JESUS ... THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE

THIS IS THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT. OUR THEME FOR ADVENT THIS YEAR IS JESUS ... THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE. It is all about Jesus, so let's keep him at the center of our preparation for Christmas. Make a commitment to attend Mass every weekend during Advent and the Christmas season. You may get very busy and be tempted to skip Mass and take care of one of the many things on your to do list. Remove this as an option.

While I did not know it at the time I picked this theme for Advent, *JESUS* ... *THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE* is also the title of one of the Bible Studies we are doing now at St. Edith. There are three prayers that I would like to share with you from the workbook of that title by Marcellino D'Ambrosio, Jeff Cavins and Edward Sir. You may want to pray these during Advent.

JESUS ... THE WAY

Lord Jesus, I consciously decide right now to accept you not just as my Savior but as the Lord and center of my life. Whether I never really gave you control or gave it to you and took it back, I'm sorry. I turn over my claim I have on my life and surrender control to you. I believe that you know me better



than I know myself and love me more than I love myself. I know that your plan for me will be better than any plan that I can devise for myself, and I am excited at what the future holds. I believe that you will make something beautiful out of me and will do great things through me. Together with your mother I say, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."

JESUS ... THE TRUTH

Father, Jesus said, "No one can come to me unless the Father draws him." Thank you for giving me the gift of faith in your Son. I now ask you to draw me to him more deeply, more powerfully, than ever before. Through the gift of understanding that flows from your Holy Spirit, enlighten the eyes of my mind to truly know him and delight in his unsearchable wishes. I make this prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.

JESUS ... THE LIFE

Lord...grant that we may come to know the risen life and that nothing may distract us from the delight you offer. Through our unremitting zeal for you, Lord, set upon us the sign of your day that is not measured by the sun. In your sacrament we daily embrace you and receive you into our bodies; make us worthy to experience the resurrection for which we hope. We have had your treasure hidden within us ever since we received baptismal grace; it grows ever richer at your sacramental table. Teach us to find our joy in your favor! Lord, we have within us your memorial, received at your spiritual table; let us possess it in its full reality when all things shall be made new.



2021 Christmas Giving Tree

When you come to Mass this weekend, you will notice the *Giving Tree* in the Gathering Area. We decided to again put the tree out with the tags on it a week prior to Thanksgiving to enable folks to take advantage of the Black Friday deals!



We have tags for local families and some families through *Loaves & Fishes of Southwest Detroit*. We are also asking for gift cards for Kroger, Meijer and gas stations in any denomination.

Note there are "Code Names" on each tag. No, we are not delivering gifts to Columbia or Nashville; these code names are used to protect the privacy of those we help at this time of the year. Would you please consider taking a tag or two to help make someone's Christmas a bit brighter?

If you choose to take a tag/tags, please wrap the gift, attach the tag to it and put it back under the tree by <u>Monday, December 13</u>. Later that same week, our Volunteer Elves will be sorting and packing the gifts and readying them for delivery on Saturday, December 18. We ask for gift cards so that we are able to provide one (or more, depending on the size of the family) to each family. You don't need to wrap the gift cards, **unless** it is a card that was requested for a particular person. (For example if there is a Code name on the tag, and they have asked for a particular gift card, then you should wrap it. If it just says "Kroger Gift Card" or "Meijer Gift Card" or "Gas Station Gift Card" there is no need to wrap it.) You will also find the Drop Box in the Gathering Area for non-perishable food donations for our Christmas Outreach.

Again, delivery of the food and gifts to our needy friends will take place on Saturday morning, December 18, so it is very important that your gifts are wrapped and back under the tree at the very latest by Monday, December 13, so we have time to ready everything for delivery. <u>Any gifts that come in late cannot be used</u>.

As always, if you would like to make a monetary donation to help defray the cost of the perishable foods we purchase for our families, that would be very much appreciated. Please make your check out to **St. Edith Church** and put "**Christmas Outreach**" in the memo area. If you have any questions please feel free to give me a call. HOMILY ~ 33rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME NOVEMBER 13/14, 2021

There is an ancient tale about a king and queen who ruled over a vast kingdom. They were both getting advanced in years, and they knew that they would not live forever.


