By Leonard Piasta, Faith Formation Chair Thoughts on Next Week's Readings for 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time Gal 16:14-18 - To Boast But the Cross

Judaizers, Jewish Christian converts, were teaching that Gentile male converts to the Christian community not only be baptized but also circumcised. To the Jews, circumcision was a sign of the covenant between Israel and God. Paul writes to the Galatians that, "It means nothing whether one is circumcised or not." And, in a letter to the Romans he writes, "It is the same God who justifies the circumcised and the uncircumcised on the basis of faith." (Rm 3:30) Paul to the Galatians continues with, "All that matters is that one is created anew."

A most profound statement by Paul when he wrote, "May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ!" Paul recognizes that the Judaizers were boasting of their flesh, the Jewish rite of circumcision. But to Paul his major element and focus of his preaching is the cross and the crucified Jesus Christ. Paul writes to the Corinthians, "No, I determined that while I was with you, I would speak nothing but Jesus Christ and him crucified" (1Cor 2:2) and "I must go on boasting, however useless it may be, and speak of visions and revelations of the Lord."(2 Cor 12:1) The cross was the price of our redemption from sin.

Should we not also boast of the cross and the crucified Jesu Christ since we are baptized faithful members of the Catholic Church? St. Theodore the Studite (759-826) gives us a bases for boasting of the cross and Jesus crucified, "How precious the gift of the cross, how splendid to contemplate! In the cross there is no mingling of good and evil, as in the tree of paradise: it is wholly beautiful to behold and good to taste. The fruit of the tree is not death but life, not darkness but light. This tree does not cast us out of paradise but open the way for our return."

"May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ!"

LIVE THE LITHINGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.

St. Oliver Plunkett | July 1

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible.
