## Reflections on Families of Parishes

*Part 4: I Don't Want to Get Out of the Boat  
Through the sea was your way; your path,  
through the mighty waters,  
though your footsteps were unseen.*

Psalm 77:20

We have all heard the Archbishop telling us that to make so bold a move as we are making will require us to get out of the boat, a reference to Peter having the courage to step out of the boat and come to Jesus by walking on the tumultuous Sea of Galilee during a storm.

Everyone in the presbyterate has stepped out of the boat at one time or another in their life. Indeed, the reception of Holy Orders itself requires one to do so. There is no reason to question if we priests of the Archdiocese of Detroit are willing to step out of the boat; clearly, we are willing to do so when it is required of us.

But we also have the freedom to choose *when* we are willing to step out of the boat do we not? After all, there were 11 apostles who never left the boat despite what Peter felt called to do. At some point, they would be called to their own "stepping out of the boat" moments in their ministry. Most would even give their lives for the faith. But they didn't feel inclined to join Peter on this one.

Some will say that Families of Parishes is not something that merits stepping out of the boat for, so why don't I just stay put and let Peter do what Peter feels called to do? This is a position that has some merit. All of us are connected to the Holy Spirit in our prayer lives are we not? Perhaps we don't feel his promptings in the same way as others.

So, let us dig a little bit deeper into Mathew's account of Peter stepping out of the boat, much like we are all called to do every time we preach.

First, notice that in Matthew 14:22 we read that Jesus made all the disciples get *into* the boat. In fact, Mark uses the same expression in his telling of the story of Jesus walking on water. Jesus knew that this was something that they all needed to

During this week we find Jesus suffering to death on the cross. The week begins with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. There are many of His faithful followers in Jerusalem for the celebration of the Passover. They greet Him with the word from Psalm 118, "Hosanna". The joyful preparation is marred by the chief priests and scribes plotting to put Jesus to Death. They accuse Him of perverting the nation by attracting large crowds. They claim He was forbidding people

experience, as there was a lesson to be learned and to be handed on for all of time. And so, he made them get *into* the boat.

Next, notice that Jesus did not come to them until the fourth watch. He had sent them out in the evening but did not come to them until sometime between 3 AM and 6 AM. How long were they in this storm? It must have been quite scary for all of the apostles. Perhaps they questioned to themselves or perhaps even openly to each other, "Why did he do this to us? Why did he send us into this storm but stay safe and sound on land himself?"

Notice as well that the storm only ended when Jesus brought Peter back to the boat and they both got into it. Were the other apostles then grateful to Peter for doing what he did?

The reality of this great Gospel passage is that it was Jesus who pushed them into this most difficult circumstance, not Peter, because there was something more important at play that only Jesus understood. And it was Peter's willingness to step out of the boat that ended up bringing calm and relief to everyone else.

The Archbishop has stepped out of the boat for us. We will all benefit from his doing so, whether we understand it or not. In the same way, we must be willing to step out of the boat for the lay faithful.

### Reflection: Matthew 14:22-33

Then he made the disciples get into the boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them, walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear.

At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how [strong] the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!"

Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, "Oh you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God."

Have a prayer-filled week and a grace-filled Lent,

to pay tribute to Caesar in order to get the attention of the Romans who had the power to put Him to death. Jesus is accused of blasphemy because He said He was the Son of God.

The Gospel of Mark tells the story. On Good Friday, the day of our salvation, we hear the story from the Gospel of John. Let us spend this Holy Week in prayer as we unite with those who are suffering in our world today, and reflect on the suffering of Jesus which leads to His Resurrection.



### Scripture Lesson Mark 14:1-15:47

#### Join our pain with Jesus'

This Gospel reading tells of Jesus' suffering and death on the cross. Remembering Jesus' suffering is not something we do just once a year. The more often we remember, the more it will help us recall that Jesus was human too, and experienced what we feel—and so much more. If we offer Him our suffering and remember His, it makes our pain easier to bear.



