Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever . . . "Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me . . . whoever believes has eternal life."

John 6: 41-51

Gospel Connection

From time immemorial bread has been the "staff of life," the basic and most important food in everyone's diet. To the "murmuring" Jews ("murmuring" as their ancestors did in the desert), Jesus tries to help them see the deeper meaning of his claim to be "bread come down from heaven." Christ is the "bread of heaven" that transcends this experience of life to the life of God. Christ the bread is the love, justice and compassion of God incarnate; God, our "Father," is revealed in him.

The operative verbs in today's Gospel are "believe" and "trust": God provides for and sustains our faith in his gift of Jesus the Bread of life in the same way that First Testament wisdom nourished all who paid heed.

Gospel Reflection

Manna is the manifestation of God in our midst. Manna is generosity and kindness, consolation and support, the constant, unconditional love of family and friends. Manna is food for our own journeys to God.

God sends us manna in many forms every day of our lives; the challenge of faith is to trust in God enough to look for manna, to collect it before it disappears, and to consume it and be consumed by it. As Jesus the "Bread of life" gave "life" to the world through his selfless


compassion and humble servanthood to others, we, too, can give “life to the world” when we look beyond our own needs and security to the good of others, giving not from our treasure but from our poverty, nourishing one another in the love, compassion and selflessness of the Gospel Jesus.

To receive the Eucharist worthily, we must allow ourselves not only to consume but to **be consumed** by the life and love of God.

To his Jewish hearers, Jesus’ most astounding and revolutionary teaching is that God, Creator and Lord of all life, is our **Father**: God is not a mysterious cosmic tyrant to be feared but the loving Giver of life whom we can approach in confidence. The boundaries and differences that separate people are eclipsed by the realization that every man and woman share the same humanity, becoming one human family under the Fatherhood of God

I know when I was discerning if I was going to enter the seminary a parishioner at the parish I was attending turned to me after Mass one day and asked if I had ever considered the priesthood. I was at the time, and her encouragement was one of the things that encouraged me to join seminary. We do not do this to push people into it, but rather to encourage people to consider their vocation in Christ.

There is a phrase that I have come to understand to be true: scatter the shepherds, scatter the sheep. The devil wants nothing more than the destruction of the priests. He wants Christ’s priests to fall. Therefore, we need to pray daily for our priests, for the priests and bishops of the Church, that they may be strengthened by the Holy Spirit in living out their vocation in Christ. Once again, in honor of St. John Vianney, the patron of parish priests, please pray this week that more will be open to discerning their vocation to the priesthood and for our parish priests. To pray that they, like all of you, may grow daily in holiness and their love for Jesus Christ.





Christian Stewardship: A Way of Life

Putting the Eucharist into Action: A Disciple's Response

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus proclaiming that he is "the bread of life." He then offers an invitation to come to Him. It is an invitation to live the Eucharistic life in Christ.

We live in anxious times. Even while regularly celebrating the joy of the Eucharist, we remain mindful of the pain and suffering in our world. In such a troubled world, we often question how we can respond to the daily challenges and opportunities laid out before us with a sense of gratitude, joy and confidence, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. We may wonder how we can put the Eucharist into action every day.

The answer is to embrace a better understanding of our lives as Catholic stewards and missionary disciples. The mystery of the Eucharist celebrates change. We rejoice in God the Father, transforming His Son's suffering and death into the victory of new life and resurrection. We celebrate transformation as our gifts of bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of our Lord. The whole Catholic life of stewardship and missionary discipleship gives us reason to hope and work for change in ourselves, in the Church and in our world.

Stewardship always involves conversion; a change of mind and heart, something that cannot be expressed in one single action, but in a whole way of living. Stewardship offers us a way to re-focus our energy and provides an opportunity to face today's challenges.

The re-discovery of stewardship as an ancient New Testament teaching is one of the good news stories in our Catholic life of faith. Catholics in increasing numbers are being introduced to the message of stewardship and discipleship.

At St. Peter Parish we know what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. As Saint Paul writes: "We are servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God" (1 Cor. 4:1).

As stewards, we understand that a grace-filled potential dwells within each of us that is constantly open to conversion and responsive to the love of God. Also within every human heart, the mystery of God lays dormant, waiting to be awakened by our words, our example or our actions.

As individuals, we have power we do not realize. Even our generous acts have power. Like the poor widow whom Jesus esteemed for placing two seemingly insignificant coins in the temple offertory, we have the power to build our community of faith through our generosity. Today, the witness of this power is most evident in those communities of faith that profess and practice stewardship.

What we learn from Christian stewardship is that we have an openness to change and respond to let ourselves be new persons. As stewards, we recognize that all is gift, all is grace, and all things manifest the mystery of God's presence. Once we come to this conclusion, then we are more fully able to live the rest of our days in gratitude by celebrating and becoming Eucharistic people. Our work of stewardship is ultimately our way of saying thanks to God; our way of putting the Eucharist into action.

What's New on New Street


At times in July, the rain was pounding down on the SVdP volunteers as we went about our ministry. But, one of the highlights of the month was that Father Christopher regularly stopped by our distribution center (the garage) on his way to the administration building. We've been fortunate to have him lead us in prayer on a few days too. Welcome, Father Christopher!



Despite the inclement weather and heat, we provided food for 240 families in July. Vouchers to the SVdP store in Utica were given to four families and hygiene/household items to 81 families. Lodging, rent and utility payments accounted for expenses for eight families. Transportation costs associated with bus tickets, gas vouchers, vehicle registrations and a car repair were expensed for 29 individuals. All totaled, the pantry provided assistance to 1,055 individuals in July in the amount of \$2,895 (not including food expenditures).

St. Peter Catholic Church Mission Statement includes: "to reach out to the community joyfully as living symbols of God's presence in Mount Clemens." The support the pantry receives from the parishioners, families of St. Mary School, the religious education families, as well as from the parish staffs is testament that we live up to our intentions.






