## The Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

*"Keep...all His statutes and commandments...and thus have long life."*



The Scriptures this weekend have a focus on the Commandments. The Scripture quoted above provides one of the key reasons why they should be followed.

There are actually a variety of reasons why the Commandments are important. The most obvious one is that the Commandments should be followed because they are, as it were, Commandments! One of the significant difficulties that we face as followers of the Lord Jesus is the increasing tendency in our society to treat them more and more like the “ten suggestions.”

The irony is that the criminal justice system in virtually every state was at one time based on the Ten Commandments. While it is the case that the value of many of the Commandments can simply be derived from the natural law—i.e., ethical norms apparent from the use of reason—there are some Commandments which can only be known through revelation. Those Commandments, too, were actually enshrined in law in many locations. For example, many jurisdictions had so-called “Blue Laws,” which forbade or restricted the activities that could happen on a Sunday. States also had laws that made abusing the Name of Jesus a criminal act. The Michigan statute read, “Cursing and swearing—Any person who has arrived at the age of discretion, who shall profanely curse or damn or swear by the name of God, Jesus Christ or the Holy Ghost, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.” (750.103). How things have changed.

Of course, the followers of the Lord Jesus have a much better reason than simply the legal aspect. We do it for love of Jesus, as He Himself taught us: “If you love Me, keep My Commandments.” (John 14:15). That simple conditional can be logically restated in the negative: If you don’t keep My Commandments, then you don’t love Me.


What would an examination of our actions say about our love for the King of Kings, using this Scripture as a guide? Do we love

Him enough to truly put Him first, to actually honor His Day, to honor His Name? When the Church gives us lectionary readings about the Commandments, She is giving a not-so-subtle hint that reflecting on our actual observance of the Commandments might be a good idea.

The third section of the *Catechism*, “Life in Christ,” has an excellent section on the Commandments. The descriptions, rationales, consequences, and examples of the Commandments provide excellent material for reflection, as individuals and as families. It is crucial for parents especially to note that our kids are very observant. How we treat the Commandments can either enforce or inhibit our kids’ developing a “cafeteria Catholic” attitude, i.e., that “pick and choose” attitude among the teachings and practices of the Church that is becoming so common today. In this context, we encourage a “cafeteria Catholic” attitude if we follow this Commandment, but don’t really follow that one, etc., etc. For example, we are very observant about not stealing, but, besides Mass, we blow off Sunday like it was just another day. Or we are observant about the aspects of the 6th Commandment, but are pretty free with detraction and calumny, even of leaders in the Church. The holiness that the King of Kings calls us to extends across the Commandments—all of them.

Of course, very crucial is the fact that the Commandments were designed by God with us in mind: when we live His way, we are choosing to live in a way that is most consistent with how we were actually created to live. Violating the Commandments is not only sinful but it is an act against our own best interests!

Our lives are always better lived when we do things His way. Let us do it especially for love of Him! But we must always remember that our growth in holiness is a process, a marathon, not a sprint! We cannot do it on our own, but even with His help, it takes time and effort and much patience, especially with ourselves! But if we call on Him, He will always be there! —Fr. Ed Fride


