



Dear Parishioners,

This past Sunday, Archbishop Vigneron announced my appointment as Moderator of the Central Macomb Family of Parishes #1 consisting of St. Hubert, St. Louis, San Francesco and of course, our flagship parish here at St. Peter. This appointment will become effective 1 July 2022. While this new assignment will place additional responsibility upon me for oversight and coordination of the four parishes of our new family, with the assistance of the family pastors at St. Hubert and San Francesco, I expect very little to change in the manner in which we carry out the day to day operation of our parish.

In sharp contrast to the false and scandalous allegations being asserted by certain so-called Catholic online media (which are not sanctioned by either the Archdiocese of Detroit or by the Universal Church and are anything but Catholic), Family of Parishes is a program to consolidate our dwindling number of priests so that they can be ever more committed to helping each other carry out their sacred mission for each of you. The alternative to the establishment of family of parishes was to either merge parishes into so-called clusters which almost always results in the elimination of parish identity or outright closure of one or more parishes and the absorption of its assets or worse still, mass parish closures. To his great credit, our Archbishop did not want to go down either of these bleak roads. The blunt reality is that fewer men have answered God's call to priesthood and things are going to get substantially worse before they get any better. When one takes into account anticipated retirements and with so few men studying for the priesthood in Detroit (zero ordinations to the priesthood this year) our archdiocese is projected to lose well over 100 priests in the next decade. This is a stark metric – over a third of our priests gone. The obvious value brought to the table by Family of Parishes is that the parishes keep their identity and remain open. All of us have seen the pain inflicted when the Church has been compelled to close a parish and that is what our archbishop has spared us from.

So, the great news is that St. Peter is the flagship of this new family of parishes. All member-parishes of our family will begin to cooperate with each other to augment services the others might not have. Our financial resources remain ours. Your contributions go to St. Peter Parish and St. Mary School. However, our priests, our religious education programs, and our administrative services will, as time goes on, act in mutual support of the various services offered by (or not existing within) each parish within the family. Now do not think for a moment that there won't be a few growing pains in all of this but if the priests act as a team, this should be seamless. I will remain your Pastor and will also serve as the moderator of this new team of parish priests. Between January and July there will be various meetings, retreats and seminars I will be attending and other evolutions in which our parish staff will be involved to get us ready. Likewise, there will be informational gatherings during which you will be able to get your questions answered. Of course, I am always here for you – so we can chat any time.

Clergy Assignment Announcement from Archbishop Vigneron Sunday, November 7, 2021

Reverend John A. Maksym, appointed Moderator of the In Solidum team of priests who, with the other priests of the team, will lead the newly formed Central Macomb Vicariate Family 1 (San Francesco Parish, Clinton Township; St. Hubert Parish, Harrison Township; St. Louis Parish, Clinton Township; St. Peter Parish, Mount Clemens), effective July 1, 2022. Father Maksym currently serves as Pastor of St. Peter Parish, Mount Clemens.

Next week I will be writing to you about a Christmas tree lighting extravaganza we are planning for late Advent which will remind Mt. Clemens and the surrounding area that St. Peter Parish and St. Mary School are still very much a part of life in this region. Stay tuned for news!

Hello and happy Sunday!

I pray everyone is doing well. This past week (Nov. 7-13) was National Vocation Awareness week. God created all of us with a universal vocation for holiness. This is our primary vocation. This is why we must be people rooted in prayer and the sacraments (primarily the Eucharist and reconciliation). Our particular or secondary vocation is one that is revealed to us through prayer and discernment. Often our society gets vocation and profession confused. A profession is what we do and a vocation is who we are, it is who God has created us to be.

God is calling many in our parish community to the sacrament and vocation of Marriage. This vocation to married life must be prayed about and discerned and not one that just becomes the default. If a vocation is who God created us to be, then we must ask Him to reveal to us what that vocation is.

