"MARC" MY WORDS

Today's Gospel story has Peter and company "striking out" while fishing overnight, which for them would have been the best opportunity to haul in a big catch. Yet they catch nothing. Remember that they were fishermen by trade and had the skills to be able to earn a living at fishing. Despite all of their skills they still came up empty on their own.

Now Jesus enters the scene by getting in their boat. He tells Peter and company, the experts, that he has a better way. Jesus gives them directions to put back out into deep water this time and to lower their nets for a catch. Peter, despite his knowledge and "expertise" acquiesces to Jesus' directions despite them being contrary to the "norm." Lo and behold, by listening to Jesus they haul in a catch so big their nets were breaking. Peter and company were definitely out of their comfort zone and had to call for assistance from another boat.


I have a couple of thoughts about this Gospel passage. First, what we think is best may not be in God's eyes and it may not be a part of God's plan for us as individuals, as a parish, a Church, and as a nation. This is also the reason we may think prayers go unanswered because the answer is no or I have something in mind that is

better for you. We must realize that God's plan is what is best for us. Second, when we listen to God and go all in with his plan for us, we can do great things, well beyond what we could ever do on our own.

We, too, are called to put out into deep water and risk the unknown or uncertain. Yes, it may

make us uncomfortable.

We, like Peter and company, can call for assistance. Jesus will be with us throughout our "fishing expedition." We must remember that when we journey out into deep water to see what God is calling us to by dropping our nets and wearing our faith on the outside, we cast off the darkness of secularism and media hype. We put on Christ and we will always have Jesus with us because we are all in the same boat, his boat. Jesus will help us if we listen to his directions and abide by God's will. We, like Peter and company, just might be surprised by what we haul in. At the very least



we will haul in God's...




The women of St. Paul of Tarsus are invited to the next Book Club meeting hosted by the Women of Faith.



Choose Fats Your Heart Will Love

We need fat in our diet for good health. Healthy fats such as polyunsaturated, monounsaturated and omega-3 fats may lower cholesterol, be beneficial for heart health, keep your appetite more satisfied and help with weight control. To get more omega-3 fats, eat a four ounce portion of fish such as albacore tuna, lake trout, mackerel, salmon or sardines at least twice a week. Plant based sources include walnuts, sunflower seeds and flaxseed oil, canola oil, and soybean oil. Monounsaturated fat can be found in natural peanut butter, avocado and peanuts. Olive, peanut, soybean and sesame oils are rich in monounsaturated fat and vitamin E which is an antioxidant. Corn, sunflower and safflower oils are high in polyunsaturated fat. Most nuts and seeds are good sources of polyunsaturated and monounsaturated fats but go easy on them since they are also high in calories. **Keep your heart happy and in good shape by choosing healthy fats.**

Respect Life - Looking Back and Looking Forward

January 22, 2025 marked the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade* (the anniversary of the original 1973 Supreme Court decision overturning all restrictions on abortion). The ruling that legalized abortion and ended the lives of millions of innocent babies. **Roe** was overturned on June 24, 2022, but its horrific legacy of abortion remains. **The law returned the matter to the states.**

Pro-abortion ballot measures were quickly introduced and were won in 7 out of 10 states in 2024, enshrining the so-called “right to abortion” in state constitutions. Unfortunately, Michigan lead the way when Proposal 3 passed on November 8, 2022. Under Proposal 3, Michigan no longer required parental consent, physicians only perform abortions, or a limit to or when an abortion can happen in a pregnancy.

Consequently, abortion numbers are on the rise in Michigan. In 2023, a total of 28,491 abortions were reported by county. Macomb county was near the top (3,166) bested by Oakland (3,415), and Wayne County including the City of Detroit (10,822). Source: Table H1, 2013-2023 vitalstats.michigan.gov.

In Michigan, chemical abortions using the abortion pill account for more than 50% of all abortions in the state. Mail-Order abortion pill numbers continue to increase because they are a time and cost-saving measure for abortion facilities. No in-person doctor visits required! Girls and women are being manipulated, misled, and encouraged to kill their unborn children in the privacy of their dorm room or home. **Abortion can be a traumatic experience for both women and men. Although abortion is a choice that women in Michigan can make, it is a choice that can lead to harmful after-effects, physically and emotionally.**

According to Jeannie Mancini, President of 2025 March for Life, 60% of women would choose life for their babies if they had emotional and financial support. There are more than **100** pregnancy resource centers in Michigan that offer free medical, spiritual and financial support even after the baby is born. 

- ◆ Connections to cotton candy or popcorn machines?


