Dear Parishioners and Friends,

If you are returning to Church today from a long absence, or even a short one, let the joy of this celebration fill you. Let the light of Christ into your lives and into your hearts that your hearts may grow this day and return to the joy of celebrating the Eucharist today and every week of the year.

Finally, this Christmas let us give thanks for all those doctors, nurses, first responders, those in service work, all who are making incredible sacrifices, and taking great risks, to heal and help us through this moment. Please know that you are in my thoughts and prayers. May the Lord Jesus bless you and your loved ones this Christmas Day.

Angel Tree



COMING BACK TO CHURCH


Question:

Answer:

If you are on your way to the supermarket, and you are forced to detour from your usual route because of road work, does the food you buy taste different? Is the meal less filling? Are the vegetables less tasty? Of course not. In our faith journey, there are many detours called sin. Some are greater than others, some are even a bit longer. But God's grace comes to us in ways we understand and recognize and need. Your children leading you back to the Church is not as important as the fact that you are back.

This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers.
