## Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

*"His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away,  
His Kingship shall not be destroyed."*



Do we believe that, that it is true that He has an everlasting dominion that shall not, cannot be taken away? If we do, do we also believe that it is describing a "here and now" situation and not just some unearthly, heavenly reality? When Pope Pius XI instituted this feast for the Church, he did so because he felt that there were many competing ideologies also claiming

to have that level of dominion over the life of humanity. He wanted to make it perfectly clear to both the world and especially all the Catholic faithful that the Catholic Church teaches the absolute supremacy of the Lord Jesus over all. There are no others who can claim the right of dominion over us. This same proclamation was given by Pope St. John Paul the Great in his first encyclical, *Redemptor Hominis* (The Redeemer of Man): "THE REDEEMER OF MAN, Jesus Christ, is the center of the universe and of history." He is the center, He is the King.

But is He *our* center, is He *our* King? The irony is that this omnipotent King, through Whom the universe was created and continues to exist, awaits a response from us in order to truly be King in our lives. This response is conversion. It involves us surrendering to that Kingship, as Pope St. John Paul the Great specifies in his encyclical *Redemptoris Missio* (The Mission of the Redeemer): "Conversion means accepting, by a personal decision, the saving sovereignty of Christ and becoming his disciple." But notice that the Holy Father's definition of conversion is such that it is not a "one and done" situation. It involves "becoming" His disciple, which is a life-long endeavor.

Part of that endeavor involves us becoming aware of influences in our lives that threaten to usurp the role in our lives and hearts that the Kingship of the Lord Jesus is meant to exclusively possess. Often the most potent of these usurpers are the circumstances

that we find ourselves in. Especially now, when there are so many attacks on the Church, on the Christian way of life, on so many of the things we value and hold most dear, it seems there are many circumstances that are calculated to get us to reduce the sovereignty of the Lord Jesus in our lives. How do we respond when loved ones, who were very close to Jesus, die? How do we respond when our livelihoods are jeopardized by unjust situations beyond our control? How do we respond to any of the multiple invitations we receive to reject the Lord Jesus and take back control of our lives?

It can be helpful to remember that, as Scripture says, we war not against flesh and blood, but against a spiritual enemy, who has been lying to us since the beginning. His lies today include: you can't trust the Lord Jesus, the Lord Jesus doesn't care, the Lord Jesus can't do anything about it anyway, and, the ultimate lie, the Lord Jesus doesn't love you or your family.

The antidote to lies is always the truth. What is the truth? "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son." That Son loves each and every one of us enough to die for us. That Son sends us His Spirit that we might have the wisdom and the strength to fight back. That Son places us safely in the heart of His Precious Bride, the Church, where He feeds us with the ultimate gift: His very Body and Blood.

When surrounded by lies, especially lies that seem particularly compelling, we must immerse ourselves in the truth, especially the truth of His Word. If we ask ourselves honestly, "Do the lies seem to be winning?" and the answer is, "Yes," then we need to up the antidote. Fight spiritual battles with our spiritual weapons: Scripture, personal prayer, Mass, fellowship, the power of the Holy Spirit, the assistance of the Saints and angels, especially the Lady. Usually we don't win because we don't fight back, or we fight insufficiently. Now is the time to take up our weapons and fight "the good fight of faith!" — *Fr. Ed Fride*

### Christ the King Inclement Weather Policy

**Prudential Judgement should always be used by event participants.** No event, including Mass, requires your attendance if you feel that weather conditions are dangerous. It is your right and responsibility to determine whether it is safe and/or wise to travel when road conditions may be hazardous. Those who choose not to travel because of unsafe conditions are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass.

**Mass will not ordinarily be cancelled due to weather conditions.** However, in exceptional circumstances such as extreme weather conditions, power outage, or facility problems it may be necessary to cancel Mass. In such cases, information about cancellation will be made available via the Special Announcements Line as early as possible. If a priest cannot come for a scheduled Mass, a deacon, or layperson will ordinarily lead a Communion service.

**Always call 734-665-5040, option 5, Special Announcements Line, for cancellation or weather-related news.**

**Daytime:** If the Ann Arbor Public Schools or Ypsilanti Public Schools are closed due to *weather related problems*, the Parish Office will be closed and daytime events will be cancelled until 5pm.

**Nighttime:** For evening events (starting after 5pm), the program leader will make the decision. The program leader must decide by 3pm, and communicate it to their participants.

**Weekend Weather:** If there is a severe weather warning that encroaches on the event time, then assume cancellation.

The program/event leader must call the parish and inform the staff (leave message for Theresa Hofer, 734-929-0971). The participants should assume that if day events were cancelled, evening events are cancelled **unless participants hear otherwise from their program leader.**

**Teen Drivers:** If any doubt of hazardous weather conditions exists, parents should not have their teens drive to a CTK event. Teens are much more likely to have accidents in bad weather. High school activities are always cancelled in the event of a winter weather advisory or winter storm warning overlapping any of the event but may be cancelled whenever driving conditions are poor. A1:8 Youth Discipleship event cancellations are communicated on the A1:8 Facebook page ([www.facebook.com/A18YD](http://www.facebook.com/A18YD)), via parent and teen email, on the Christ the King website and on the Special Announcements line.


