

**Pastor's Ponderings.** Greetings and the Father's Blessing be upon you, my dear spiritual children. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God is at 12:00 noon on January 1, 2022. There will *not* be a vigil Mass on December 31, 2021. Incidentally, January 1<sup>st</sup> is also the octave day of the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, First Saturday, and World Day of Peace.

Since January 1<sup>st</sup> is a Saturday, and on Saturdays (as most of you are aware) we typically have Confessions from 3:00 – 4:00 PM, but since the Mass is at Noon, we will have a very special Confession Time for that day only, namely from 10:30 AM – 11:30 AM before the Holy Mass. This way if anyone needs Sacramental Reconciliation with God and forgiveness of their sins, especially any that may have transpired the night before, you will be able to cleanse your soul and prepare to hear the proclaimed word clearly and receive the Most Holy Eucharist in a state of grace for this obligatory Mass.

In just three weeks Bishop Robert Fisher is expected to be here to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation for our Saint Christopher's Confirmation class of 2022 on January 16. As a gentle reminder, I ask that you remember in your prayers all those who will be sealed in the Gift of the Holy Spirit by way of reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation as well as their sponsors. Thank you.

*Musical Note.* As of the writing of this bulletin article (December 14) in time for an early publication deadline due to the holiday, we do not yet have any musician scheduled for morning Masses on January 2<sup>nd</sup> or January 30<sup>th</sup> (this includes both 8:00 AM and 11:00 AM). We hope, by that time, we will have someone to play the piano or organ for us, but if worse comes to worst, then we will simply "go acapella" for these four Masses. If everyone sings, then this will sound pretty good. The human voice is the preferred instrument for Church worship and "he who sings well, prays twice."

Catechism of the Catholic Church Preface for this weekend's readings to ponder. "The hidden life at Nazareth allows everyone to enter into fellowship with Jesus by the most ordinary events of daily life: 'The home of Nazareth is the school where we begin to understand the life of Jesus – the school of the Gospel. First, then, a lesson of silence. May esteem for silence, that admirable and indispensable condition of mind, revive in us ... a lesson on family life. May Nazareth teach us what family life is, its communion of love, its austere and simple beauty, and its sacred and inviolable character ... A lesson of work, Nazareth, home of the "Carpenter's Son," in you I would choose to understand and proclaim the severe and redeeming law of human work. ... To conclude, I want to greet all the workers of the world, holding up to them their great pattern, their brother who is God'" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 533).

"The *finding of Jesus in the temple* is the only event that breaks the silence of the Gospels about the hidden years of Jesus. Here Jesus lets us catch a glimpse of the mystery of his total consecration to a mission that flows from his divine sonship: 'Did you not know that I must be about my Father's work?' Mary and Joseph did not understand these words, but hey accepted them in faith. Mary 'kept all these things in her heart' during the years Jesus remained hidden in the silence of an ordinary life" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 534*).

### The Grinch and the Devil

I grew up watching the classic 1966 Christmas cartoon "How the Grinch Stole Christmas". As children we would wait with anticipation, scanning the TV Guide each week in November and December to see what day and time the Christmas specials would be airing because back in the "olden days", before DVD's or DVR's or streaming, you had one shot. It was on TV once a year and if you missed it? Well, there was always next year!

I can remember sitting cross-legged in front of our console television, eating popcorn with glee, because even as the Grinch was creating havoc in Whoville by trying to prevent Christmas from arriving I knew what was coming. (Spoiler Alert!) I loved the iconic scene where the Grinch is standing on the top of the mountain, his sled loaded with stolen presents, decorations and holiday food, while his ears are straining to hear the cries of sadness and disappointment from the villagers. Instead, he hears the sound of beautiful singing drifting up from the valley and we hear the narrators voice say:

"And the Grinch, with his Grinch-feet ice cold in the snow, stood puzzling and puzzling, how could it be so? It came without ribbons. It came without tags. It came without packages, boxes or bags. And he puzzled and puzzled 'till his puzzler was sore. Then the Grinch thought of something he hadn't before. What if Christmas, he thought, doesn't come from a store? What if Christmas, perhaps, means a little bit more?" (Theodor Seuss Geisel)

Then, we as the viewers, got to see the Grinch's heart grow, and grow and GROW. A smile spreads across his face, his adorable dog Max leaps up onto the pile of stolen goods and they both ride triumphantly down the mountain into Whoville to join the villagers who are celebrating the birth of our Savior despite not having any of the usual Christmas trappings. Every year I would clap and cheer at this point whether I was watching it with someone or alone, and I would crunch on my popcorn, satisfied that the Grinch once again failed at preventing Christmas from coming!

Although technically a secular movie, "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" relates a Christian truth which is Christmas isn't what is *around* us but rather what is *in* us. Sometimes, especially during holy seasons such as Advent, the Devil tries to use any of his tricks and lies to pull us away from Jesus. He'll try to keep us focused on the things of this world; the chaos, the division, the disappointments and even the distractions of the "good stuff" that we think we must have in order to celebrate Christmas time. He'll try to fool us by making us feel alone or overwhelmed. The Devil is clever in that he will use the things that personally discourage or scare us the most in order to cause us to miss the true meaning of Christmas. In a way, the Devil is the ultimate Grinch (but without the Grinch's eventual redemption)!

Yet, just like the furry green Grinch failed the Devil also fails because *nothing* can keep Christmas from coming. Despite Herod, the difficulties of the journey and the lack of accommodations our Savoir Jesus was born over 2000 years ago. Despite any personal challenges or heartache, you may be experiencing this year your Savoir Jesus still longs to be born in your heart anew this Christmas season. Finally, despite any confusion or doubt the Devil tries to fling in our direction our Savoir Jesus will be coming back, in the flesh, on some unknown day in the future. We need to keep our focus on those facts and although we can enjoy all the lights and festivities that Christmas time can bring, as Christians we already know what the Grinch had to learn. We know that Christmas doesn't come from a store, and we know that Christmas means a whole lot more. The Christmas season serves as a reminder that God loves us so much that He sent His only Son into our world so, ultimately, we may have eternal life.

So, as we gather with others, both in homes and at Mass, may we be like the Whos in Whoville and "welcome Christmas while we stand...heart to heart and hand in hand". The Grinch and the Devil do not stand a chance against the power of that kind of love!


