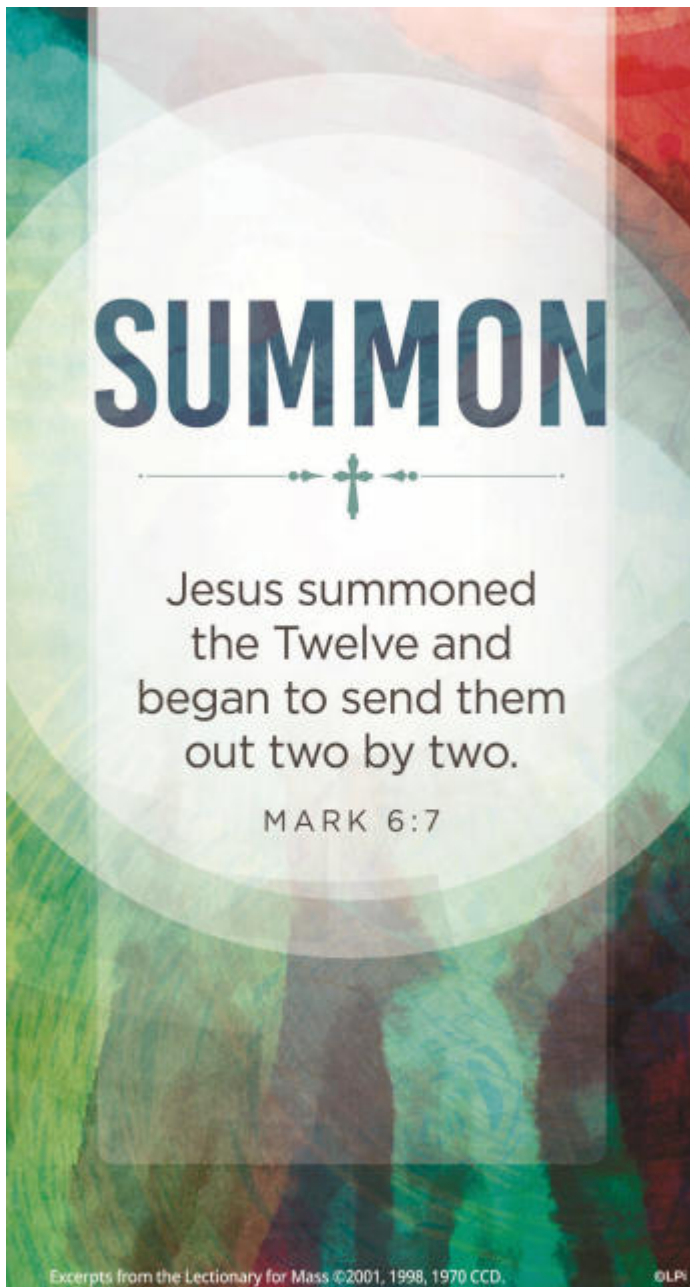

THE SUMMONS

Mk 6: 7-13

Jesus summons the Twelve and sends them out two by two and gives them the authority over unclean spirits. The Twelve are informed to take nothing on their journey except a walking stick and wear sandals. Jesus also told the Twelve, "whatever house you find yourself in, stay there until you leave the locality. If any place will not receive you or hear you, shake its dust from your feet in testimony against them as you leave." The Twelve went off preaching the need of repentance, expelling demons, anointing the sick with oil, and working cures.

Jesus leaves Nazareth rejected and is now teaching in neighboring villages. Jesus summons the Twelve (see Mk 3:13-19 for the names of the Twelve) and sends them out to various villages, two by two, giving them the authority over unclean spirits. The Twelve are instructed to only take a walking stick, wear sandals and the clothes on their back, nothing extra, nothing else. The Twelve are to live off the generosity of the one household they are at in that village for the duration of their time at that village while on their mission. By staying at just one household this would avoid rivalry between various households who also want to host the visitors.

Jesus also lets his disciples know they could be rejected by the people they are sent to. If the people will not receive them or listen to them then leave. The gesture of shaking dust from one's feet is a sermon showing the spiritual attitude of the people of that village. It marks that village and its population as heathen and unclean.

The Twelve go off two by two into various villages preaching repentance, expelling demons, anointing with oil, and working many cures. These Twelve men have now become itinerant preachers of the Kingdom of God, just as Jesus has been doing. With Jesus sharing and passing on his ministry and mission, He is revealing another degree of himself to the Twelve. The proclamation of the Kingdom of God does not begin and end with Jesus but is taken up and passed down from generation to generation starting with the Twelve.

"The Twelve could be his presence in many places at one time, in proclaiming the kingdom here and now. Hence, they were empowered to do precisely what he was doing: to preach, to heal, to exercise - the signs of the advent of the Kingdom of God." (Fr, Bruce Vawter, C.M. 1921-1986) *The Four Gospels*, Vol. 1, p. 245

In today's society, would you accept a summons to go off, two by two, and live off the generosity of others at various locations proclaiming the Kingdom of God while facing either acceptance or rejection of those you are preaching to? Put yourself in the place of one the Twelve going forth on this summons from Jesus.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS—WHAT WE CARRY FROM TOWN TO TOWN

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.
