-Hour Challenge!"

To have a happy, peaceful life, it is important that we have our lives in order, with our grateful response to God for his gifts being our top priority. That is how a disciple responds in the areas of prayer, family, finance, and service.

If you need help to put balance in your life, take the "one-hour challenge": Each week, spend at least...

- •One hour in prayer and worship.
- •One hour, special, focused on your family or other important relationship.
- •One hour's wage (if you have a job) for the Lord. No job? Then give what seems right for you.
- •One hour in service. (Helping another, or working for some cause.)

It's important to be *specific* in what steps to take in order to ensure that each "hour" actually happens!

preparedness marked by a sense of joy:

First, honestly deal with any need to repent. (Every Advent season the Church always gives us the words of John the Baptizer which calls for repentance as necessary to prepare the way of the Lord.) While going to Confession or making a point of reconciling with another person might not seem at first glance like a joyful experience, the results most certainly can be! As a priest I am often moved by a truly sincere confession in which a person finds themselves set free, unburdened! They are filled with joy as they experience forgiveness.

Second, Take another look at the "one-hour challenge" that's printed in our bulletin each week, and make a point of challenging yourself to improve in each of the 4 areas of discipleship, no matter what progress you may have already made. Also, as I emphasized in last Sunday's homily, be very specific about what actions you plan on taking. But above all, let each of the four pillars of discipleship, grow out of a deep sense of thankfulness. In order to have thankfulness in mind, you might want to spend some time prayerfully reflecting on the many ways that God has blessed you-and not just the BIG ones that come to mind easily, but most especially the little moment-to-moment ones that we so often overlook or take for granted. These are little gifts of love that tell us God is interested in all the details of our lives.

So, watch for the sense of joy that comes from each of the four areas: prayer, family, generosity, and service. The joy of our prayer (when it's filled with thankfulness) is seen in Mary's prayer, the Magnificat. You might try reading her prayer, her song (see Luke 1:46), especially the first four verses, and apply it to your own life. In any event, let your prayer during this last week of Advent be filled with joy! The other three challenge areas can also be a great source of joy if we allow it. Giving, not grudgingly, but from a generous heart, brings joy to the giver. Serving, when done with a desire to be like Jesus who came not to be served, but to serve, makes a person feel holy and happy. And taking time to truly enjoy a family member or a friend is a way of building that relationship and anticipates the much fuller relationship that we will know in eternity.

Third, witness about God's love to some other person. After all, we are called to be "a joyful band of missionary disciples", and so we want to share the gift that we have been given. You can do this directly, when the moment seems right, by giving a truthful statement of the difference that Jesus, the Gospel, the Spirit, and the Faith have made in your life. You can also give indirect witness by letting the joy in your heart express itself in action by letting someone ahead of you when shopping (or even parking), and you do it with a smile! A kind word to someone who seems stressed out might be another way. Doing something thoughtful for a member of your family or for a co-worker can be great witness. Another opportunity might be during your next argument! How? Let the other person win! After all, Jesus didn't say, "a new commandment I give you: be right!" He said, A new commandment I give you: love one another." Isn't it better to have happiness than to prove that you're right and the other person is wrong? Frankly, 50 years from now, no one will care who won that particular argument, and it's surely even less significant when seen from the perspective of eternity.

People sometimes say, "wouldn't it be great to have the spirit of Christmas all the time?" Actually, we can. And you can practice over the next five days.

Pray in Thanksgiving for our Priest



Fourth Sunday of Advent

In today's Scripture readings from the Book of the Prophet Micah and the Letter to the Hebrews, the sacred writers proclaim the

coming of the Lord into the world. In the Gospel — the Good News — St. Luke describes Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, who lives in the Judean hill country. Both women are with child. John, who as a man preaches a baptism of repentance, "leaps" in Elizabeth's womb at Mary's greeting. Even before his birth, John has a special relationship with his cousin, Jesus. In turn, Elizabeth recognizes Mary as the Mother of our Lord. During Advent, in a spirit of evangelization, Christian stewards strive for a closer bond with Christ. Use this time wisely, deepening your relationship with the Lord. Pray, read, and reflect on Scripture, and attend Mass regularly in order to partake in Holy Communion.





Gospel Meditation

4th Sunday of Advent

St. Augustine tells us that a "Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps." As we look around and out at the world, we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life's necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world's ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes.

Why doesn't God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world's ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary



listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine, God could use her as his mind, heart, voice, and hand. She became God's vessel so that God's greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God's fix for the world's difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God's instrument. What a beautiful, equitable, and iust world it would be.


