Notes from Fr. Steve

In a short time the month of October will be upon us. October is the month of the Holy Rosary and I thought sharing some information in advance might be helpful. The Rosary is such an important tool for prayer in our lives that the entire month of October has been set aside by the Church and dedicated to the Rosary. The liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated each year on October 7th.

It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. In the month of October, please consider this beautiful prayer as a means that we too can draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditation on the great mysteries of salvation.

Tradition holds that October has been celebrated as the month of the rosary since 1571, and the victory of the Catholic League (an allegiance of Spain, Venice, the Papal States, Genoa, Savoy, and Malta) over the forces of the Ottoman Empire who were seeking to take over Italy in an effort to move into the heart of Europe. It was October 7, 1571 when the battle was fought to overcome the ottoman forces. Prior to the ships sailing off towards battle, Pope Pius V declared a feast day of Our Lady of Victory. A rosary procession was offered in St. Peter's square after the victory and in time the whole month became associated with the rosary, rather than just one day! Pius XIII officially established October as the Month of the Rosary in 1884. That year he published *Superiore Anno*, an encyclical which focused on the recitation of the holy rosary. In it he called for the entire Church to dedicate the month of October to the Rosary and pray it.

The Rosary is prayed before every Mass, weekdays and on the weekends. I would encourage you to come and enjoy the spiritual benefits of the Rosary. If you do not have a rosary, please ask the person leading the rosary for one, they usually have some available.

Last week our beloved Felix Gatt died. He was an outstanding Christian, he loved the people of St. Rene very much. Kindly remember Felix and his family in your prayers.

This year's Religious Education program looks very exciting. Mike Novak has put together a very innovative program. Please register your children, information can be found in the bulletin.

I want to thank all of the people who came to the St. Peregrine Shrine last Saturday for healing prayers. It was a very powerful prayer service. I ask everyone in the parish to lift up all those who have cancer in your prayers.

Once again this year we will observe October as a Month of Mercy by reaching out to the Children with Cancer Book Drive. Please bring a new book to be given to the children who are receiving their chemotherapy treatments. The books are given to the children to keep. Your donation can be put in the wooden bin in the vestibule, it is marked for your convenience.


We are asking all current lectors and those wishing to be lectors to attend the Lector Workshop on Saturday, September 25th at 11:00 a.m. in the Church.

Breaking the Stewardship Mold

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeon-hole one another — and ourselves? “I could never serve on the Parish Council. That’s for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years.” “Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn’t need my help.” “I can’t afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn’t matter even if I did increase it.”

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren’t in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren’t likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren’t privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it’s outside our comfort zone, even if it’s something that never occurred to us before.

There’s only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?

Readings for Twenty-Sixth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Reading I

Numbers 11:25-29/137

The Lord came down in the cloud and spoke to Moses. Taking some of the spirit that was on Moses, the Lord bestowed it on the seventy elders; and as the spirit came to rest on them, they prophesied.

Now two men, one named Eldad and the other Medad, were not in the gathering but had been left in the camp. They too had been on the list, but had not gone out to the tent; yet the spirit came to rest on them also, and they prophesied in the camp. So, when a young man quickly told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp," Joshua, son of Nun, who from his youth had been Moses' aide, said, "Moses, my lord, stop them." But Moses answered him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!"

And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where "their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched."

GOSPEL MEDITATION


26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zachaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealousy, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid.




BEEF AND RICE CASSEROLE

St. Rene Goupil Parish is a Catholic Community, dedicated to strengthening the faith and love of its people. Our mission is to proclaim that Jesus is Lord, to celebrate His Presence, and to reach out to others in His name.

Parish Registration:

Welcome to all new families/individuals. Please register as soon as possible. Membership is a condition for the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, First Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage.

Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be a sacramental sponsor. Registration forms are available in the Parish Office.

Baptism:

Baptisms are celebrated the third Sunday of the month at 12:00 p.m. A parent preparation class is mandatory. Classes are held on the fourth Saturday of each month at 10:00 a.m. Call the Parish Office during weekday office hours to register for a class.

Penance: Saturday 3:00 p.m. Special schedules for Advent and Lent.

Marriage:

Arrangements must be made through the Parish Office at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. One person of the couple must be an active, registered member of St. Rene Goupil Parish for six months.