They never had any children, so they were not sure who would take over for them when they both died. They decided to open up this possibility to everyone in their kingdom. They decided to interview people who were interested, and they would select their successor. They did not want anyone to have an unfair advantage, so they opened up the palace. They opened up the royal closets so that people could select the clothes they would like to wear for the interview. They provided facilities so that people could bathe and prepare themselves for the interview. They provided lotions and fancy soap. They prepared a great banquet with sumptuous food and drink so that people would be able to eat well. They provided music and entertainment for the people while they waited for their interview. There was a gracious invitation for all. The king and queen waited in the royal chambers for people to line up for their interviews. Hours and hours went by, and they decided to go downstairs and find out what was happening. Everyone was gone. The royal closets were empty, the food and drinks had all been consumed. They even took the fancy soaps. The people enjoyed the royal hospitality so much that they forgot why they came. We do that sometimes in life. We forget why we are here. We are here temporarily to get to heaven. We are only passing through.

This is the end of the Church year, so the Readings are all about the end times, or the time of our own death, whatever comes sooner. The Readings are very clear. The material things of this world are going to pass away. Sometimes we get so caught up in the comforts of this world that they take on much more importance in our lives than they deserve; and we can forget why we are here. Livonia is a pretty affluent area, and most of us are very comfortable. Now there is nothing wrong with the material things of this world. They are all part of God's creation, and he gave them to us to be used and enjoyed by us; but we cannot get too attached to them. They do not belong to us; we only have them on loan from God. Some day, when you die, someone is going to put a dumpster in your driveway and empty out the contents of your house. No one will really want all of your stuff. Someone may take the time to donate some of the things to charity; but most likely all of your collections will be discarded, your house will be put on the market and someone else will be living there soon. And your portfolio that may have seemed so important to you, it no longer will be yours. It may give your family something to fight over for years. I learned that as an attorney during the time I spent probating estates. Most likely, the people who inherit it will not really need it, will not really want it or will squander it. Maybe you should give more of it away while you are here.

The Readings are very clear that we do not know the time of the end of the world as we know it or the time of our own death. Intellectually you would all tell me that you know this could be your last day on earth. But in reality, most people do not want to think about this or deep down they believe that they will live to be 100 years old, in good health and will have a few months warning before they die to give them time to prepare. I have been doing funerals every week for almost 20 years, and I am telling you, that never happens. Many people die a sudden death, accident, drug overdose, heart attack, stroke. This happens with no warning at all ages. And if we do not die suddenly, we can get sick and die at any time. We know this could be our last day, but most of the time we do not live our lives that way. I think we need to start, not in a morbid obsessive way, but in a way that we make the most of the time we have left. We sometimes spend a lot of time ruminating about the past. That is not good. We need to learn the lessons we need to learn from the past and then let it go. We sometimes spend a lot of time and energy running away from the pain, suffering, difficulties and challenges in our lives. That just leads to anxiety and depression because we can run but we cannot hide. We need to recognize what is, allow it to be, investigate it and see what we need to do to resolve it or accept what is. We also can spend a lot of time and energy trying to predict the future or control what the future will be. How is that working for you? The future almost never turns out the way we planned. If we ruminate about the past, run away from the present or live for the future, we will miss today which is really all that we have. Regardless of where I am in my life, I can always accomplish what I really need to do to get through today; and I can always find things to be grateful for.

So let's not forget why we are here. We are here temporarily to get to heaven, and we do not know how long this will be. And we know that our lives in this world will have some pain, suffering and challenges and will ultimately end with death. But we must remember what is important. Let's focus upon today, because that is all that we really know that we have. It is all about learning the lessons we are to learn. It is all about the people in our lives and how we treat them. It is all about how well we love. It is all about getting to know Jesus. He is the way, the truth and the life. That is going to be our theme for Advent, getting to know Jesus.



Blessing of an Advent Wreath

The use of the *Advent Wreath* is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent.

When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says: Our help is in the name of the Lord. Response (R/.) Who made heaven and earth. Then the Scripture, *Isaiah* 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or *Isaiah* 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or *Isaiah* 64 (lines 2-7) is read: Reader: The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God,

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light

be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen. The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
