Hello and Merry Christmas!

We as a Christian community have been praying and preparing for four weeks for this amazing weekend, the time of year when we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. One of my favorite things about Christmas is the time I get to spend with my family, biological and spiritual. As many of you know, I come from a big family and it is not everyday that all of us get to be together and when we do it is a treasured time for me. I feel the same way about celebrating Christmas as a priest. At Christmas, many of our parish family (college students, those who grew up here and have moved away), come home to celebrate the birth of Christ. How fitting that at the birth of Christ, Joseph had to travel home for the census. He went back to where he was from and now all of us come back and gather as a spiritual family, as the body of Christ to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

This year we have a unique liturgical cycle where we had an entire fourth week of Advent and Christmas and Sunday are a day apart. Why is this interesting? On the first Sunday after Christmas, we celebrate the Holy Family (Jesus, Mary and Joseph) which this year is the very next day. As I prayed on this and pondered it, I realized that it is fitting for us since the Holy Family and the birth of Christ are so closely connected. Jesus the Son of God broke into our lowly humanity in the same way we did. He was born into a family, to a mother and father, just as we were. The family was the vehicle through which Christ entered the world for our salvation.

In seminary for my capstone presentation I spoke about the importance of the domestic Church, the family. The family is where the seeds of faith are planted, watered, and nourished. I often tell couples preparing for marriage that one of my favorite things is watching my friends and family learn to become parents. I enjoy watching them teach their children about Christ and the amazingly insightful questions that children come up with.

On this Sunday where we celebrate the birth of Christ and the Holy Family I want to ask all of you for your prayers for families. Let us pray for the family we came from, to pray for our families and to pray for the family of faith, the community of St. Peter. The family is the first source and experience we have of God's love. Family is so very important. Again the family is where we receive our first experience of God. I encourage us to not forget the family's importance and you parents, not to forget the important role and privilege God has called you to, to be the first teachers of love and faith for your children. Like St. Monica, never cease to pray for your children. Never cease to invite your children to Christ. We also can't forget that we cannot give what we do not have. Let us all be encouraged by the Holy Family this weekend to draw close to the Christ Child that we might sit before Him and adore Him and receive from Him in a new and particular way the grace we need to draw others (our families) close to Him as He draws us to Himself.

May God continue to bless you and your families this Christmas season with the love and closeness of His Son.



Must be registered three (3) months before you can set Baptismal date. Baptisms will be on the 1st Sunday of each month at 1:30 in the afternoon.

1st COMMUNION or CONFIRMATION

Must be in the Religious Education Program for two (2) years before you can make your First Communion or Confirmation.
