

#### WORDS TO PONDER...

What do we mean when we say that we make a sacrifice? We say, for example, I have sacrificed my career for my children! I sacrificed a lot for my job! Love demands that we make sacrifices! Sometimes we must sacrifice life itself for the sake of integrity! Christ sacrificed himself for our sins! The Eucharist is a sacrifice!

From what is common in all these expressions, we can extract the dictionary definition of sacrifice: "the surrender of something of value for the sake of something else." This is a good definition, but in terms of its understanding as prayer and as Eucharist, more must be added.

St. Augustine defined sacrifice by saying that it is an act, through which we enter into deeper communion with God and each other, and that the sacrifice opens us to deeper communion by changing and stretching the heart of the one offering it.

When we add St. Augustine's definition to that of the dictionary, we see that sacrifice works this way: "To make a sacrifice is to surrender something out of love, something that is ours and is painful to give away, and to let the pain of that surrender stretch and change our hearts in such a way that we are now more open to communion with God and others."

May we keep our eyes on Jesus and be grateful to God for sacrificing his only beloved Son for our salvation!

The celebration of St. Antony took place on Monday, January 17. St. Antony was born in Egypt in 250 AD. At eighteen years of age, after his parents died, Antony distributed his property to the poor, and placed his younger sister in a convent. began a life of penance, withdrew into solitude, and sought out an ascetic man to be his teacher of prayer. At thirty-five years of age, Antony decided to go out into the desert to continue his solitude in prayer and penance. He became known as the Father of Monasticism, and the Father of All Monks. At 105 years of age, Antony died in 356 AD.

Saint Athanasius wrote "The Life of Saint Antony", which was a best seller in ancient times. Antony is important because he attracted ST. ANTONY OF EGYPT, ABBOTT (250-356 AD)

disciples, worked on behalf of the Church, gave support to believers during the Diocletian persecution, and assisted Saint Athanasius, Bishop and Doctor of the Church.

The disciples of Antony tried to imitate his way of life, and they established settlements communities in the Egyptian desert. One settlement was located at Nitria and 6.000 monks lived in community. Another settlement was located at Cellia and 600 monks lived in community. These settlements were designed with individual dwellings for hermits, bakeries, a Church, and a guest house, so people from the cities could come for a week of prayer and penance (like our experience of a retreat). The monks would seek employment to support themselves. Today, people are still living in community in some of these ancient settlements.

The celebration of this feast provides an opportunity for us to consider going on a retreat. A retreat is a time set apart from usual pursuits to give attention to one's spiritual wellbeing. A retreat is an opportunity to deepen our faith. A retreat may focus on specific needs such as preparation for marriage or discernment in making an important decision. retreat is usually conducted centers established expressly for that purpose. A retreat may be made with a group or by yourself with an aid of a spiritual director. During COVID, you can find virtual or online retreats offered by many Catholic organizations.



#### ADULT CATHOLICS: DO YOU NEED TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION?

Three times a year (fall, winter, spring), Confirmation preparation sessions are offered to prepare adults for the Celebration of Confirmation. Adult Confirmation preparation sessions are held in-person on Sunday mornings in the parish office conference room, from 9-10 AM.

Confirmation may be received at different times throughout the year: first, at the parish celebration at St. Hugo of the Hills Church on Saturday, January 29, 2022, at 11 AM Mass or second, at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament on Pentecost Sunday, June 5, 2022, at 11 AM Mass. The Archdiocese of Detroit does recommend for adults to participate in their parish celebration. When this is not possible, adults are invited to participate in the Cathedral's Confirmation ceremonies.

What do you need to do?
It is a simple three step process.

<u>First Step</u>: You need to have been baptized and received Communion in the Catholic Church. If not, you need to register for the RCIA process.

**Second Step**: Candidates for Confirmation are asked to complete the preparation sessions before the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

CCC 874). Canon Law states: "It is desirable that the one who undertook the role of sponsor at baptism be sponsor for confirmation" (CCC 893).

<u>Third Step</u>: You need to attend the Adult Confirmation preparation sessions, which are held in-person on Sunday mornings in the office conference room, from 9-10 AM.
