

#### **Ignorance of Scripture Is Ignorance of Christ**

As Father Dale likes to point out often and as our colors at Mass highlight, we are still in Ordinary time. Lent and Advent are times for extra prayer and new practices to renew us. Easter and Christmas are times to recognize what God has done with outward celebration. What is Ordinary time for then? At Mass, Father Dale reminds us it is the time to deepen our understanding of the Faith and the person in the middle of it: God. Right at the top of the list of easy ways to get to know God is reading Scripture. Many people have told me they don't read Scripture for a whole list of reasons, and some have a bit of validity, but nonetheless, the Church strongly encourages us to know the Word God. By that I mean both Jesus, Who is the Word, and Sacred Scripture. Saint Jerome says in his prologue to the book of Isaiah, "Ignorance of Scripture is Ignorance of Christ!" The Church highlights this by making the Scriptures a highlight point of the Mass, even if it is not THE highlight, which is the Eucharist. If Scripture is so important, each Catholic is faced with a question. Do I know the Word of God well enough?

One of the most credible complaints I have heard is that when people were in Catechism as kids they heard their teacher (who almost inevitably was a nun) command them not to read the Bible. The explanation the teacher would give was that for x or y reason, children (or sometimes lay people) would not understand the Bible. In our "information age" this can sound outdated or like an attempt to control people. I would agree that this was an attempt to "control" children by keeping them safe because the Bible is filled with graphic and confusing realities that are difficult to understand. It is a burden to know about the gruesome history of humanity, and the Bible hides nothing. So I would agree that kids should not just pick up any Bible and read, but they should have the truths of the Bible and stories given to them in an age appropriate manner. Knowledge is an incredible gift, but it is a burden that can weigh too heavily on someone who is not prepared for it and even cause psychological difficulties when it is excessive or traumatic.

That is not the case for mature adults. As members of the body of Christ, we should know everything we could possibly know about our God Who loves us and we should know His words. Sacred Scripture, in both the Old and New Testaments, is a direct connection between us and God. It is ultimately a love letter. If someone lost their parents, but had one last lovingly written letter to remember them by, we can be certain that after reading it countless times it would be ingrained in their minds and hearts. Of course, Jesus is still with us in the Sacraments and our hearts, we will see Him again, and the Bible is a bit larger than a love letter. Nevertheless, the Bible should be as precious to us as a love letter because God wrote it with so much care and concern for our sake. The whole thing is an intentional communication to His most precious children for whom He gave His Son. We are without excuse if we come to the final judgement and have to admit that we did not spend "enough" time trying to know the most important person in the universe.

What is enough time? Is going to Mass and hearing the Bible there enough or do we need to have it memorized? I do not know. I cannot, nor can anyone else, tell you exactly what is enough time reading the Bible for you because each person has their own responsibilities and needs. One question that may help is when we look at our priorities for "fitting things in" each day, where does spending time with Jesus fall? Is it near the top even though sometimes we can't make it work, or is it near the bottom and we just never find the time? If we are striving to be with Jesus in our state of life, those efforts will be rewarded a hundred fold and we can be confident He will give us whatever we need.




# Pray for the Souls of the Faithful Departed

#### What's New on New Street


We have a new home but the same address! Father John has given St. Vincent de Paul one-third of the administration building as our new conference headquarters as of July first. So, for the next few months, we will be bumping into each

other as we develop new routines for running a food pantry from the building. But, we remain a drive-thru pantry, so the cars will still be coming down the alley.

We have earned the reputation as being a first-rate pantry per comments from our Macomb Food Program and Forgotten Harvest associates. In June, we assisted 521 families and incurred \$8,540 in expenses. Every month the number of families we assist grows. That is both a good and bad thing – good because we are able to help neighbors and bad because the number of neighbors needing help keeps going up. One thing doesn't change though, and that is the incredible support we receive from our parishioners, the families of St. Mary's school and the religious education program, and from the parish staffs. As always, thank you for helping us help others.
