

## CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

It's been two weeks since several of our parishioners completed the book/program Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father by Fr. Donald Calloway. If you follow St. Priscilla on Facebook, you would have seen that every Tuesday evening, we had a discussion about what we had read the previous week. Early on in the program, my husband, Larry, joined me and brought humor in his costume, dad jokes, and sound clips. Prior to our study, many of the parishioners that picked up their book were reluctant about their commitment to reading something everyday for 33 days. Understandable, and frankly, I was worried that I would struggle through it myself (and I was the one leading it)! I know for a fact that not everyone was perfect throughout those 33 days, many had to "catch up" and a few probably didn't actually finish. And all of that is okay! I encourage everyone in the parish to do the study even if it takes you 33 weeks or even 33 months to finish the book.


To consecrate ourselves to God, or Our Mother Mary, or St. Joseph, means that we are entrusting ourselves to their care. For a majority of us, St. Joseph is a mystery and therefore there was/is even more reluctance to consecrate oneself to a saint in which so little is known. As a theological reflection book, this text is not one to take as an official teaching of the Church/Magisterium. The text does, however, bring many new perspectives for the reader to contemplate about St. Joseph and his role in the Holy Family and our own salvation. Many of our participants expressed how much their appreciation for St. Joseph had grown over the course of 33 days and I could literally feel their internal flame for the faith strengthened—it was a beautiful experience!

In addition to the book, I sent an email reflection each day to supplement the reading. The daily reflection would include further discussion from the text or I would reference the Catechism of the Catholic Church and how it related to what the reading was for the day. Additionally, I broke down two apostolic letters written about St. Joseph that wove perfectly into the readings. Those reflections are available for download

on the website link previously mentioned. One parishioner said that the reflections made it easier to digest the book, so I encourage you to use them!

The title of page 3 in the bulletin is "Faith Formation" and we can often associate that with catechism but forming faith is for all ages. My weekly articles are written to readers like you—readers of all ages and all walks of life—to look inward and ponder where your faith journey has taken you so far and where it is going. A study like Consecration to St. Joseph will help you form your faith! It is self-paced and will undoubtedly teach you something you didn't know before. All it takes is one small spark to light your faith-flame again. Perhaps it will come from the Consecration, or the Walking with Purpose Bible Study below, or volunteering at VBS. Maybe it will come from joining one of the committees, commissions, or ministries here at the parish. We have so many ways to help you form your faith throughout your faith journey! Don't let these opportunities to grow closer to Christ pass you by!




## SECOND READING

## THE WORD OF GOD AS THE BREATH OF LIFE

Having read the Epistles of John a long time ago, upon reading John (I John 4:11-16) today, I now feel overwhelmed by his insistence on the primacy of love as the basis for our relationship with God. Even though I learned at the age of five that *God made me to ...to love him*, it hadn't sunk in. Is the word "love" tossed around so frequently that it has lost its importance? In this short passage from John's First Epistle, the word "love" is used six times.

That we dwell in God and he dwells in us is beyond my human understanding; yet I believe in his Word. When I, *in awesome wonder*, admit my total inadequacy, I have my faith to lean on.

Human love is directed toward another person and needs to be expressed to that person (be it spouse or child or friend) and shown in affectionate ways. How can this happen in our relationship with Almighty God, since John says NO ONE HAS EVER SEEN GOD?

The word **Love** comes from a Greek word, **agape**, meaning **to be filled with good will and act on it**. When the Word of God, Jesus, was made flesh, Jesus revealed the divine nature and love of God. This divine love never changes. The hymn, **Abide with Me**, expresses this thought in a simple word: Abide.

Abide is to continue to be, to remain. When the two disciples at Emmaus begged Jesus to **stay with us**, they did not want to lose his presence; rather they yearned to identify with him in a way that they could not really understand.

In our everyday life, do we have any inkling of the depth of our relationship with God? Of how human life is lifted higher than we can even imagine? The impossible is possible! We are loved beyond limits.



And we **know** it because Jesus dwelt among us. This teaching is soul-shaking. The Offertory Prayer, ***By this mingling of water and wine, may we share in your divinity as you have shared in our humanity,***

...helps a little!

I must read John's epistle again and again!
