THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

## Notes from Fr. Steve

This week the Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany, which marks the end of the twelve days of Christmas each year.

Epiphany is the Greek word meaning “Manifestation or appearing”. At the Feast of the Epiphany we celebrate Jesus made manifest or appearing as Christ. Traditionally, there are three manifestations celebrated on the feast.

The most widely celebrated manifestation of Christ is the feast day, and the one historically celebrated by Churches in the West, is Jesus revealed as Christ to the three wise men, or Magi, from the East, who followed the star of Bethlehem at Jesus’ birth.

The second manifestation celebrated is the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan. Although this was part of the original Epiphany celebrations in the second century Christian Churches in the East, by the fourth century Western Churches had largely stopped observing the Holy Baptism in the Epiphany Celebrations.

The third manifestation of Jesus is traditionally celebrated on the day of the miracle of turning water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee. Christ’s first recorded miracle.

As I wrote Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of the Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore him. Christians have seen in the visit of the Magi the beginning of the Gentiles; they lead their journey all the people of the earth, and thus Epiphany is the affirmation of belief. St. Leo in a sermon read at Matins, in which he points out the adoration of the Magi the beginning of the Christian faith, the time when the great mass of the unbeliever sets off to follow the star which summons them to seek the Savior.

This gives affirmation to the prophecy from Isaiah which at mass when we point out the universal redemption of all the people in Christ, (“He came for the salvation of all people”) like the Wedding Feast at Cana, the Baptism of Christ allows us to focus Christ’s presence being made known. If look at this from our own personal experience, Christ came and was made known to us in our Baptism.

This would mean any time we encounter Christ, in Baptism, in the Word, in the sacraments and in particular the Eucharist, we are having an Epiphany. Now you can appreciate the fact that you have had and will have many Epiphanies!

As we continue to celebrate the Christmas Feast, please appreciate your daily Epiphanies, and then as the shepherds did, go out and share the good news, “to us a Savior” had been born.

Please keep the parish in your prayers, especially the sick and the suffering, your prayers bring them, comfort, healing and peace. God bless you!

### Reading I

*Isaiah 60:1-6/20*

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your  
light has come,  
the glory of the Lord shines upon  
you.

See, darkness covers the earth,  
and thick clouds cover the peoples;  
your sons from afar,  
and your daughters in the arms of  
their nurses.

Then you shall be radiant at what  
you see,  
your heart shall throb and overflow,  
for the riches of the sea shall be emptied  
out before you,

but upon you the Lord shines,  
and over you appears his glory.  
Nations shall walk by your light,  
and kings by your shining radiance.

Raise your eyes and look about;

### Reading II

*Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6*

Brothers and sisters: You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit; that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

### Gospel

*Matthew 2:1-12*

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the day of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it had been written through the prophet:

*And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,  
are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;  
since from you shall come a ruler,  
who is to shepherd my people Israel."*

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.



## The Epiphany of the Lord

“Where is that thing?” mumbled Bob as he searched frantically on his dimly lit desk for the current electric bill. “I know I put it right on top of these papers this morning!” Growing in frustration and bordering on anger, he flies stuff around, moves books and opines why simple tasks need to be so hard. Enter his wife, who calmly says, “Maybe it would help if you put the light on, dear.” The desk light goes on and lo and behold, there is the electric bill right where Bob left it earlier. All it took was a little light!

We stubbornly refuse to turn on the lights! Either we are distracted, determined, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Or perhaps, we fail to do the obvious. We would rather live our lives with the dimmest of lights or even in total darkness. Why are we afraid to do something so that we can actually see? It might help us to find quicker and better answers to problems, the meaning of life, relationships, happiness, and what is ultimate truth. Yet, we stumble along, moving things from one side to the other, getting angry, feeling cheated, being unsettled, resigning ourselves to the agony of defeat once again.

“And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.” The light has come into the world in the person of Jesus Christ! We no longer have to fumble in the darkness. We have been gifted with the illumination we need to see our way through things and find what we really are looking for. All these years later, however, so many are still reluctant to accept him. Perhaps they are unconvinced, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Everyone has their own reason for not wanting to turn on the switch.

But there are so many answers to so many of our problems in this humble Child of Nazareth. A simple birth teaches us about God’s tender wedded relationship with humanity. It speaks to the expanse of God’s salvation across the globe, and the incarnate Divine wonders and blessings that are a part of our life moment to moment. It calls us to understand the design of world order God intended as found in the Beatitudes, the sacredness of every human life and all of creation and the meaning of things we struggle with most, like suffering and death. We have a lot of Good News to share, not just with a privileged few but with all the world. All races and creeds can receive God’s healing word. God continues to manifest himself even now! Use the light to find what you are really looking for!






