## COME HOLY SPIRIT

It is pretty hard for me to pick a "favorite" sacrament. They are all so important and it would make for a fun debate to discuss which one is the "most important." I mean, baptism is a pretty big deal. Thankfully, anyone can baptize someone else in case of an emergency. So even if we ran out of priests and the sacrament of Holy Orders was no more (which means Eucharist, Reconciliation, Confirmation, etc. would be gone too) we would still have baptism. But today, I want to share my argument for Confirmation ...because today, at our 11am Mass, we will be celebrating Confirmation for a group of teens that made it through the COVID 2020-2021 years.

Shortly after we are born, we are baptized. And although we receive the Holy Spirit in the anointing during baptism, we are unable to defend ourselves much less our faith because we are babies in both age and in our faith journey. We are "strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation (CCC 1212)" and because we are strengthened, we become "true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed (CCC 1285)." For a majority of us, today's Confirmandi included, this strength of the Holy Spirit is given to us as teens...which is much different than when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples on Pentecost.

So the question is, how can we be true witnesses of Christ? How can we stand up against evil? How can we truly embrace such a significant sacrament? To answer this, simply look at the disciples. Even though they were adults, they were young in their faith too. They had met Jesus only 3 years prior—maybe even less depending on when they joined Jesus during his ministry! Although they were in the early stages of their faith journey, they grew the Church across thousands of miles and to millions of hearts! Thus, the point you are at on your journey is no barrier.

However, even though the disciples were new to the New Covenant—the Gospel that Jesus died and resurrected so that we may have newness of life—the disciples knew the ways of the Old Covenant. They knew the commandments and the laws. They may not have followed them all the

time, of course, because just like us, the disciples were sinners too. The difference between a disciple that grew the Early Church and a disciple today, is their belief that Christ truly died and rose again for them. It was more than just something they professed during a Sunday Mass. This belief *defined* their life. No matter what evil they were presented with, they never denied what they knew to be True. And it was the strength and gifts of the Holy Spirit that enabled them to stand so firm in their faith. It was radical at the time! And let's be honest, it is still very much a radical idea to *truly* worship Jesus as our Lord and Savior. Thus, I pray every year that our Confirmandi understand what a momentous gift it is to receive the same exact Holy Spirit that descended upon the disciples. The same Spirit that grew the Church 2000 years ago descends upon every confirmed person with the same exact strength to grow the Church today...but only if we truly embrace him.

## GOSPEL Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

## THE WORD OF GOD AS THE BREATH OF LIFE

### *The blood of the new and everlasting covenant*

is proclaimed at every Mass. These words have an historic link with the event described in today's reading from Exodus. In the Gospel of Mark Jesus' Apostles all drink from a cup and listen to his words: ***This is the blood of the Covenant which shall be shed for many*** (Mark 4:24)

Long before the farewell words of Moses in last Sunday's reading, today a younger Moses has spoken to the Israelites. He told them about his message from the Lord and they promised to keep all the words of the Lord. He erected an altar as well as twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Two rituals followed: ***splashing*** blood from the sacrifices on the altar and ***sprinkling*** blood on the people, thus sealing the new covenant between the people and God. Again the people promise to keep and heed all that the Lord has said.

This blood ritual is strange to us, yet to the Israelites ... ***sharing blood symbolized the unity of God and the people; they are joined as one family by blood*** (Lector Workbook, p.204). (Until Jesus walked among them, God was never addressed as Father; now we are family!)

Twice in today's narrative the Israelites promised to do all that the Lord had set forth in the Covenant. When they did enter the promised land many years later, this resolve given in the surge of enthusiasm was often breached. The rousing preaching of John the Baptism and the baptism in the Jordan River of his eager listeners helped the Jews to recall the excitement of their ancestors as the blood of the sacrifices was sprinkled on them.

Thousands of years have gone by since these words were spoken and yet the ancient rite speaks to us as we experience a great silence befitting the holy moment that pervades our parish church when the words of consecration are spoken. This ritual which took place more than three thousand years ago is now recalled in the Eucharistic prayer. As we renew our desire to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, we are strengthened during the Mass to renew our covenant!

## PARISH NURSE MINISTRY

### Summertime is often travel time. Here are 8 ways to become a safer driver.

**Get refitted.** Are you sitting the appropriate distance from the steering wheel? Are your mirrors adjusted properly? Attend a free virtual CarFit an educational program created in collaboration with AAA and AARP. In 90 minutes CarFit instructors will show you how to take proper measurement to improve your visibility and vehicle control. Visit [car-fit.org](http://car-fit.org) to sign up.

**Keep your body fit.** You may be sitting, but driving can be a demanding physical activity. Staying active is really a good thing to do because it reinforces that mind-body connection. It helps with your balance and strength. Be sure to keep up, or boost your fitness routine. A good guideline is to get 30 minutes of light cardio or resistance strength exercise per day.

**End the multitasking.** If you've been driving for a long time you may feel you can do it without thinking. So, we fuss with the phone, play radio, drink coffee, get into deep conversations while still driving. All these put you at a risk of accidents, particularly as your reaction time and overall vision decrease. Everyday, eight people are killed in car crashes involving a distracted driver. Make a conscious effort to focus more on the road and less on everything else.

**Get better acquainted with your car.** Car technology has advanced rapidly in recent years, with lane-drifting alerts, parking sensors and other safety features. Some may not feel confident with using all the tech their cars offer. Take AARP's free online smart drivers workshop online to learn about the modern safety technology. Read the car manual and follow the guidelines.

**Do a quick safety check.** Be more conscious about taking your time before starting your drive. You are more at risk if you hop in and go before adjusting the seat and mirrors and seat belts. It also helps to think through your route before setting off.

**Increase your distance.** It is important to keep pace with traffic, but a little extra space between you and other cars can't hurt. Remember the three-second rule: Pick a stationary object alongside the road ahead. Note when the back of the car in front of you passes the object. The front of your car should come to that object at least three seconds later.

**Get monitored.** Insurance companies have offered rate discounts to drivers who outfit their cars with a monitoring device. These programs can give you feedback on your driving. So if you are speeding, driving too slowly, taking corners too quick, accelerating too quickly or slamming on your brakes, you will learn this in your driving report. That can help you correct bad habits or behaviors before you end up getting a ticket or causing an accident.

**Make pain go away.** Sometimes driving can cause discomfort, especially in the neck, shoulder or hands. And in turn can make driving more difficult. If you experience pain you should make an appointment with an occupational therapist who specializes in driving. Such a professional can also help you identify adaptive features that can be added to your car as well as other adjustments that can be made.
