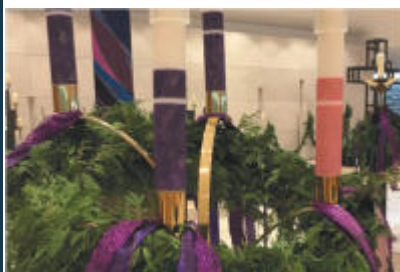

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK BRAUER

This Sunday before Christmas we celebrate the liturgy for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Today's liturgy of the Word reminds us that Jesus is Immanuel, "God with us", risen from the dead. He is the king of glory.

The liturgy for Christmas sings about the birth of the Son of God who is our life. Who changes our existence and touches each moment of our experience because he takes on to Himself, sin, sadness, desires and hopes.

There is a story that tells that one day Jesus returned visibly to earth. It was Christmas time and many children had come together for the Feast. Jesus came into their midst. They recognized and acclaimed Him. Then one of them began to ask what gift He had brought. A little at a time all the children began to ask Him where were His gifts. Jesus did not reply but opened His arms to them.

Finally, a boy said: "You, see? He brought us nothing. It's true what my father says, 'Religion has no purpose.' It gives us nothing, no gifts." But another boy replied: "When Jesus extends His arms, He means to say that He is bringing Himself. He is the Gift! He is the One Who gives Himself to us as a brother, as the Son of God, to make all of us sons (and daughters) of God like Him."

This Christmas as we gather to sing about the birth of

Christ let us be open to His loving embrace that brings healing, hope, forgiveness of our sins, reconciliation, compassion, new life, and love. Let us in return share the gift of Christ with one another and extends our arms to those who are most in need of God's love.

The liturgical celebration (Mass) of Christmas is a powerful reminder of the "event" that changed the world – the Son of God was birthed forth into the world – our Savior and Lord. Christmas is a reminder of how blessed we are to be called his beloved sons and daughters and how grateful we should be for all that God has given us – everything! May you and your family be blessed with a renewed love for God and one another this Christmas – Merry Christmas!

MARY, THE LORD IS WITH YOU!

As we light the fourth candle on our Advent Wreath, our focus continues to look to the first coming of Jesus. The themes of expectation and fulfillment of the prophecies permeates our celebration, reminding us of the coming of Jesus as the real joy that lies at the heart of Advent.

In our first reading, we hear from Micah, an eighth-century B.C. prophet, who lives about twenty miles from Jerusalem. He speaks about the expectation of a ruler and shepherd from Bethlehem: *“You, Bethlehem-Ephrathah, too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel”* (Mic 5:1-4). It is amazing that the Messiah is announced to be born in Bethlehem

eight centuries before Christ. King Herod knew of the prophecy, it is no wonder that he sent the Magi to Bethlehem to look for the newborn king. We like Micah wait with great expectation for the coming of Jesus.

In the second reading from the Hebrews, Jesus is quoted saying: *“behold, I come to do your will, O God”* (Heb 10:7). The point of the passage is that Jesus is doing the will of God. Joseph is doing the will of God. Mary is doing the will of God, especially after the angel tells her Elizabeth is pregnant. She goes in haste to witness Elizabeth’s great joy of bearing a child. In hearing this reading, you and I are being asked to reflect on our own life: Are we doing the will of God?

In the Gospel, the meeting and interaction between Mary and Elizabeth are significant in the story. Two women who are cousins and have experienced unusual pregnancies offer support to each other as they ponder what has happened in their lives. Both are willing to do the will of God. Mary greets Elizabeth and Elizabeth says: *“blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb”* (Lk 1:42). With these words Elizabeth’s unborn child leaps for joy and recognizes the unborn Savior. Elizabeth recognizes Mary’s faith in God when she says: *“Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled”* (Lk1:45). Both women realize that they are part of God’s unfolding plan to save His people, and they share a surrender to the unknown and the unexplained.

2. When something unusual happens in my life, who do I talk it over with?
3. Is there something in my life that I am not sure of, and do I ask the Lord to help me?
4. Is there someone in my life who need me to visit with them?

