



Poverty Awareness Month - The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has declared the month of January as *Poverty Awareness Month*. Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. For example, in 2018, 10.6% of men, and 12.9% of women lived in Poverty USA. Along the same lines, the poverty rate for married couples in 2018 was only 4.7% - but the poverty rate for single-parent families with no wife present was 12.7% and for single-parent families with no husband present was 24.9%.

In 2020, 37 million people lived in Poverty USA. That means the poverty rate for 2020 was 11.4%. However, due in part to the advocacy of Catholics around the country, in 2020 the supplemental measure – which considers programs designed to keep people out of poverty – dropped to 9.1, the lowest rate since 2009. Thanks to stimulus payments, enacted as part of economic relief legislation related to COVID-19, 11.7 million individuals were lifted out of poverty.

In 2018, the poverty rate for people living with a disability was 25.7%. That is nearly 4 million people living with a disability in poverty.

Who lives in Poverty USA? All those who makes less than the Federal government's official poverty threshold, which for a family of four is about \$25,700: People working minimum wage, even holding down several jobs; Seniors living on fixed incomes; Wage earners suddenly out of work; and Millions of families everywhere from our cities to rural communities. WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The days from January 18th through January 25th as a time to pray for unity among all Christian churches throughout the world. These eight days are called the "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity." It is an international opportunity for Christians of every tradition to join in a common observance of prayer for unity.

Vatican II was greatly concerned about unity and decreed that a movement for the restoration of unity among all Christians seriously begin. Often, we refer to this movement as "Ecumenism." In 1964, the Second Vatican Council wrote a document on unity called the *Decree on Ecumenism*. The document provides guidelines, methods, and ways to respond to the call for unity. The document asked Catholics to:

- Avoid expressions, judgments, and actions, which are unfair to the separated churches.
- Engage in dialogue on many levels so that everyone gains truer knowledge and a more just appreciation of each other.
- Come together for common prayer.
- Undertake the task of renewal and reform.

As we celebrate this week, let us pray, for Christian Unity:


"Almighty ever-living God, who gather what is scattered and keep together what you have gathered, look kindly on the flock of your Son, that those whom one Baptism has consecrated may be joined together by integrity of faith and united in the bond of charity. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives

and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen." (2011 The Roman Missal, p.1117)

The overall theme for 2022 is "We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship him" (Mt 2:2). For this Week of Prayer, "the Christians of the Middle East chose the theme of the star that rose in the east for a number of reasons. While many Western Christians celebrate Christmas, the more ancient feast, and still the principal feast of many Eastern Christians, is the epiphany when God's salvation is revealed to the nations in Bethlehem and at the river Jordan. This focus on the theophany (the manifestation) is, in a sense, a treasure which Christians of the Middle East can offer to their brothers and sisters around the world ... More than ever, in these difficult times, we need a light that shines in darkness and that light, Christians proclaim, has been manifested in Jesus Christ" (Pontifical Council for Christian Unity and the Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of Churches, Week of Prayer Christian Unity 2022 Booklet).

Prayer Services for each day may be found on the St. Hugo website: www.sthugo.org. The daily themes for 2022 are as follows.

- January 18 "We observed his star in the East" (Mt 2:2): Raise us up and draw us to your perfect light.
- January 19 "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews?" (Mt 2:2): Humble leadership breaks down walls



and builds up with love.

- January 20 "When king Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him" (Mt 2:3):
 The presence of Christ, turning the world upside down.
- January 21 "And you, Bethlehem... are by no means least" (Mt 2:6): Though small and suffering, we lack nothing.
- January 22 "Ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising" (Mt 2:9): Guided by the one Lord.
- January 23 "They saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage" (Mt 2:11): Gathered in worship around the One Lord.

January 24 - "Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Mt 2:11): The gifts of communion.

January 25 - "They left for their own country by another road" (Mt 2:12): Beyond the familiar routes of separation to God's new paths.

COVID-19 LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS

by The Archdiocese of Detroit

With the rise in COVID-19 infections and, particularly, hospitalizations in our community, we wish to remind all parishes of our current COVID-19 protocols.

December 13, 2021

With the recent increase in COVID-19 cases in Michigan, and the approaching winter season, we wish to remind clergy and parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit's current guidelines for liturgies:

- The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages Mass-goers, regardless of vaccination status, to wear facecoverings and to practice social distancing to reduce exposure to COVID-19.
- The Archdiocese of Detroit strongly recommends that each pastor/In Solidum team should evaluate their location in the Archdiocese and implement the following protocols:
- Establish an area where social distancing is observed
- Strongly encourage masking and social distancing for all Mass-goers
- Require all who distribute Holy Communion to wear face-coverings and use hand sanitizer
- Hang signage indicating masking and social distancing are <u>strongly</u> encouraged
- Ensure that hand sanitizer is readily available at church entrances and near the sanctuary
- valuate space for the choir, and strongly recommend that those who are unvaccinated do not participate in the choir at this time
- The faithful are reminded that dispensations from the obligation to participate in Holy Mass remain in effect for people who are ill or who find themselves in other specific circumstances.

SPECIAL HOLY HOUR FOR THE UPCOMING SUPREME COURT DECISION REGARDING ABORTION

The St. Hugo Respect Life Committee is sponsoring a Pro-Life Prayer Service after the 8:30 Saturday morning Mass. ADULT CATHOLICS: DO YOU NEED TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION?

Three times a year (fall, winter, spring), Confirmation preparation sessions are offered to prepare adults for the Celebration of Confirmation. Adult Confirmation preparation sessions are held in-person on Sunday mornings in the parish office conference room, from 9-10 AM.

Confirmation may be received at different times throughout the year: first, at the parish celebration at St. Hugo of the Hills Church on Saturday, January 29, 2022, at 11 AM Mass or second, at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament on Pentecost Sunday, June 5, 2022, at 11 AM Mass. The Archdiocese of Detroit does recommend for adults to participate in their parish celebration. When this is not possible, adults are invited to participate in the Cathedral's Confirmation ceremonies.

What do you need to do? It is a simple three step process.

<u>First Step</u>: You need to have been baptized and received Communion in the Catholic Church. If not, you need to register for the RCIA process.

Second Step: Candidates for Confirmation are asked to complete the preparation sessions before the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Winter Adult Confirmation Preparation for January 29, 2022, at St. Hugo of the Hills.

Session 1 = Sunday, Jan. 16, 9-10 AM Session 2 = Sunday, Jan. 23, 9-10 AM

Spring Adult Confirmation Preparation for June 5, 2022, at the Cathedral.

Session 1 = Sunday, May 8, 9-10 AM Session 2 = Sunday, May 15, 9-10 AM Session 3 = Sunday, May 22, 9-10 AM

Please bring to the first session a recent copy of your Baptismal Certificate with notations. We ask that you contact the church of your Baptism and request a "new"

Baptismal Certificate with notations (issued within the last 6 months). You will need to choose Confirmation Sponsor: a sponsor must be over 16 years of age; be a practicing Catholic who has received Baptism, the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist; and not be the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (cf. CCC 874). Canon Law states: "It is desirable that the one who undertook the role of sponsor at baptism be sponsor for confirmation" (CCC 893).

<u>Third Step</u>: You need to attend the Adult Confirmation preparation sessions, which are held in-person on Sunday mornings in the office conference room, from 9-10 AM.




