
Last week I mentioned that in a future column (well, this is it) that I would inform you about the changes that are happening to how our parish is

organized. This is all part of our efforts to better accomplishing our Mission.

These changes are particularly important as we move forward with the establishment of "Families of Parishes" (FOPs) within the Archdiocese. Drawing from the "Playbook", which is a guide to how "FOPs" are to function, it is apparent that we will be better able to collaborate with the other members of our "Family" when all our parishes are structured according to the new model of ministry. (By the way, the other members of our Family are Holy Family Parish in Novi, St. James Parish in Novi, and St Joseph Parish in South Lyon.)

In the past, all parish activities and all parish organizations fell under the umbrella of one or another of four "Commissions" (Worship, Service, Stewardship, or Education), whose work was overseen by the Parish Pastoral Council. The members of these groups, some appointed and some chosen in our annual selection process, would typically meet monthly—except during Christmastime or Easter, or some of the summer months. Over the years these Commissions had various degrees of effectiveness, some being very active and others sometimes wondering what why they were meeting. (No one is thrilled to come to a meeting just to get reports.) In recent years we introduced templates for both the agendas and minutes that certainly helped

make the meetings more efficient and effective, but still there seemed to be some underlying sense that we could be doing even better, be more innovative, and focus the parish efforts toward evangelization more directly.

In any event, COVID pretty much shut the meetings down, although the Service Commission has re-engaged in their activities wherever they could. Still, God can bring blessings even out of a bad situation, and this was one of those occasions. The shutdown allowed us time to consider how to make the structure of the Parish more attuned to our Mission and be more effective. We realized that the Commissions would each benefit from having a small leadership team who had charisms for administration and organization, and a larger number of members who had other charisms to actually accomplish the specific objectives that the leadership established. When people are working out of their charisms (i.e., gifts of the Holy Spirit to the individual, for the building up of the community) they find themselves energized and enthused about accomplishing God's work. (By contrast, when people are asked to do things for which they have no charism, they tend to get frustrated and discouraged.)

In the midst of this introspection, the diocese gave us the "Playbook" for the Families of Parishes. The playbook envisions not "four" but "FIVE" areas of focus for parish ministry. The four commissions will now become five "Teams", and the Parish Council's role will be subsumed into the work of the Parish Finance Council (required under Canon Law) and the work of the Parish Leadership Teams, whose main task is to keep us focused on Mission. Our parish's leadership team I have dubbed my "Pastoral Advisory Team" to make it clear that their role is not to be a super "Council" making decisions for the parish, but rather an advisory team to help keep me, as Pastor, focused on Mission.

As I said, instead of "Worship, Education, Service, and Stewardship" the Playbook published by the Archdiocese is now re-imagining parish life to fit under five Mission <u>Direct</u> "Teams": Discipleship, Engagement, Family Ministries, Worship, and Evangelical Charity. (The Playbook also calls for Mission <u>Support</u> Teams, to assist in parish administration.) What's involved in each of the Mission Direct Teams is detailed on our website and on our Facebook page. (It's easier to see the whole picture in a chart rather than trying to explain it here,

What Is Mammon?

Question: When Jesus says, "You cannot serve both God and mammon," what does he mean? What is mammon?

Answer: When you hear Scripture proclaimed each Sunday, remember it wasn't originally written in English. Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek — these ancient tongues were the original language of our Old and New Testaments. Most of the time, all of the words are translated into our native language. Sometimes, a word or two is left in the original language. Such is the case in this Scripture passage.

Mammon is an ancient Aramaic word referring to money, wealth, or profit. Earthly wealth isn't bad in itself, nor does it automatically exclude us from being a disciple of Jesus. But what dominates our life? To serve money — that is, to seek accumulation of wealth for its own sake and to structure our lives around it — is morally problematic. What good is our wealth if it isn't at the service of others? What good is our wealth if its pursuit leads us to selfishness, obsession, greed, envy, and comparison? There are many things that can be opposed to our service of God — power, prestige, popularity. Ultimately, something in our lives will be our master. But there is only one God worth serving.
