We are well and truly into the summer months, and I suspect that a lot of people have found themselves in “summer mode”, even if they’re not on a “vacation”, *per se*. Perhaps it’s because we remember when we were kids and how much we looked forward to “summer vacation”.

Summer days for some reason always seem so attractive! Perhaps its because the lazy, hot days almost invite us to relax and enjoy. (Also, when it gets humid, it’s hard to think of doing anything very active!) My suggestion to everybody is to make sure you relax and enjoy these days, as a gift from God. Do something that’s a change of pace for you—or even get away for a little while, if you can—but, in any case, take some time to be refreshed. Relax with the Lord. As Jesus told his disciples, “Come by yourselves to an out-of-the-way place and rest a little.” (Mk 6:31) But when the disciples went off to a deserted place, Jesus stayed with them. Similarly, when you relax, make sure you do it *with* the Lord.

Mind, I say, “**relax with**” the Lord, NOT “**get lax with**” the Lord.” For example, structure the times and places where you will be getting to Church each weekend. This is particularly necessary when planning vacations. Regardless of whether you are going out of town or not, you could plan on inviting a friend along with you to Mass to make it especially enjoyable. Then you could plan on enjoying the rest of the Sunday by relaxing with your friends, peacefully, in the Lord.

That’s what Sunday should be anyway: a “Day of Rest”, a day a recreation (re-creation?), not a day for shopping and getting the usual tedious chores done. Taking a hiatus from the usual tedium of our work helps keep us in balance, and healthier, and holier. Perhaps that’s one of the reasons that the Church has, as one of its *precepts* (i.e., *laws*), that Catholics are *obliged* to attend Mass on Sundays and

Holydays of Obligation. The celebration of Mass keeps us connected to the Community of Faith and helps us spend an appropriate amount of time in prayer, both of which are important components of *balance* in the life of the disciple. Our modern world is unarguably *out-of-balance*, and all too many Americans not only lack the balance brought by community and prayer, but are further unbalanced by completely setting aside the 3rd commandment of the *Decalogue* (that's the *Ten Commandments*), which forbids work on the Sabbath:

“Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter...” (Exodus 20: 8-11)

Also, don't get lax with your other ongoing obligations, which includes supporting the Parish according to your ability. You don't stop feeding the kids or neglect mortgage payments just because it's summer! Yet throughout the summer our Parish typically experiences a drop in our offertory collections, in part because, at various times, people are out-of-town. But just as your personal bills and obligations don't take vacations, neither do the Parish bills and obligations! I mentioned that the requirement of Mass attendance is a “precept” of the Church. Supporting the work of the Church is also one of the precepts! The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it this way: “The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to his abilities.” (CCC #2043)

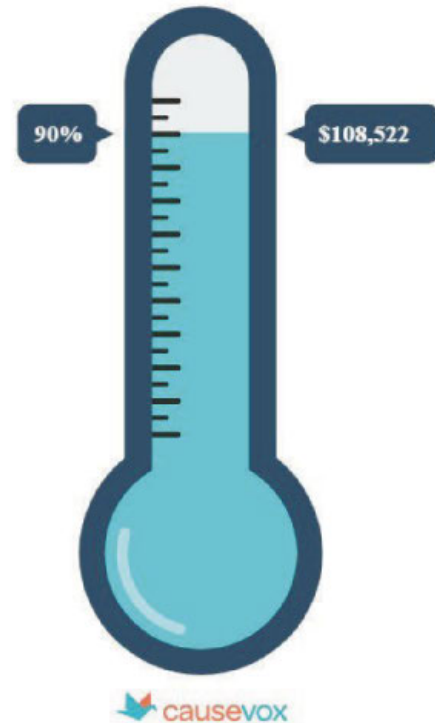

DEACON'S CORNER

"I BEGAN SEARCHING FOR ANSWERS"

It is Jesus, fully present in the Eucharist, who called me into the Church. As a young person, I had never felt like I fully belonged anywhere. This led me to try to "fit in," often in ways that were unhealthy or destructive in hindsight. After longing fruitlessly and ending up in situations that left me wondering why God had created me at all, I began searching for answers.



My first encounter with the mercy of Christ was while I was working at a homeless shelter in California on vacation over Christmas break. I worked alongside a young marine who chose to celebrate his 21st birthday by serving the poor. This was completely different from how most people I knew celebrated this milestone. We handed out toys to children who had very little, and as we ate with the guests, he explained why he had chosen to serve. He introduced me to the sacrificial love of Jesus on the cross.

A short time later, as I continued to search for answers to my questions and try to understand who this Jesus was, my best friend took notice that I had been visiting different churches trying to figure things out on my own. She invited me to Mass at the Newman Center on campus with her the next week. As we arrived, she explained a little bit about why I couldn't receive communion and what to do instead. During Mass, at the elevation of the Eucharist, I had a mystical encounter with Jesus, who told me I was home where I belonged. I entered RCIA that fall, and while there is no end to learning about the faith and growing in relationship with Christ, I was home

What I didn't know, but God did, was that I would lose my father less than a year after that. In

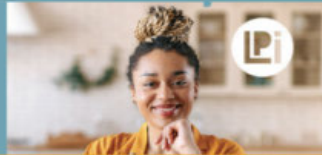
