

MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

On January 1, we celebrate the oldest feast of Mary in the Roman Church, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. The focus of this feast is on the divine motherhood of Mary whom "we proclaim … to be the Mother of Christ and the Mother of the Church." (1985 Sacramentary, p55)

"Theotokos" (God-Bearer) has been the title used for the Blessed Virgin from most ancient times. Under this title all the churches recall her memory in their daily Eucharistic prayer, especially in the annual celebration of Christmas. Mary is identified with the church, especially in the passages about the Wedding at Cana and the Crucifixion.

The Scripture readings used on this day reflect Mary's role in the life of Jesus and in the church. In bearing Jesus, our Savior, Mary gave to us the one who makes us sons and daughters of God and brothers and sisters to one another in faith.

In the first reading, the Lord gives Moses direction on how to bless the people, which is perhaps the oldest piece of poetry in the Bible:

"The Lord bless you and keep you!
The Lord let his face shine upon you and be gracious to you!
The Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace"

(Numbers 6:24-26)!

This blessing is so appropriate as we start the year asking for peace within ourselves, one another, and our world.

In the second reading, the focus shifts to the mystery of the incarnation or the mystery of Jesus as being both human and divine: "God sent his Son, born of a woman" (Galatians 4:4). On this day, we are reminded that Jesus became human to save us. In Preface I of the Blessed Virgin Mary for this feast, we pray:

"For by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit she conceived your Only Begotten Son, and without losing the glory of virginity, brought forth into the world

the eternal Light, Jesus Christ our Lord"

(2011 The Roman Missal, p442).

In the Gospel, the shepherds find "Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger" (Luke 2:16). Mary and Joseph fulfill the requirements of the Jewish law and name their Son, Jesus. The name of Jesus or Joshua in Hebrew means savior, which is both Jesus' identity and his mission.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord has a complicated beginning. The story begins differently in the east and the west churches.

In the early fourth century, Rome and the churches in the west did not celebrate Epiphany, instead they celebrated the birthday of Jesus or the Incarnation on December 25th. The feast affirmed the two natures of Christ as both human and divine. It also celebrated the appearance or manifestation of God through Christ to the whole world.

In the early fourth century, the churches in the east did not celebrate the western Christmas, instead they celebrated Epiphany. The eastern Epiphany celebrated several events that revealed God in Jesus: The Incarnation, the Birth of the Lord, the Adoration of the Wise Men, Jesus' Baptism by John, and the Miracle at Cana. The eastern Epiphany was more concerned about celebrating the appearance of God to the world, rather than historical events.

By the middle of the fourth century, the west and east churches began celebrating both days. Christmas celebrates the birth of Jesus or the Incarnation. Preface II for Christmas states:

"For on the feast of this awe-filled mystery, though invisible in his own divine nature, he has appeared visibly in ours; and begotten before all ages, he has begun to exist in time; so that, raising up in himself all that was cast down, he might restore unity to all creation and call straying humanity back to the heavenly Kingdom" (2011 Roman Missal, p392).

Epiphany celebrates the entrance of Christ into the world. The Preface for the Epiphany states: "For today you have revealed the mystery of our salvation in Christ as a light for the nations" (2011 Roman Missal, p39 6).

Traditionally, Epiphany is the day for blessing homes. Family members gather at the main door of the house (inside or outside) and the following prayer is read by whomever the family chooses.

"Lord God of heaven and earth,
you revealed your only - begotten Son
to every nation by the guidance of a star.
Bless this house and all who inhabit it.
Fill them with the light of Christ,
that their concern for others
may reflect your love.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen" (Book of
Blessings, p685).

In Germany, when the prayer is finished, the following inscription is written with chalk above the door (22+C+M+B+22), while another reads the corresponding words:

"The letters are Latin

<u>C</u>hristus <u>M</u>ansionem <u>B</u>enedicat
(Christ, bless this house).

At the same time,
the letters are
the first letters of the names of the wise men: <u>C</u>aspar,
<u>M</u>elchior and <u>B</u>althasar"

(From the book, Twelve Days of Christmas, Elsa Chaney, The Liturgical Press, 1955).

Liturgical colors help us to set the scene or paint the picture of the certain feast day or liturgical season that is being celebrated.

The color green, which we're most accustomed to throughout the liturgical year, is the color that symbolizes Ordinary Time. And during Ordinary Time, we hear about the mission and ministry of Jesus, how he went about curing people and teaching and calling his disciples to follow after him. In fact, we could call it extraordinary time.

The color white helps to symbolize great celebration. We see the color white during Christmas or Easter on feasts celebrating our Blessed Mother or other saints. It helps us to recognize that the day or season is set apart to give God thanks and praise for all that he has done through

the life of Jesus and Mary and the saints.

The color red we see on feast days of the martyrs, those who shed their blood for the Lord. We see it on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, when we recall the Lord shedding his own blood for the salvation of the world.

We use the color violet during the season of Advent and Lent. Violet symbolizes penance, or the ways in which all of us are called to turn away from sin and to be faithful to the Gospel.

The colors help us to paint our living story of faith and to recognize what truly is being celebrated.

COVID-19 LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS

With the rise in COVID-19 infections and, particularly, hospitalizations in our community, we wish to remind all parishes of our current COVID-19 protocols.

December 13, 2021

With the recent increase in COVID-19 cases in Michigan, and the approaching winter season, we wish to remind clergy and parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit's current guidelines for liturgies:

- The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages Mass-goers, regardless of vaccination status, to wear facecoverings and to practice social distancing to reduce exposure to COVID-19.
- The Archdiocese of Detroit strongly recommends that each pastor/In Solidum team should evaluate their location in the Archdiocese and implement the following protocols:
- Establish an area where social distancing is observed



- Strongly encourage masking and social distancing for all Mass-goers
- Require all who distribute Holy Communion to wear face-coverings and use hand sanitizer
- Hang signage indicating masking and social distancing are strongly encouraged
- Ensure that hand sanitizer is readily available at church entrances and near the sanctuary
- valuate space for the choir, and strongly recommend that those who are unvaccinated do not participate in the choir at this time
- The faithful are reminded that dispensations from the obligation to participate in Holy Mass remain in effect for people who are ill or who find themselves in other specific circumstances.




