

#### Hello and happy Sunday!

As is the case for many of us, life gets busy, hectic and we seem to always be moving from one thing to the next. In my life, I have come to realize the importance of stopping once in a while and admiring God's handy work and the beauty expressed in the complexity of the universe. In every moment, God is willing us and the universe into existence and is always creating; new moments, new things and most importantly, new people. The complexity of the human body and the human person (body, soul, personality, etc.) truly is a miracle. This miracle begins at the moment of conception when God infuses a soul and a particular and unique person is created by God. One of the most amazing things is that we have been created in the likeness and image of God and therefore we reflect God's beauty and glory to each other. By being made in the likeness and image of God, all people (human beings old and young, born and unborn) have dignity and the dignity of human life must always be respected, upheld, and fought for.

As Christians, we all must work together to promote life and to protect the dignity of every human person. In our current culture, it seems on many levels the dignity of the person is challenged or presented as open to opinion.

It must be said that all people deserve respect no matter the color of their skin, their gender, place of origin, age, or stage of life. We must also state clearly that there are objective truths. There are things that are right and things that are wrong. There are things that are vices (sins) and other things that are virtues. The world wants to say that all things are ok and permitted as long as it is what you believe and this is just not true. Some things are open to opinion while others things are not, especially with regard to moral issues. It is true there are gray areas with moral issues, but for most, they are not open to our personal opinions. Rather they are fundamentally right or wrong. This is the case with the issue of abortion.

Abortion is the intentional killing of a human life. Again life begins at conception. The baby in the mother's womb is not a clump of cells, but rather a unique individual. The sin of abortion since the Supreme Court case Roe vs. Wade (Jan 22, 1973) has taken the lives of more than 62 million children in this country. This is horrific and staggering and must end. I know abortion has effected the lives of many and for some of you in a very personal way. To those who have had an abortion, I would like say, God loves you. You are not beyond forgiveness, healing or God's mercy. Having an abortion is a grave matter, a mortal sin, and God longs to bring you healing. The day you had an abortion you lost a child and with the loss of any child by a parent, there is grieving, sadness, and long lasting effects. I know this decision was not an easy one and included many factors and I pray you experience God's love, mercy and forgiveness.

As Christians, we are all called to fight for the respect of life, not certain lives or groups of lives (races, genders, ethnicities), but for all lives. Remember that all lives matter, the born and the unborn, the young and the elderly, the healthy and the infirm. Speaking out (with love and truth) on the dignity of life and abortion is our Christian duty. It is most important when we stand up for the dignity of life, that we acknowledge that all of us are sinners and in need of redemption and repentance in Christ. Continued on page 2.





Sadly, I have seen from many who speak out on this issue, do so not from a place of love or compassion, but rather with malice and harsh judgment. As I mentioned, we judge harshly the sin, but need to offer compassion and love to the sinner and meet them where they are as they move to deeper understanding.

The acceptance of the sin of abortion by our culture, needs to end. This comes about first when we allow Christ to change and convict our own hearts and help us to remember that abortion is always wrong and is the intentional ending of an innocent life. When we accept that life begins at conception and all lives matter and teach this to our children, then we can start to change our culture. I pray and ask as a community of faith that we pray this week particularly for those who have had an abortion, that they may find healing in Christ and that this sin may end in our country. We also pray that those who have been affected by abortion may turn back to Christ and the mercy and healing He longs to bring as our Divine Physician.

As we fight for change in our culture, to move from one that promotes sin and death to one that upholds the dignity of life and virtue, let us not lose heart in this battle. Rather, let us continue to entrust this fight and battle to the guidance and protection of Our Lady the patroness of our Country. That she may guide us forward in love.







#### Dear Readers,

After Fr. Maksym's Christmas Eve Homily about "A Charlie Brown Christmas", featuring Linus dropping his security blanket inspired me to write my last article about Linus reciting Luke 2, 8-14 and dropping his security blanket with the words, "... do not be afraid", I found this letter from our late Pastor, Fr. Mike Cooney. It is about Charles Schultz, the creator of the Peanuts cartoon series.

THE LEDGER, February 20, 2000: My dear friends, This past week Charles Schulz, the creator of the Peanuts comic strip died. Many of us grew up with Charlie Brown, Linus, Lucy and all the other characters who Mr. Schulz brought to life. Much has been written about Schulz's death, especially the fact that he died the night before his last comic strip was to be printed. Many people have commented that the timing of his death was poignant. He finished his job, and he went home quietly as he said goodbye in his comic strip. I for one shall miss the adventures of characters who have become my friend over the years of my life.

There are three things to be learned from Mr. Schulz's life and his cast of characters. Each one of us, even if our lives are very public, are really private individuals. Most of our lives are lived out in a day-to-day basis far away from the harsh lights of public scrutiny and evaluation. It is in our private lives that we dream, hope and love. Most of these things people will never know until we have returned home to be to the Father.

Each one of us is like a beautiful jewel with many facets. Each one of the Peanut characters had their own defined personalities. Each one of those characters is really a part of each person. We are all Charlie Brown, Linus, Snoopy and the others all rolled up into the one creation who we are. It is important to remember that when we go through different emotions and adventures in our lives.

Finally, we only go home when our job is done. God does not call us until our product, our lives are completed. We may not realize that when a loved one passes, or we face death, but it is true. When we finish, we put down the brush we used to create, paint, and make our lives come alive. It is only then that our final goodbye is heard and understood just as the final Peanuts comic strip was read and understood in a different way.

I know that many will feel that I am being morbid in this article. I really am not. I am just trying to understand and keep yet another lesson Charles Schulz tried to share with all of us through his beloved extended family of Peanuts. The lessons are what lives on even when the comic strip goes into reruns.


