MEN'S FELLOWSHIP AT CHRIST, OUR LIGHT!

Here is a thought starter from this Sunday's Readings (1/30/22). The Second Reading (1 Cor 12:31 – 13:13) has the familiar verses used at many weddings: "Love is patient, love is kind ... love never fails...."

Re-read the Second Reading out loud -- but in place of the word "love," put "The Father." How does it strike you?

Here is a thought starter using next week's Readings (2/6/22). The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 138:1-8) says, in part, "I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with all my heart, for you have heard the words of my mouth ... When I called, you answered me; you built up strength within me. Your right hand saves me. The Lord will complete what he has done for me; your kindness, O Lord, endures forever; forsake not the work of your hands." To what verse do you relate the most?

... that our archdiocese has a website for its Catholic schools at www.detroitcatholicschools.org?

... that the Archdiocese and its schools offer tuition assistance and scholarship programs to help make a Catholic education possible.?

... that Archdiocesan grade school enrollment is up 11% this year?

... that among the schools experiencing the highest percentage of enrollment increases were St. William in Walled Lake, St. Fabian in Farmington Hills, Holy Cross in Marine City, and Holy Name in Birmingham?

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS



There are 18 students in the eighth grade preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in November of 2022. They meet as two separate classes under the excellent leadership of catechists Elaine Cervera and Marisa Direzze. They are learning and exploring many different facets of their faith this year in many different formats. There are 3-4 sessions during the formation year where the groups combine and get to know each other a little better through prayer, team-building games and exercises, and related activities. This past Monday was one of these Team Activity Days.

One of the initiatives for this year is helping students discover and nurture their God-given talents. This involves prayer and self-reflection. The second part of this exploration is to pray for discernment to enable them to use these God-given talents for the good of others, for God. The day's games and activities centered on this theme. God's gifts of grace come in many forms. Each of you has received a gift in order to serve others. You should use it faithfully. 1 Peter 4:10

The second half of their Team Activity Day was held in church. Students will be reading at Mass as part of their Confirmation requirements. Father has requested this to integrate them into the faith community as young adults. Each student will choose a Sunday Reading to read as a lector. They will be part of the Entry Procession into Mass and carry the Lectionary for Masses. This will be practiced in class with catechists and at home with their families. This past Monday, students practiced at the ambo using the microphone. Students will begin lecturing in February. Please give them some sign of encouragement. Lourdes of the East

Our Lady Of Good Health, Velankanni, India

The church at Velankanni town, located on the coast of Bay of Bengal, is called the 'Lourdes of the East' due to the healing water of the pond where Our Lady appeared a couple of times. The Church was built in the mid-16th century and is probably one of the most-visited churches in India. The Church is dedicated to the 'Lady of Health,' also known as 'Our Lady of Velankanni.'

Apparition of Our Lady



To a Shepherd: Approximately 400 years ago, a shepherd boy from Velankanni found a lady holding a child in her arms while he was resting next to the pond on his way to sell milk. The Lady asked him for some milk from his pot for her child. When he reached the place to sell, he expected a shortage of milk, since he gave some milk to the lady, but when the lid was lifted the pot was brimming over with milk. The Christians around believed this was a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary with the Child Jesus.

To the Buttermilk Vendor: At the close of the 16th century, a boy who was physically impaired and selling buttermilk found a Lady standing, holding a baby in her arms. The Lady asked him for a cup of buttermilk for the child and he gave. The boy was healed of his disability and walked to meet a man to whom the lady had expressed the desire for him to build a chapel at Velankanni.



The Portuguese Ship caught in a Storm: In the 17th century a Portuguese merchant vessel sailing to Colombo was caught in a violent storm. The helpless sailors prayed for rescue. The ship got to shore at Velankanni and, as a thanksgiving, they remodeled the thatched chapel.

Cultural Influence

Holy Mass is celebrated at the basilica in eight different languages. A chariot procession, accompanied with rosary and hymns, is conducted every Saturday and on the first Friday of the month. Pilgrims take a dip in the sea, tonsure their heads, and walk to the church on their knees or roll up to the shrine as a part of their ritual. The pilgrims offer the replicas of the afflicted body part in the church and pray to the Lady of Health for its recovery.
