## THE NATIVITY of the Lord

"For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord." - 1k 2:11

xcerpts from the Lectionary for Mass 02001, 1995, 1970 CCD.

## JERRY'S JOURNAL

When the authors of the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John wrote their accounts of the birth of Jesus Christ, they saw, in the nativity of the Messiah, parallels to His ministry, death and resurrection. Recall that the Gospels were written sometime between 35 to 70 years after the birth of Jesus. This gave the Evangelists time to ponder and put into context how the pattern of the events of Bethlehem are linked to the cross on Calvary and the empty tomb of that first Easter morning.

When the Word became Flesh and came into the world on the day we now refer to as Christmas, some rejoiced at His birth (shepherds and the Magi) while others (Herod and his courtiers) were deeply disturbed by the incarnation of the King of kings and the Lord of Lords. Consequently, they sought to put Him to death. When Jesus began His public ministry some (the Disciples) followed Him while others (the Scribes and the Pharisees) plotted to have Him executed. For some, the words of Jesus were a source of joy and inspiration, while for others, those same words were anguish and misery.

The following is the adult message of Christ and the meaning of Christmas and how it is intrinsically linked to an even greater event which relates to our faith - The Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The meaning of Christmas is understood as realizing how the wooden crib of Bethlehem foreshadows the wood of the cross and swaddling clothes represent the burial shroud that was placed around the body of Christ as he was interred into the tomb. It would be time well spent to reflect on the mysterious revelation of Christ's Incarnation not just as a sentimental event that is to be situated in a fantasia of winter themes, Christmas trees and merriment on and around December 25th, but as an event which is incomparably and inescapably important all year round and into eternity. Such reflection goes far beyond the stuff of elves, eight tiny reindeer and Santa Claus. This is not to say that these things do not have their place. They do. The ecstasy of Christmas captures the meaning of the Holy Day we celebrate each year as we sing The First Noel, Joy to the World and various other Christmas Carols. God has given us permission to be happy.

At Christmas the crib takes precedence over the cross, but the cross never fully vanishes, evaporates or disappears. Christmas is meant not to disturb us, but to lead us to ponder, as Mary did when she contemplated in her heart all the things that had taken place when she gave birth to her first-born son. What we can ponder or reflect on at Christmas is that God has given us a joy that no one can take away from us. People we love and care for will still become ill or return home to the Lord. It is still possible we may lose a job, be rejected by a friend or a spouse. None of us can ever hope to entirely escape pain and suffering. We are meant to live in joy, even as we live in pain, because the resurrection of Jesus Christ points to an even greater joy, a superior and more magnificent reality which awaits us on a day and hour we do not yet know.

Even when the childhood joy of our Christmas has faded into memories of the past, and all the cribs, festivities, lights, cards, colorful wrapping paper, and gifts no longer bring us the same thrill of our youth, the invitation still remains the same: Celebrate Christmas, be happy. The crib and the cross are one in the sense that we have been given a joy no one can take from us — that we are one with God in both this world and the next.

Christmas, as the old proverb poetically puts it, "gives us the permission to plunge headlong into the pudding" because of what God has done for us. God has given us a Lord and Savior who offers to us eternal life. Go forward, celebrate, take the plunge because of the greatest gift we have been given – Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

First things first. I hope everyone had a blessed and bountiful Christmas. I want to thank everyone who sent me a card, gift, or offered a prayer for me and my family. I try to reach everyone personally but sometimes that is not possible, so THANK YOU one and all! I'll be starting my thank you calls after the 1st because we are closed the week between Christmas and New Years. So I will wish all of you a happy and blessed New Year as well. May Father, Son, and Holy Spirit come upon you and your family and make 2022 a joyous and prosperous year as you proclaim the gospel by your lives! Thanks be to God!

Family and friends are very important things to have in our lives. The support, concern, and love we receive from family and friends as well as giving it back gives us strength, courage, and commitment. There is no guarantee that things will always be hunky-dory and in fact, life isn't that way at all. We can get lost or lose someone. The only thing life has to offer with respect to consistency is that the one constant is inconsistency. That is why we need family and friends to be a part of our lives as a support system. We need people to look after us, especially if we get "lost." We in turn, must look after our family and friends as well.

The Holy Family was no different. Today's gospel is a prime example of, "I thought he was with you!" Imagine the fear, anxiety, and sense of loss Mary and Joseph felt when they found out that Jesus wasn't with them. He was "lost." Now remember how you felt when you suffered "loss" in any way, shape, or form. We all get that "sinking feeling" in our souls, our very being, when that happens. It would be like being on the Titanic and knowing that we were not getting into a life boat because they are all gone.

Joseph and Mary, once they discover their loss, did the logical thing and retrace their steps. They retrace them all the way back to Jerusalem, to the Temple. They find what they lost, Jesus, teaching in the Temple. What do we find in the profound "innocence" and great logic and wisdom of Jesus when asked "why did you do this to us?" The twelve year old Jesus answers, "Really you were worried? Didn't you know that I must be in my Father's house?" Now if you were a parent and your child disappeared for several days what would your response have been to that question?

We don't hear what Mary and Joseph's reaction is do we? Nope, sure don't. That is because we should put ourselves in their place and respond with mercy, kindness, compassion, and explain why they reacted the way they did and what they felt was the proper way things needed to be done. We get a glimpse that is what happened when Jesus left the Temple and returned with them to Nazareth and was "obedient to them."

This Holy Family example is a model for all of us to follow, whether we have children or not. When we are confronted with loss, or any problem for that matter, we must take the time to let go of emotional reactions as best we can, take a step back and logically approach the issue. We need to use our support system and realize that we are not alone. Then we can "retrace our steps" and deal with the confrontation using mercy, kindness, compassion, and allow God to be a part of the solution.

If we can do this we will can see God's....

#### Stewardship Ties

There is a lot of imagery around Christmas that has to do with adoption — or, more specifically, with a child being loved by another as if they belonged to that person and loved in such a profound way that in time, they do come to belong to that person.

We see this with Joseph and the infant Jesus. Joseph is not Jesus' biological father. But through a series of actions, and through his faithfulness in small, everyday matters, Joseph becomes the foster father of Jesus.

Perhaps we are parents who have adopted children, or we ourselves were adopted. We have also seen how, through a series of actions of love and sacrifice, someone can become the parent of a person who is not their "blood." A lot of times these families celebrate the day of the adoption. I've heard it called a "gotcha day," and it's marked joyously, like a birthday.

Most of us are not descended from the Israelites, God's Chosen People. But through a series of extraordinary actions of love and sacrifice, God has made Himself our parent, too. And through our own actions, and through faithfulness in small and everyday matters, we are His children.

But in this family, instead of blood ties, we have stewardship ties. It's not about who we look like, it's about how we treat one another. How we take care of one another.

So this Christmas, let's think about how we will celebrate our adoption. As much as it is Jesus' birthday, it's also our "gotcha day" — the day we received the gift of eternal family.