ADVENT O ANTIPHON PRAYERS BEGIN FRIDAY

The **O Antiphons** are short refrains that are sung before and after the Canticle of Mary (the Magnificat) during Evening Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office). Around the 8th or 9th centuries, the monks and nuns in the monasteries began to sing one O Antiphon for each of the seven days before Christmas Eve. Each antiphon is a Scriptural name or title of Christ, with a petition that follows. It was a way to prepare for the coming of Christ.

O Antiphons for each day before Christmas Eve:

- **December 17: O Wisdom**, come and show us the way to salvation (Is 40:3-5).
- **December 18: O Lord**, come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free (Ex 6:6).
- **December 19: O Root of Jesse**, come let nothing keep you from coming to our aid (Hb 2:3; Heb 10:37).
- **December 20: O Key of David**, come and lead your captive people into freedom (Is 42:7; Ps 107:14; Lk 1:79).
- **December 21: O Dayspring**, splendor of eternal light, come

shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death (Lk 1:78-79; Is 9:2).

- **December 22: O King of the Nations**, come and save the creature you fashioned from the dust (Gn 2:7).
- **December 23: O Emmanuel**, God-with-us, come and set us free (Ps 118:5).

The O Antiphons are not unfamiliar to us, because each Advent we sing a song, which contains them: “O come, O come, Emmanuel”. The O Antiphons came first, the song and music developed around the 12th century.

Beginning on December 17, I encourage you to gather around your home Advent Wreath or Christmas tree and prepare for the coming of Christ together as a family with a short prayer on the seven days before Christmas Eve.

1. Sing:
*“O come, O come, Emmanuel
 And ransom captive Israel,
 That mourns in lonely exile here,
 Until the Son of God appear.
 Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
 Shall come to thee, O Israel”*
*(Worship: Fourth Edition, GIA
 Publications, Inc., No. 386).*
2. Antiphon for the day (Dec. 17-23)
3. Canticle of Mary:
*“My soul proclaims the greatness
 of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in
 God my savior.
 For he has looked upon his
 handmaid’s lowliness; behold, for
 now on will all ages call me
 blessed.
 The Mighty One has done great
 things for me, and holy is his
 name.
 His mercy is from age to age to
 those who fear him.
 He has shown might with his
 arm, dispersed the arrogant of
 mind and heart.
 He has thrown down the rulers
 from their thrones but lifted up
 the lowly.
 The hungry he has filled with
 good things; the rich he has sent
 away empty.
 He has helped Israel his servant,
 remembering his mercy,
 According to his promise to our
 fathers to Abraham and to his
 descendants forever”* (*The New
 American Bible, Luke 1: 46-55*).
4. Repeat the O Antiphon for the day (Dec. 17-23)
5. Repeat a verse from: “O come, O come Emmanuel”

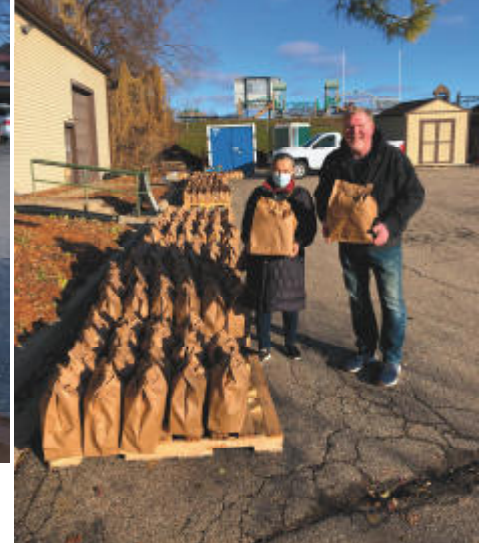

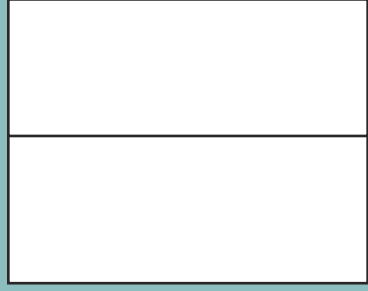

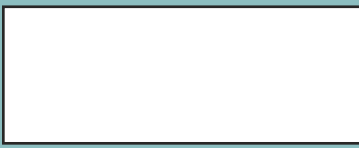
