The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

"May you know what is the hope that belongs to His call."



Jesus Christ is Risen! *He is Risen indeed!*

Jesus Christ is Risen. *He is Risen indeed!*

Imagine, beyond your wildest imagination, the One Who died a horrendous death is now back! He is with you, you share life with Him, talk to Him, you rejoice in the fact that you know He can never die again—He is with you forever. Or so you think.

And then the unthinkable happens: He tells you He is leaving. But He says that it's important, because if He doesn't leave, the Spirit will not come. Eleven guys have to make one of the hardest decisions of their lives. Do they trust Him? They know nothing about the Spirit; it is inconceivable to them that anything could possibly be as good as having Him with them. But they have had to trust Him before. They had to trust Him when so many, maybe even most, of the disciples walked away because they could not imagine how He could give them His Body and Blood to eat. They had chosen to stay and to trust Him, and that trust was radically rewarded at His Last Supper. There it was all made clear, and they not only witnessed the miracle, but received Him and then were given power to perform this miracle themselves, so that His People could always have access to His Body and Blood. They knew that it always paid to trust Him.

Now He tells them that it is best that the Spirit come. They know nothing of the Spirit, except what the Lord Jesus had taught them, which wasn't much to go on, compared with the loss of His actual presence. Today, they watch Him ascend to Heaven, to, as He puts it, "My God and your God."

Then, there they were, in the upper room, for what must have been the ten longest days of their lives. All they had was hope: hope that He was right, that somehow the Spirit's coming would make it all worthwhile. And then, the Fire descended, and their hope was fulfilled and in the power of that Holy Spirit they experi-

enced His Presence like never before, knowing Him as a Presence that would never leave them. They began to share His Gospel, even as He confirmed the Word by the signs that accompanied their proclamation.

Now we gather to celebrate the Ascension, but, unlike the Apostles, we know what happens next. We know that God the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Most Holy Trinity, descended on that upper room and transformed those men and women into great men and women of God, filling them with courage, wisdom, and love so that they could be the beginnings of His Church. Their faith in the Lord Jesus and their hope in His promises were perfectly fulfilled.

What about us? What are the challenges to our hope that we face this Ascension? For many, this has been a hard year, a hard two years. The challenges to our hope have been severe. I know personally, the assaults on my hope because what has happened politically, ecclesially, and medically has been very hard to deal with. It seemed so often that every time it couldn't get worse, there was a leap into a whole new level of crazy, or a whole new set of symptoms, or whatever.

But I have to share with you, that being at our Christ the King Baccalaureate Mass for our graduating seniors was the brightest testimony to hope that I have seen in a long time. These young men and women: so talented, so gifted, so much to offer, and so willing to fight the good fight of faith. The Lord Jesus is important to them and they want to follow Him—in a variety of different ways, yet united in the gift of faith they have received from their parents, and, hopefully, the parish had something to do with that, too. It really rekindled my hope to see them and it was such a blessing to hear their parents honor them. So much faith, so much hope, and yes, so much love.

As we await a new anointing on Pentecost, there is much reason for all of us to hope. The King Rules! Even so, come, Lord Jesus, send Your Spirit! Bring us hope! — *Fr. Ed Fride*
