THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Notes from Fr. Steve

Perhaps you were named after someone in your family, or a close family friend. People pick names for their children that have meaning for them. In the same manner, Popes pick names which have meaning to them our current Pope, chose the name Francis, taking the name of the great St. Francis of Assisi. I thought it might be interesting to read about some of the life of St. Francis and then appreciate the reason why Pope Francis chose this name.

St. Francis was born Francesco di Bernadone, born 1181, in Assisi and died October 3, 1228; feast day October 4. Francis was the founder of the Orders of Friars minor, the Order of the poor Clares and the lay Third Order. He was a leader in evangelical poverty in the early 13th century. He had a desire for evangelization, and personal charisma drew thousands of followers. Francis has a personal devotion to Jesus and a desire to follow his example in his spirituality.

Francis was the son of Pietro di Bernadone and Pica, his father was a cloth merchant who came from France. At his birth his father was away on a business trip to France, his mother took him for Baptism, and named him Giovanni. When his father came home his name immediately changed to Francesco.

Francis was given an excellent education, he like to speak French and was even known to sing French songs in his village. His teenage years were full of moral lapses, he seemed always to be in love and thought of himself as being very worldly. He cast such a dashing image, that he was a recognized leader of his town's youth.

In 1202 he took part in a war between Assisi Perugia, and was held as a prisoner for over a year, on his release he fell seriously ill. After the illness he attempted to join the Pope's army in late 1205. He was not able to join for unknown reasons, on his return home he had a dream or a vision to return to Assisi and await the call to knighthood. On his return he dedicated himself to prayers so that he might know God's will for him. Francis had several other visions which helped solidify his commitment to the religious life. While praying one day at a grotto near Assisi he had a vision of Christ. He had an experience of poverty while on the journey to Rome to make a pilgrimage, in Rome dressed in rags he mingled with beggars, and helped care for the lepers and was known to kiss their hands.

On his journey home he stopped by the Chapel of San Damiano outside the gate of Assisi. As he prayed before the crucifix he heard a command to; "Go, Francis and repair my house, you see it is in ruins". Francis hurried home and gathered the things necessary to repair the chapel. (Not knowing it was spiritual repairs to the Church God was commanding)

Francis renounced worldly good and family ties to totally embrace his mission to refurbish the chapel. On February 24, 1208, he listened at mass to the gospel account of the mission of Christ to the apostles from Matthew. And as you go, preach the message, "The Kingdom is at hand"...Take no gold, nor silver, nor money in your belts, no bag for the journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor a staff; for the laborer deserves his food. And whatever town you enter, find out who is worthy in it, stay with him until you depart. According to the many biographies about Francis this was a decisive moment, who stated, this is what I wish, and this is what I seek. This is what I am to do from the bottom of my heart. "He then removed his shoes, discarded his staff, and put on a tunic to preach repentance.

Pope Francis chose the name Francis for admirable reasons. He too is a disciple of Jesus Christ and has put aside the worldly things to embrace the spiritual things that last forever.

Please remember to pray for the parish, especially the sick and the suffering, your prayers bring them comfort, peace and healing. God Bless you.



Easy Chicken Pot Pie

1 2/3 cups frozen mixed vegetables, thawed
 1 cup chopped cooked chicken
 1 can (10 1/2 oz) condensed cream of chicken soup
 1 cup Bisquick mix
 1/2 cup milk
 1 egg

Heat oven to 375 F. Spray 9-inch pie plate with cooking spray. Add vegetables, chicken and soup and stir to combine. In medium bowl, stir remaining ingredients until blended. Pour into pie plate. Bake uncovered 25 to 30 minutes or until crust is golden brown.

When God Whispers

"You don't need to shout. My hearing works just fine."

Are you a parent that has used that one on your kids? I'm not sure at what age they realize that the volume of their voice doesn't correlate to the likelihood of receiving a favorable reply — it might be sometime in the teenage years, when the talking slows down altogether.

But I've got to admit, it would be nice if God always gave us a loud and dramatic sign when He wanted something — the booming voice and the torn-open heavens ("This is my beloved Son!") really get the message across. Sometimes I find myself envious of the Apostles, who were able to witness such things in person.

The fact of the matter is, in the year 2021, God is more likely to speak in a whisper than in a shout. The prophet Isaiah forewarns that Christ himself will not be a noise-maker — for all his preaching, he will not cry out or shout to bring forth justice to the nations. His way is altogether different than that.

We are not the Apostles, and we do not have the privilege of seeing the Holy Spirit descend on Christ like a dove. But here's the good news: God doesn't need to shout. Our spiritual hearing works just fine. We just have to be listening.

Let's wake up each morning ready to hear God's whispers throughout the day. Let's make a conscious effort to invite those whispers into our hearts, where they can become a catalyst for grace in this world.


The Baptism of the Lord

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.

If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator.

Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die.

People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing, and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God's help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?

Parish Registration:

Welcome to all new families/individuals. Please register as soon as possible. Membership is a condition for the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, First Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage.

Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be a sacramental sponsor. Registration forms are available in the Parish Office.

Baptism:

Baptisms are celebrated the third Sunday of the month at 12:00 p.m. A parent preparation class is mandatory. Classes are held on the fourth Saturday of each month at 10:00 a.m. Call the Parish Office during weekday office hours to register for a class.

Penance: Saturday 3:00 p.m. Special schedules for Advent and Lent.

Marriage:

Arrangements must be made through the Parish Office at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. One person of the couple must be an active, registered member of St. Rene Goupil Parish for six months.






