“Two by Two”

Why two by two? If Jesus had sent the Twelve out individually, they could have gone to more places and encountered more people.

Going out two by two allows for mutual support and the opportunity not only to preach the Good News, but also to witness to it by the way they treat each other. They can support each other in the sense that they can decide together what to do in unforeseen circumstances. They can remind each other of Jesus’ instructions and care for each other in case of injury or sickness. Being together gives them greater protection from danger during travel.

Forming a small community of two also gives the apostles an opportunity to witness to the mutual love that Jesus expects of them. We can profit from their example in our lives, too. It might seem more expedient to do something alone, but collaboration, joint efforts, and group projects often offer invaluable benefits.

Yes, a mother can make cookies faster by herself than when her four-year-old is “helping” her. But what would be lost? The child enjoys benefits ranging from development of motor skills and a love of cooking, to a confidence in being loved and valued. The mother receives helpful practice in patience and the happiness of seeing her child find joy. Both of them experience the bond of growing love.

Yes, a pastor of a parish can more quickly plan an event by deciding everything himself than by discussing it with a team of parishioners. But if he involves others, he gains an opportunity for greater participation, with people doing what they do best. He gains greater insight, inspiration, and richness, and a growth in the communion and mutual appreciation in the parish.

Sometimes I feel that it would be easier to fly solo. Working with others requires long discussions, practicing patience, trying to see things from others’ point of view, and giving up my own opinions. All these things require time and effort, but they lead to growth in holiness and a richer outcome. We must ask Jesus to help us to value others more and be open to the ways The Holy Spirit works through the community of people with whom we worship. Where two or three are gathered in the name of Jesus, he is there.



Women's Right to Know Act Introduced in Michigan

June 22, 2021 Press Release Right to Life Michigan

Lansing, MI — The Women's Right to Know Act was introduced today in the Michigan House. Sponsored by Rep. Sue Allor, HB 5086 addresses three areas of informed consent for women seeking abortions: abortion pill reversal, heartbeat/miscarriage awareness, and prenatal diagnosis of a disability.

Right to Life of Michigan President Barbara Listing said, "Abortion businesses try hard to keep women in the dark. They don't want women to understand the reality of abortion and its effects on them and their children. This legislation would address several areas where women are not being given proper informed consent before abortions."

The abortion pill reversal provision requires the abortionist to let women taking the abortion pill know there is a treatment which may reverse the effects of the first pill of the two-drug regimen. Even though that treatment, progesterone, is commonly prescribed to prevent miscarriages, abortion supporters have claimed the treatment is "unproven," "dangerous," and wrongly suggest the child might be disabled if they survive the abortion pill's effects.

Listing said, "These concerns are based on talking points, not reality and research. Practicing doctors have studied and used this common treatment to increase the chances of saving the child's life. What bothers abortion businesses the most is that a woman might change her mind and choose life."

The heartbeat/miscarriage awareness provision requires the abortionist to check for a fetal heartbeat and allow the woman the opportunity to hear or see the heartbeat. If no heartbeat is detected, the abortionist must give the woman the opportunity to return later if the gestational age is too young to detect a heartbeat, tell her of the likelihood of a miscarriage based on the absence of a fetal heartbeat, or offer to use a different technology to detect the heartbeat. The abortionist must also let her know that treatment for a missed miscarriage is not considered an abortion for insurance purposes.

Listing said, "From what we know of miscarriage rates, abortion businesses over the years have undoubtedly sold many abortions to women who no longer had viable pregnancies. How many women have anguished over their abortion decision even though their child's life ended before they walked through the abortion facility's doors? How many abortionists have profited from this unnecessary medical intervention?"

The prenatal disability provision requires the doctor making a diagnosis of a serious prenatal condition to give the woman a referral for more information. The state will be required to create a website with medically accurate information about prenatal conditions, support group information, and perinatal hospice programs.

Listing said, "Sadly, so many women who received a troubling prenatal diagnosis had it immediately followed with suggestions or even pressure to have an abortion. Women have a right to medically-accurate information about their developing child, access to support groups, and a medical profession which walks alongside her instead of pushing for eugenic abortions."

Twelve Apostles: Sinners called by Jesus to serve

We, like the apostles, are asked to be evangelizers, as unworthy as we may be.

The Twelve Apostles were the first main group of evangelizers. It was their privilege and mission to tell the story of Jesus; to proclaim, share and spread the Gospel; and to bring others to belief and help them deepen their faith.

Their initial training as evangelizers came at the feet of the Master, Jesus himself. After he called the apostles by name, they were his constant companions and watched him in action as a preacher, teacher, healer, miracle worker, Scripture interpreter, recruiter, group leader, traveler and man of prayer.

