The Church has a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany (Traditionally January 6). Family and friends gather and ask God's blessing on their homes and upon those who live in or visit the home. This action is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, and present to us in our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and recreation, and in our joys and sorrows.

Marking the doorway to one's home is rooted in the Old Testament. Sacred Scripture reminds us that God has, at times, commanded his people to mark their doors. As when the Israelites marked their doors on the night of Passover with lamb's blood (Exodus 12:7). A similar command was given with the Hebrew *Shema Yisrael*: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart ... and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" (Dt 6:4-6, 9).

Using blessed chalk one or more members of the household inscribe **20 + C + M + B + 21** above the entryway. The letters C, M, B have two meanings: The initials of the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. And an abbreviation of the Latin: *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house-," is represented by the cross, "+". The split numbers 20 and 21 indicate the year.

## Epiphany Blessing the Home, Apartment, or other Dwelling Places

Using blessed chalk, write **20 + C + M + B + 21** on the lintel of your front door, front porch step, or other convenient location. Afterwards, say the following:

**The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and twenty one years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.**

Then offer the following prayer:

**Visit, O Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may show forth your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.**

In time the chalk will weather and fade. It is our reminder to let the meaning of these written symbols sink into the depths of our heart. Then made known through our words and actions. May the Lord be your shelter when you are home, your companion when you are away, and welcome guest upon your return.

## Wise Men See God in the Simple Things

If you're on social media, you have probably seen a meme going around that features this quote: "God has a plan for your life. The enemy has a plan for your life. Be ready for both. Just be wise enough to know which one to battle and which one to embrace."

There were certainly two competing plans for the Magi: God's and Herod's. And, wise as they supposedly were, it wasn't entirely easy for the Magi to discern which was which.

After all, Herod posed as a friend. He offered the Magi hospitality and kindness. Though the Gospel doesn't say so, he probably flattered them and appealed to every moral weakness he could observe in them. In his palace, they must have felt great physical comfort — rest and tables of plenty on what was an otherwise long and treacherous journey.

But if the Magi were honest with themselves, I'll bet they would have admitted that, regardless of Herod's charm, they felt a gnawing sense of doubt while in his presence. When they looked upon the Christ Child, born in a stable without any of the comforts of the world or protections of wealth, they probably felt the opposite. They probably felt safe.

The Magi were lucky enough to have the right plan spelled out for them in a dream, but for the rest of us, it's enough to remember this: God's plan is often the one that leads us to places of great simplicity, great humility and great love. Let's have the wisdom to view power with suspicion, and innocence with admiration.





**Meditations for January 3  
Isaiah 60:1-6**

*Rise up in splendor! (Isaiah 60:1)*

Today we celebrate the manifestation of Christ to the Magi, Gentiles from the East who came seeking the King of the Jews. Their arrival in Bethlehem is the fulfillment of today’s first reading, in which the glory of God draws people of every nation to Jerusalem.

But look closely, and you’ll find something surprising: “Your light has come,” the reading says, and “the glory of the Lord shines upon you” (Isaiah 60:1, emphasis added). It’s Jerusalem itself, symbol of God’s chosen people, that is attracting the Gentiles, not a sudden blaze of glory coming from the heavens. It’s the shining witness of a people who have bound themselves to the Lord and to each other. That’s where the nations will find the glory of God.

Imagine that! We ourselves—the people of God working and praying together, loving, and forgiving one another—we can be the manifestation of God’s glory to the world.

If you light one candle on a darkened, moonless night, you may be able to see it from a few feet away. But if you bring hundreds of people together and give each of them a lighted candle, you might see their brightness from a mile away. Bring enough people together, and you’d see the light from outer space! That’s God’s vision for us. He wants us to put aside selfish, sinful, or prideful attitudes so that we can love each other and serve each other—and so be his light. He wants us to follow him, not just because it’s good for us, but because he knows that a life of discipleship brings us closer together and makes us shine out to the world even more brightly.

So join the Magi and bow before the infant Christ today. But as you do, pray for the Church. Pray for your parish. Pray for the domestic church that is your family. Ask the Holy Spirit to keep purifying you, and all of God’s people, so that together we can shine more brightly and draw more people to him.

## Meet Our Extended Family



St. Philomena

Feast Day August 11

Jan 10, 291-Aug 10, 304

It is said that St. Philomena revealed her story to three people who did not know one another and who resided in different parts of the world. These private revelations unveiled the story of St. Philomena's life in great detail and were amazingly identical accounts. One of the revelations

came to Sister Maria Luisa di Gesu. St. Philomena came to her and told her she was the daughter of a Greek king who converted to Christianity. When Philomena was 13 years old, she took a vow of consecrated virginity. After her father took his family to Rome to make peace, Emperor Diocletian fell in love with Philomena. When she refused to marry him, she was repeatedly subjected to torture. Yet, in the midst of this torture, God continued to miraculously comfort her and heal her. This infuriated the Emperor who finally had her beheaded. St. Philomena said to Sister Maria Luisa di Gesu, "My soul took flight towards my heavenly Spouse, who placed me, with the crown of virginity and the palm of martyrdom, in a distinguished place among the elect. That day was so happy for me. . ." The young virgin willingly traded her earthly life for heavenly salvation and continues her work today promoting the virtues of purity and sanctity among the world's youth and bringing the faithful closer to our Blessed Mother and Jesus Christ. Her name means "daughter of light" (Latin: *fila luminis*), and she is credited with countless miracles and intercessions since discovery of her tomb in the most ancient catacombs of St. Priscilla in Rome in 1802.

1. What would it be like to encounter the baby Jesus?
2. To prostrate oneself is to lay flat on the ground, face down in reverence. Why was it appropriate and fitting for the Magi to worship Jesus in this way?
3. Like Herod in the Gospel and the Emperor Diocletian in the story of St Philomena, sometimes people tempt us to do something wrong or against God's will. Share a time when you acted in a just way in spite of a temptation.
4. St. Philomena was committed to living a holy life. What are some of the challenges of living a holy life today?


