

FAITH FORMATION PERSPECTIVES**BY LEONARD PIASTA, FFC CHAIR****JUNE 20, 2021****12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME****WIND AND WAVES—MK 4:35-41**

Evening was drawing near, and Jesus tells his disciples for all of them to cross over to the farther shore. In the boat with his disciples Jesus leaves the crowd on the shore and start their journey across the water. A bad squall blows up and waves start breaking over the boat and it began to ship badly. Jesus through this squall is sound asleep in the stern. The disciples awake Jesus and plea, "Teacher, doesn't matter to you that we are going to drown?" Jesus awakes and rebukes the wind and sea with, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind and waters grew calm. Jesus questions his disciples why they were so terrified and lacking in faith. An awe came over the disciples saying to one another, "Who can this be that the wind and the sea obey him?"

The setting of this passage is Jesus finished speaking to the crowds in parables. Jesus and his disciples are traveling by boat to a farther shore and Jesus falls asleep. A sudden squall happens on the Sea of Galilee which was common in the evening, and it can cause 7 - 8 foot waves and high winds.

Jesus rebukes the wind and sea with "Quiet! Be still!" and the winds and sea became still. The tone and manner Jesus rebukes the wind and sea is also the tone and manner Jesus rebukes unclean spirits and demons. Jesus again reveals another degree of himself to his disciples in his authority and power over the wind and water. Recall from the Book of Genesis 1:6-10 of God and the waters. Who else but God have such power and authority over creation. These disciples were truly awed by this teacher in their midst.

Being a fisherman, I have also been caught out on the water when a storm sudden brews up with wind and waves. This situation gives one an excellent opportunity to really ponder one's faith and fate.

Reflect on an experience you have had where Jesus would also have asked you, "Why are you so terrified? Why are you lacking in faith?"

FATHER'S DAY

St. Joseph gives us a model of fatherhood. There is little we know of Joseph other than what we find in the infancy narratives in the gospels of Matthew and Luke. He is said to be a "righteous man", husband of Mary, the father of Jesus and he was a carpenter. But he was some special in his fatherhood.

Fr. Jean-Jacques Olier, who founded the Society of St. Sulpice in the 17th century, argued that St. Joseph is unique among saints because of the mysterious bond that exists between him and God the Father. A multitude of saints have represented Christ in this or that aspect of their heroism, but only St. Joseph among all the saints, has a special vocation to represent God the Father. UPDATED COVID-19 MASS PROTOCOLS

- For the time being our Mass Schedule will remain the same (Sunday, 9am in Oak Park and 11am in Ferndale).
- Effective immediately people who have been fully vaccinated no longer will be required to wear masks at Mass. Of course, if you feel more comfortable continuing to wear a mask you may do so.
- Masks are still required for those who are not vaccinated and our Eucharistic Ministers.
- There will be a dedicated section of our worship locations where social distancing and face-coverings are consistently maintained. This section is for anyone, vaccinated or unvaccinated.
- Hand sanitizer stations will still be in our worship locations and you are encouraged to use them.
- We will resume the Sign of Peace with the normal wording, "Let us offer each other the sign of peace," allowing you and your family to make your own determinations about how widely to share some sign of peace. Please understand that some parishioners may not feel as comfortable sharing a sign of peace as you do and be respectful of their sensitivities.
- At times we may keep windows and/or doors open to ventilate our worship locations.