After an initial period of observation, Jesus provided an opportunity for on-the-job training. He sent them out two-by-two (Mark 6:7), and they preached repentance, drove out demons and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them (see Mark 6:12,13). Their first attempts as evangelizers proved quite successful.

Calling the unworthy

Despite their strong start, however, the apostles were ill-prepared to venture off on their own. They were unable to heal a boy with a demon, presumably because their prayer was weak (Mark 9:28-29). The apostles displayed lack of comprehension (Mark 4:13), little faith (4:40), hard hearts (6:52), competitiveness (9:34), possessiveness (9:38), selfish ambition (10:37) and jealousy (10:41).

Worst of all, when Jesus was arrested, they all left him and fled (Mark 14:50). And, disappointingly, they were nowhere to be found during his trial, torture, crucifixion and burial. The apostles were in no way ready or worthy to be evangelizers.

Amazingly Jesus asks sinners to serve him. After the resurrection, Jesus appeared to the 11 and commissioned them to be his evangelizers: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every living creature” (Mark 16:15). Jesus calls the unworthy and makes them worthy, he sends forth the weak and makes them strong. And the apostles obeyed: “They went forth and preached everywhere” (16:20).

Pentecost was decisive.

The descent of the Holy Spirit and the infusion of divine grace transformed the apostles from fearful to courageous, timid to assertive, hesitant to confident and reserved to bold. After Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit, the one who had cowered behind locked doors stood before the crowds bravely and loudly proclaimed Jesus (Acts 2:14-40).

The apostles underwent intensive preparation before they went their separate ways. Personal readiness is indispensable because “you cannot give to others what you do not have yourself.”

The apostles built strong bonds of friendship with each other, prayed together both in the Temple and in their homes, broke open the word and broke bread (see Acts 2:42,46). Solid personal faith is the foundation of every evangelizer.

The apostles were commissioned by Jesus, empowered by the Holy Spirit and strengthened by word and sacrament, which led them to another degree of transformation. Those who relished common time were willing to disperse for the sake of the Gospel, those who stayed close to home were ready to travel great distances, and those who dreaded the thought of torture and execution were prepared to suffer and die.

Peter throughout Israel and to Antioch, Corinth, and Rome;
 Andrew to Asia Minor and Greece;
 James the Greater to Spain and back to Jerusalem;
 John to Ephesus, Patmos and possibly Rome;
 Philip to Phrygia and Hierapolis in Asia Minor;
 Thomas to Syria, Persia, and India;
 Bartholomew or Nathanael to India, Lycaonia, Mesopotamia, Persia and Armenia;
 Matthew or Levi to Judea, Ethiopia and possibly Persia, Syria and Macedonia;
 James the Lesser or James the son of Alphaeus in and around Jerusalem;
 Simon the Zealot, Cananaean or the Less to Egypt and Persia; and
 Jude or Thaddeus to Mesopotamia and Persia.
 All except John suffered a martyr's death.

Staying close to Christ

We, like the apostles, are called to be evangelizers, unworthy that we may be. Jesus asks mere sinners to do great things in his name.

We cannot give to others what we do not have ourselves. Therefore, it is imperative that we stay close to Jesus in word and sacrament because the more we know his word, the better we can share it; and the more that Jesus takes over our being (see Galatians 2:20), the more we will be able to radiate his presence.

July 11, 2021 – Moving On

Eventually, things wear out. Maybe that favorite sweater is fraying at the seams. Maybe what once fit like a glove no longer does.

Whatever the item, people eventually need to move on to something new.

Increasingly though, the new things aren't being purchased at a mall. As other types of retail have become more prominent – from digital channels to the so-called big-box stores – shopping centers have declined. As a result, then, the sweaters and gloves that need replacing are swapped out elsewhere.

And the same can be said for the shopping centers themselves.

Local media reported a few weeks ago that Eastland Center in Harper Woods will be razed, and an industrial complex built in its place. The plan, at least at this point, is for about 250 construction jobs to be created, followed by another 560 permanent jobs.

"We're embarking upon a great partnership to move forward, to move Harper Woods forward, and to do the best thing we can for our citizens," the mayor of Harper Woods was quoted as saying. "So much good is going to come out of this. We haven't even realized all the good that will be coming forward."

That's a bright, optimistic appraisal of the situation, and is, to be sure, a great way to embrace change, difficult as it may be, whether what's being changed is a pair of socks or a tract of land.

Or the course of people's lives, which is what Jesus is sending his disciples to accomplish in today's gospel passage from St. Mark.

"He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave,'" Jesus says. "Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them."

Jesus message, essentially: nurture, grow and move on as necessary.
