

FAITH FORMATION

"God wants us in community and our enemy wants us isolated." -Unknown

Last Sunday evening, my husband (Larry) and I listened to part of an interview between Jordan Peterson and Laurie Penny. Laurie Penny is the author of a book titled Sexual Revolution: Modern Fascism and the Feminist Fightback. My husband shared this portion with me because it discussed the link between the Christianity and feminism. This portion was interesting because the author was trying to focus on the empowerment of women and how to protect women from sexual abuse. Of course this is an issue but I am not sure if the author was as effective in making her point as she might have thought. If you have ever listened to Jordan Peterson, then you would know that he does well at agreeing with the person he is interviewing while also disagreeing.

This brought a "tangent" type discussion between me and my husband. Actually, Larry and I discuss the role of husbands/dads in the family unit guite a bit. Men are to protect their wife and children. We know this not because of what society says but because that is what we learn in the Bible. Not only were Adam and Eve united at their creation but every family thereafter were united to each other. Women were to live with their parents until they were married. The father of the woman was the protector until the husband took the role of protector. If the woman became a widow, then the late husband's brother became the widow's protector. No matter the situation, the woman was always protected--either by her husband or close family. If there was no family to protect her, the community stepped up to be the protector. This teaching continued beyond the Old Testament and carried into the New.

Women are strong. However, a woman's strength is not the same as a man's. The initial feminist movement was to give women the right to vote, own property (which she would lose at the death of her husband prior), own a business or work if she desired. These intentions were great and most of the intentions by the initial movement were to help women when their husband would pass away. It gave women the ability to care for their children when her husband was no longer able to. Over time, US culture has shifted from a community mindset that was taught by the Church to a culture of "self-empowerment" that is demonstrated by self- sufficiency. This sufficiency is defined by a financial display and resisting the urge to ask others for help. I am not going to say correlation

equals causation, but I will share some statistics and a timeline. Take what you want from this information. To me, it seems like the initial feminist movement has given way to a modern feminism movement that has lied to women. It does not give them empowerment. It has given women a life on their own and means women must face the many hurdles of life without the protection of a man or a community as God intended. I do hope this information provides you a new way to interpret the phrase "love thy neighbor":

The transformation in living alone has resulted in farreaching social, economic and political consequences that stretch across America's cities and states. Those consequences include housing construction, homeownership, household income, consumption patterns, meal products, savings, health care, leisure activities, safety, elder assistance and voting behavior... Throughout the 19th century and up to the mid 20th century, no more than several percent of American adults lived alone. In 1850, for example, 74,000 adults lived alone, representing less than 1 percent of the U.S. population aged 18 years and older. By 1950, the proportion living alone increased to 4 percent of the adult population, about 4 million Americans. However, since 1950, the proportion of adults living alone in the U.S. has tripled to about 15 percent. Approximately 36 million men and women now live alone, representing a record high of 28 percent of all U.S. households. Median ages at first marriage have also increased markedly over the recent past. For example, whereas the median ages at first marriage in 1950 were 20 years for women and 22 years for men, today those ages are 28 years for women and 30 years for men. The proportion of Americans living alone varies considerably by age and sex. While about 5 percent of adults below age 25 years live alone, the proportion doubles to about 12 percent for ages 25 to 64 years, nearly doubles again to 22 percent for those aged 65 to 74 years and jumps to approximately 33 percent for those aged 75 years and older.

Before age 65, men are more likely to live alone than women. After age 65, however, that trend reverses. Approximately 80 percent of the elderly living alone in America are women. At ages 75 and older, the proportion of women living alone is close to double that of men, 45 versus 23 percent. This reversal in living alone among elderly Americans is largely due to women's higher life expectancies, younger ages at first marriage and lower likelihood to remarry.(Excerpt from thehill.com article "Living Alone in America")



THE WORD OF GOD AS THE BREATH OF LIFE by Mary Rice

The story of Abraham (Abram) just won't die! To this day we speak his name respectfully. He is our father in faith and obedience.

When his father, Terah, moves his family from Ur of the Chaldeans to a place called Haran, Abram with his wife and uncle (Lot) go with him and live there about two years. (One way to remember this event is to think of his family as the SALT of the earth Sarai, Abram, Lot, and Terah.)

Terah dies in Haran and the Lord speaks to Abram in words he cannot forget nor understand: Go from your country and your kindred and go to a land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great so that you will be a blessing...

Without question Abram follows this vague instruction and, on his way, builds an altar to the Lord and calls on the name of the Lord. Later the Lord promises him that he will give him and his descendants all the land that he can see in any direction.

There's one problem: Abram and his wife are very old and do not have any children--and they are not youngsters, The writer of the Epistle to the Hebrews deals with this directly: By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive...since she considered him faithful who had promised. Their descendants were as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.

He is honored through the ages for his unyielding faith in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. Jesus himself spoke of him: Before Abraham came to be, I am. Matthew and Luke both make reference to Abraham in their ancestries of Jesus. You can feel the family loyalty in these lists of ancestors. There is a certainty that Abraham did not question God:

Abraham did as God directed him.

How does God direct us today? Do we follow Abraham's example? Do you wish that you had specific instructions regarding the quandaries of life? I do. Our faith directs us to pray that God will give us direction and guidance in the decisive moments of our lives. Paul speaks of faith, hope, and love. Clinging to these qualities forms a stronghold for trust. Our Responsorial Psalm for today gives us words of strength:

O Lord, let your mercy be upon us, as we place our trust in you.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

– Father John Muir

As a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too...my sister!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one who actually saw her. Blinded by familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.

Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him." The Son is always bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him? Perhaps only the lovers are the ones who properly see.



SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

March 5, 2023

Early in the 1900s, long before Vatican II, Pope St. Pius X encouraged active and conscious participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass:

"The Holy Mass is a prayer itself, even the highest prayer that exists. It is the Sacrifice,

dedicated by our Redeemer at the Cross, and repeated every day on the Altar. If you wish to hear Mass as it should be heard, you must follow with eye, heart, and mouth all that happens at the Altar. Further, you must pray with the Priest the holy words said by him. You have to associate your heart with the holy feelings which are contained in these words and in this manner you ought to follow all that happens on the Altar. When acting in this way, you have prayed Holy Mass."

Did You Know...In recent years, more and more parishes have begun to reincorporate the use of some Latin, especially on important holy days such as Easter and Christmas, and during the two liturgical seasons of preparation— Lent and Advent.
