





<u>"I CAN'T, BUT YOU CAN"</u> <u>A Tale of Christmas Outreach 2022</u>

This year our Christmas Outreach was a bit different than in years past. For many years, I have been asked to get more families than we have had in the past; and so we contacted Starfish Family Services to get families to adopt. Starfish covers a large area, including Livonia and Westland, so this was a great option!

GIVING TREE In the past, we have had 35 families and had no problem fulfilling the needs of those families, so I upped it to 50 ... which ended up (through the grace of God) working out, but not without a few moments where Yours Truly was pretty darn nervous that all the tags would be taken from the Giving Tree. You see, several of the families had five+ children; in the past, maybe one or two families would have maybe four kids so this was a big increase in kids! But we had made the commitment, so the tags were made out and put on the tree. Cue Toni's nerves kicking in ...

To say this was on my mind 24/7 is an understatement! Then, one evening as I was quite literally praying about all of this for "some reason," I remembered something I read a number of years ago while going through a bit of a rough patch. It was one of those situations where I had done everything I could do but things still seemed to be going off the rails. I was reading a book (wish I could tell you I remember which book it was), and the author said something to the effect of, when we have done all we can about a situation, that is when we need to trust that God has it all under control and to simply use these words as a prayer: *"I can't, but You can."*

Five simple words that I had forgotten about were brought back to me at just the right time (I love when that happens). I started to pretty much pray without ceasing *"I can't, but You can."*

When I came in for Pizza Night in December, the tree was still pretty much full of tags; and my stomach sank. A lovely woman came up to me, concerned about the amount of tags, letting me know she was going to take some more off the tree even though she had already done that the week before. I thanked her as she headed off to Mass. In the meantime, it was not lost on me that whatever tags were not taken, we would have to send out our Super Shopper (AKA Pat Rashid) to buy the gifts which would be paid for from the donations made to Outreach. Would there be enough money to do that? *"I can't but You can"* kept playing in my head and heart.

After Mass, this same woman sought me out and asked what would happen if there were tags left; and I explained to her that we would shop for those kids, and she looked at me and said, "because I would like to give you \$1,000." I nearly fell over! Between that and the donations from many parishioners, the Knights of Coumbus and other groups, we would have the money to pay for whatever needed to be purchased! I didn't, but He did. Every tag was taken care of in one way or another.

Merry Christmas, Happy New Year and God's blessings to you all!

Remember: When things get tough, you can't, but He can.