Every day our frustrations, our fears, our loneliness and temptations can become ways in which we share in the suffering and death of Christ. Likewise, our joys, our good health, our family and friends are all important way to share in the joy of His Resurrection. The point is to offer everything to Christ.

What can a parent do? Suffering is part of life. Yet, disciples of Jesus can have the same attitude toward suffering as He did, and we can also share in His joy of the Resurrection. When children are hurt, sad or scared, help them remember to turn to Jesus because He wants to comfort them with His great love.

## Coming Home to Hope: General Dispensation Expiration Guidelines

The general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is being reinstated in the AOD effective **March 13, 2021.**

### The following are Specific Cases Where the Dispensation Still Applies:

- You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- You exhibit flu-like symptoms. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
- You are pregnant.
- Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
- You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirm, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity)).
- If you have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

Those within these above categories you must still observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an excellent way to do this is through participating in a broadcast of the Sunday Mass.

It is with great joy that I tell you we will have our first meeting on April 12, 2021 at 12:30 in the Father Welch Hall. Things will be a little different.



\*There is no food allowed yet, however you may bring a drink in a closed container \*

HOW DID HE DO IT? REFLECTIONS ON FATHER MICHAEL COONEY**

During the 30 years that Father Cooney was our Pastor, many of us may have silently asked, "How does he do it?", realizing all that Father Mike had on his mind day-in-and-day-out. Whether you have been a parishioner for many years or are new like me, we have all had the opportunity to see Father Mike in his ministry. Looking back at a few excerpts of Father Cooney's letters in the church bulletins, perhaps we can get a glimpse of how Father Mike dealt with the daily pressures of being a Pastor.



August 5th, 1990 – Father Cooney's first letter in "The Ledger" of SAINT PETER IN CHAINS CATHOLIC CHURCH, Father Cooney wrote, {in part} "I ask for your prayers, your guidance, and your support as together we begin the future. Please be assured of mine for you and yours, on both sides of Eternity."


February 20, 2000 – Ten years later – "This past week, Charles Schultz, the creator of the Peanuts comic strip, died. Many people have commented that the timing of his death was poignant. He finished his job, and he went home quietly as he said goodbye in his comic strip. There are three things to be learned from Mr. Schultz's life and his cast of characters. Each one of us, even if our lives are very public, are private individuals. Most of our lives are lived out in a day to day basis, far away from the harsh lights of public scrutiny and evaluation. It is in our private lives that we dream, hope and love. Most of these things people will never know until after we have returned home to the Father. Each one of us is like a beautiful jewel with many facets. Finally, we only go home when our job is done. When we finish, we put down the brush we used to create, paint and make our lives come alive. It is only then that our final goodbye is heard and understood just as the final Peanuts comic strip was read and understood in a different way. The lessons are what lives on even when the comic strip goes into reruns."

November 29, 2020 – Father Cooney's final letter. "Years ago, when I was a child, I remember a song sung by Bing Crosby about falling asleep, counting your blessings. For several years, I have had a tough time falling asleep. I cannot stop my mind from running about a lot of things. When I thought about this song, I began to think about some of the blessings I have. Perhaps you should think about them also."

Dear readers, I feel a bit guilty, if not cruel, to take mere excerpts from the beautiful letters which Father Cooney shared with us over the years. I hope you understand the intent of this article which attempts to demonstrate how such a complex mind which Father Mike had, could use simple things to quiet his busy mind. Even if just for a few years, we were blessed to have shared the life and ministry of Father Michael N. Cooney.



Feast Day – March 29  
Died circa 1195**



**Not much is known about this hermit who is considered by some historians to be the founder of the order of Carmelite friars.**

**Various legends had him born in Limoges, France, educated at the University of Paris, and participating in the Crusades in Turkey. What is known is that he directed a group of Frankish hermits living on Mount Carmel in Palestine in the second half of the 12th century. The existence on Mount Carmel of a church and hermitage in the spiritual tradition of the prophet Elijah is documented from 1163 on. After Berthold's death, the hermits were led by another Frenchman, St. Brocard; Carmelite houses became well-established throughout Europe by 1300.**


