**The Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
*"Lord, let Your mercy be on us as we place our trust in You."*



Whom do you trust? The responsorial Psalm quoted above reminds us in Whom we should put our trust. But do we? If we took a poll and asked folks here, "Do you trust Jesus?" the majority of folks would, in all likelihood, say, "Yes." But do we actually live in a way that demonstrates that? Do we trust Him enough so that the

circumstances of this fallen world and our fallen nature do not rob us of our joy? Do we walk in a certain basic serenity because we trust Him?

The prior question that some would ask is, "Why should I trust Him?" The first reading gives us an adequate answer for this: He loves us enough to have gone through a horrendous passion and death for our sake, that we would be restored in our relationship with His Father and have, as one of the Prefaces in the Mass proclaims, the "gates of Heaven" unlocked for us! Everything He did and does shows His love for us.

The Psalm gives us the ultimate rationale for trusting Him: "Upright is the word of the LORD, and all His works are trustworthy." As we read the Scriptures, as we see how He responds to those who trust in Him, we are given practical examples of what happens when we place all our trust in Him—for ourselves, for our families, for our parish, etc. We see how absolutely trustworthy He is.

It is really an amazing thing, to have a Savior Who is both omnipotent and loves us beyond words! The consequence of this should be an increase in our ability to do what the second reading invites us to do: "So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help."

But do we trust Him? Trusting Him in the theoretical is one thing; trusting Him in the practical may be quite something different. A spiritual director of mine once helped me to see how my trust in Him at that time was more theoretical than practical. We

had been discussing my approach to tithing, which was that I set aside ten percent of my monthly income. If I had it left at the end of the month I gave it; if not, I didn't. He suggested that if I really trusted the Lord Jesus, I would simply give it at the beginning of the month and trust Him. At that time, I was working almost full-time as I was studying for one of my B.A.s. Frequently, I would experience more month left over at the end of my available cash. It was not infrequent that I'd give my twin sister a call to see what she was having for dinner, hint, hint.

When my spiritual director pointed out that the way I was living demonstrated that I didn't really trust Him when it came to the most basic issues, like money, my first reaction was to feel angry, like he had insulted my relationship with Jesus. He hadn't. He'd simply pointed out how my choices were not consistent with how I thought I was living. I believed I was trusting Him, but then I acted like I really needed to hedge my bets to protect myself.

So, after some soul searching (and perhaps a Confession), I decided to try it the way he had suggested. I would give my tithe at the beginning of the month and trust that, as I made good decisions, living for Him, things would work out. It was somewhat amusingly embarrassing to see what a difference it made, especially since I had been busy telling the folks I was evangelizing on campus how much we should trust in Him, and yet, in a very practical way, I was not! But then when I, literally, put my "money where my mouth was," things actually worked so much better.

Some have erroneously extrapolated that kind of approach into a "give to get" prosperity Gospel, which is certainly not how the Church understands it. On the contrary, for me it was more of an experience that my approach had basically put me at the center instead of Him in this very practical matter. When He was back in the center, then my whole life just worked better, since I was now living in the way I was intended to live. As the old slogan says, "If God is your co-pilot, switch seats!" — *Fr. Ed Fride*