As many in the parish are being called to the vocation of Marriage, so there are those in our parish community who are being called to be priests of Christ Jesus. This is a joyful, beautiful, and heroic vocation. Sadly the world often tells these men that it is not a vocation worth discerning. It can be easy to just say “I will let the next guy become a priest.” When I was growing up my great uncle was a priest, Fr. Francis Burns. He was always around to answer my questions and I saw the great joy he had being a priest. I was an altar server, but I did not go to Catholic school. I attended Religious Ed. On Sundays I was ‘very holy’, but during the week I did my own thing and do not recall praying much outside of Sunday and meals.

My life changed however when I started to ask God if any of this made sense. As a senior in High School, I was questioning if I believed my Catholic faith. This moment changed my life. God started to reveal Himself to me in clear and powerful ways because I finally gave Him permission to do so. I went to college and started to engage and dive into our faith and this is the turning point. I stopped telling God what I wanted out of life and started to ask Him what He wanted for my life. At this time I also began to ask God what vocation He was calling me to.

I did not become a priest overnight. God called me out of a great relationship with a wonderful young lady (who ended up marrying one of my best friends and I stood up in their wedding) to discern my vocation. God had me wait to pursue seminary when I wanted to enter a year earlier. Many of my friends were getting married and I was still in school (once in seminary). The pursuit and discernment of a vocation to the priesthood is not an easy road. It is filled with moments of struggle, discouragement and doubt. This is why it is so important that we as the Church pray for men who are discerning a vocation to the priesthood. The devil is not happy with them discerning this vocation and will do all he can to discourage and derail them. We must pray daily for them to have strength and fortitude. We also must pray that the Lord may call heroic men to give their lives in order that they might bring the sacraments to others and that they might hear this call clearly.

Another thing we can do to encourage vocations to the priesthood is to encourage men to be priests. Parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, and parishioners, please do not underestimate the power and influence of encouragement. Please encourage the young men around you to consider a calling to the priesthood. It starts with considering it. Many young men think that if they say it out loud or consider it then they will be pressured into it. This is not the case from the diocese or Fr. John and myself. We should never pressure someone to a vocation, but we do need to encourage. This can begin with us saying, “Have you ever considered being a priest?” or “I think you would make a great priest.” We do not want to tell someone that we know they are to be a priest, we are not God and can not say this definitively, but we can invite them to consider this vocation.

As this week dedicated to vocations to the priesthood draws to a close, I invite once again for us as a parish community to pray daily for laborers for the harvest. That young men from our parish community and diocese will heed the call of Christ to be open and pursue their vocation to the priesthood.





INTERCESSORY PRAYER ~ Thoughts on praying for others and being prayed for. During Mass, we share in the Prayers of the Faithful. We put forth our intentions for those whom we desire healing, comfort, safety, etc. But how about prayer during our daily lives? Prayer is of course, a way of life for a Christian Catholic whether we pray the Rosary, visit Jesus in Adoration or merely express an intention to Jesus or a Saint for others – or even for ourselves. Following are a couple examples that may seem trivial, but nonetheless were answered prayers.

One day I was gardening for a customer (God rest her soul) who was a very devout Catholic and a member of our Parish. I was working in a bed of Pachysandra which is a very dense ground cover. I realized I had lost my keys. As I was searching for them my customer asked me what I was doing. I told her I was searching for my keys. After my efforts failed, I went to the local hardware store and bought the biggest magnet they had. I went back to the area and still no success. I finally gave up. My customer came back outside and again said, “What are you doing?” I told her I had lost my keys. She said, ‘Look here.’ I told her I already looked there. She told me to look again. I found my keys! I asked her how she knew. She told me she had prayed to St. Anthony. Since I very often misplace items, I have prayed to St. Anthony many times, always with the calming reply to relax, followed by a silent voice, “look here”. Recently, while at work, I again lost my keys. In my fervor, I forgot to pray to St. Anthony. My co-worker, Debbie, asked me where I had been last. I told her I was in the ‘back 40’ in the mud. I thought Debbie was looking for my keys but she was not searching-she was praying that my keys would be found. Suddenly that small voice told me where to look-the search was over! Thanks be to God! Now I am praying for Debbie’s recovery from back surgery. It’s what we do as Catholics, isn’t it?

