

#### St. Michael the Archangel Livonia



It is great to be back in a new position as the STEM teacher! My primary focus this year is to support teachers and students in grades 1-4 with engaging STEM activities that correlate with their science curriculum. Students in grades 1-4 have been busy learning how to work in teams, ask questions, make observations, plan investigations, collect data, analyze data, and communicate their findings with classmates. During the month of January, students have been working on coding. Aside from learning how to code, students learn how to be creative and develop their critical thinking skills. It is very rewarding to watch a student who has been struggling with solving a coding puzzle work through the puzzle and then

have that AHA moment where they figure it out!

Here are some grade-level highlights thus far:

First Grade:

First graders learned about several animal superpowers. One lesson involved investigating the relationship between different types of bird beaks and the type of food that bird would eat. They were able to showcase their architect skills by designing and building a structure out of various items. In December, Mrs. Blackmer and I teamed up during gym class to work on an unplugged coding lesson. This activity incorporated so many concepts for our first graders: learning cardinal directions, reading a map, giving/receiving hand signals to indicate directional changes. We are currently applying what we learned in those lessons in our coding activities using the iPads with a program called Blockly.





Second Grade:

Second graders have been very busy during the first two quarters of the school year! We explored the engineering of crayons and even made our own crayons by recycling broken crayons. They used their observing skills to figure out what was in the "Mystery Mixture." Students learned about force, gravity, and friction and how these concepts affect motion. Then they used their engineering skills in Newton's Doghouse Challenge. They enjoyed Fall related science activities making Apple Trappers and Gobble Wobblers!

Third Grade:

Third graders have had many experiences in STEM! They participated in a blind taste test, learned about human and natural impacts on sea turtles, and participated in a "fossil dig." Our main focus in the weeks prior to Christmas break was on Force and Motion. Third graders were trying to answer the question: Where will the marble be each time it changes direction in a half-pipe? They learned that motion exhibits a regular pattern thus future motion can be predicted and people can use measurements to describe motion in terms of direction and how far it moved. Students were very excited to have a former St. Michael alumni come and speak to them about how scientists use this concept in the real world. They participated in simulated activities using graphs to predict whether a meteor would crash into or by pass the Earth.







Fourth Grade:

At the beginning of the year, fourth graders participated in the program Every Kid Outdoors, spon-At the beginning of the year, fourth graders participated in the program Every Rid Outdoors, sponsored by the National Parks System. After completing the four weekly lessons, each student earned a free National Parks Pass giving them access to any of the national parks, lands and water for free until August 31, 2022. Students were excited to hopefully be able to visit some of these great places! We continued with a unit on Energy

in Motion by trying to answer the question: How does changing the speed of a marble affect the energy of that marble?


Where: Solanus Casey Center & On the Rise Bakery




