

FORWARD IN CHRIST

18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Happy 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time! As we continue through the summer, Our Lord is drawing my mind to evangelization and the joy of the Gospel.. This is a word that we have all heard and know. The preaching of the Gospel is inherent to who we are; it is a duty that has been given to each of us by Our Lord. However, do we preach the Gospel? Are we preaching the Gospel in every way that we can in our lives? The question isn't *if* we can preach the Gospel, but rather *how* is Our Lord calling us to preach His Gospel? It can often be thought that only priests and deacons preach the Gospel, but the truth is, while priests and deacons preach in a special way, all people are called to preach the Gospel.

So, how do we evangelize? Well, it begins with our lives. We need to live our lives in a way that shows forth Jesus Christ. This begins with simply allowing the joy of Christ to fill our days. There is real and true joy here. Jesus is Risen! Eternal life has been offered to us! Alleluia! Can we see this in our lives? Is the fact that we are Catholic Christians apparent in our lives? An important part of this is to allow prayer to be a focus in our day. It is a great idea to begin and end our day in prayer. While we shouldn't pray to be seen, we shouldn't be afraid to be seen praying. Don't be afraid to where a crucifix, don't be afraid to pray in public. The fact that we are disciples of Our Lord Jesus Christ should be visible in who we are and in what we do. This is the very first line of evangelization.

Our work of evangelization can't stop with this, however. We must also speak about Our Lord and our faith in Him. This can seem daunting and challenging, but that doesn't mean that we shouldn't do it, it just means that we need to stay close to Our Lord in prayer and continually ask Him for the strength to preach His name. Also, remain close to the Lord especially in the Most Blessed Sacrament. It is His work. He will guide us.

In the end, remember to not be afraid. Our Lord is always with us to guide us closer to Himself and He is always there to help us preach His name. We just need to remember to pray daily and to be open to Him and to His will.



Looking back over my journey of parenthood, I know there were days when I traveled the extra mile for my children. I made their toast the way they like it, let them play in the park an extra ten minutes, or let them go to the movies with their friends and I finished up the chores on my own. And then, it happened: the attitude. The request for the smallest thing from one of them is met with disdain or bewilderment.

But if we're being honest with ourselves, we will admit that we do the exact same thing to God. Haven't we all been the Israelites in the desert at one point or another? How could you do this to us, Lord? How could you ask this of us? No, I can't go any further. No, I won't do any more.

Persisting in the blindness to the many ways God continues to protect us is nothing short of a temper tantrum. SODA BREAD RECIPE

Make this soda bread to remind you of Jesus, the Bread of Life!



Oil
2 cups flour
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. cream of tartar
1 cup buttermilk

Preheat oven to 450 degrees Fahrenheit. Oil a covered dish or a Dutch oven. Sift together flour, salt, baking soda, and Cream of Tartar. Add buttermilk. Mix until blended; dough will be a bit sticky. Knead 4 or 5 times (not too much of the bread will be tough) and shape into a ball. Cut cross in top and place in prepared pan. Bake covered for 30 minutes.