Praying for others is of course a very serious blessing in the Church. Two years ago, I interviewed Jamie Wormsbacher who leads the St. Peter Prayer Chain. This important ministry is featured in our weekly bulletin. I asked Jamie if she could share any ‘success stories’ [my words]. With great enthusiasm, she replied, “Yes! We receive Praise Reports.”

Whether praying for lost items or for healing of bodies or relationships, we can pray with great faith and confidence that our prayers do not go unheeded.

“God knows our needs and prayers before we even ask. We have to be open to God’s healing or direction of our prayers. It is God’s plan and timeline, not ours. He may be preparing us for a blessing, or strength to weather the storm. Always know that we are loved, and every prayer is heard.” - Jamie Wormsbacher, Prayer Warrior.



Master Gardeners Partner with Teens

Along with the vegetables, a unique collaboration between youth and experienced Master Gardeners is thriving at the **St. Peter Charity Garden** in Clinton Township. Horticulture students from the Pankow School in the L'Anse Creuse School District provide manpower in exchange for community service hours needed for graduation and a chance to learn gardening from experts.

"It's beneficial to both sides," said **Master Gardener Vicki Jastrzebski**, who manages the garden that supplies fresh produce to several local food banks. "We always wanted this to be a teaching garden. There is so much to learn here."

Pankow students visit **St. Peter Charity Garden** three times weekly in fall and spring in a curriculum that addresses planting, harvesting, companion planting, trap cropping, integrated pest management, composting, garden diseases, food preservation, seed saving and other topics.

On a recent morning in September, **Master Gardener Lori Ches** instructed teens at the garden on how to know when cantaloupe and other melons were ripe enough to pick. They discussed the color of the fruit, stem color, how firmly the stem is attached, death of the vine and field spots. Lori, one of three co-managers at **St. Peter Charity Garden**, showed them that rubber mats can be placed under the melons to keep ants off and to prevent rotting when the weather has been extremely wet. Students were shown how plastic milk crates can protect the melons and keep critters from gnawing them. Finally, the teens had a chance to handle the melons and diagnose their readiness to harvest. They also picked green beans, peppers, tomatoes and squash, which were weighed, recorded and loaded for delivery to food pantries.



Master Gardener volunteers meet frequently to fine-tune the partnership with Pankow horticulture and food science teacher Shirley Tautolo, who has successfully solicited grants from the Future Famers Association. The grant money funds the service learning project and has also purchased items for the garden. Concepts introduced in the garden are often further explored back in the school classroom. For example, a sample of a diseased green pepper may be brought to school where students will continue to research the problem. The horticulture program has a greenhouse, dehydrators and freeze-drying equipment. Students harvest herbs which they dehydrate and then create seasoning mixes for the food bank. They also have done flower arranging for parties and weddings. Pankow School offers Career Technical Education (CTE) programs, along with math, science and performing arts.

Senior Kristy T. said she enjoys learning about beneficial garden insects and using companion plants and trap crops to keep pests from destroying important vegetables. She credits the Master Gardeners at **St. Peter Charity Garden** with awakening her desire to pursue study in entomology and horticulture.

After working inside the school greenhouse, Senior Shianne C. said she appreciates the "real outdoor action" at **St. Peter Charity Garden**. The Master Gardeners are good at explaining about diseases of the vegetables, she noted, along with tips on managing animal's intent on eating crops.

According to **Linda Simpson, Master Gardener** and another garden co-manager, the partnership with Pankow school helps the students feel useful, responsible, accountable and self-reliant. They learn to serve others, and hopefully will carry on the mission behind the **St. Peter Charity Garden**, she said. She noted that several other schools bring students of all ages to the garden for educational field trips. The Master Gardeners have also worked with adults who have physical limitations or learning disabilities.

"Our goal is not just to feed the poor—it's also to educate the community," Linda observed. "This is what Master Gardening and Extension is all about: serving the community. Passion is catchy. We want to get them on that passion band wagon."






